WHEREAS:	Through strategic partnerships, the Minnesota Energy Consortium strives to promote a unified and results-oriented effort to ensure people find new and rewarding careers in energy; and
WHEREAS:	Careers in Energy Week encourages citizens to become familiar with the services and the benefits offered by career and technical education programs in communities and colleges across the state.
