- WHEREAS: People will gather in small towns and big cities to remember our fallen heroes, pay homage to their sacrifice and courage, and recognize the selflessness of military service; and
- WHEREAS: Across the nation and in the State of Minnesota we thank those who undertake the great responsibility of defending our liberties and protecting democracy; and
- WHEREAS: Today, the United States of America and the State of Minnesota honor the spirit, courage, and tenacity of service members who made the ultimate sacrifice; and
- WHEREAS: As we pray for peace in our world, let us never forget the generations of American service members who have served on our behalf.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Monday, May 26, 2014, as:

MEMORIAL DAY

in the State of Minnesota, and do hereby order all United States flags and Minnesota flags to be flown at half-staff at all state and federal buildings in the State of Minnesota, from sunrise until noon on Monday, May 26, 2014, in honor of those who have served on our behalf.
