- WHEREAS: The annual observance of Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month calls attention to the importance of actively promoting safe motorcycle operation, increased rider training, improved licensing efforts, and motorist awareness; and
- WHEREAS: By working together to increase knowledge of the needs of all road and highway users, while encouraging users to exercise added caution, we can strive to make our roads safer, thereby enabling motorcyclists throughout Minnesota to have an enjoyable riding season.
