## Proclamation

WHEREAS: Teen pregnancy is a critical public health issue that affects the health, and educational,

social, and economic status of teen parents, their children, families, and communities;

and

WHEREAS: In 2012, there were 4,469 teen pregnancies in Minnesota, and approximately 12 teens

under age 20 become pregnant each day; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota's youth of color have significantly higher birth and pregnancy rates than their

white counterparts; and

WHEREAS: The cost of teen pregnancy and childbearing impacts society as a whole. It is estimated

that the public cost to Minnesota taxpayers is approximately \$146 million per year; and

WHEREAS: Comprehensive, evidence-based, sexuality education, and effective and culturally

responsive teen pregnancy prevention programs help prevent teen pregnancy; and

WHEREAS: By supporting healthy youth development and encouraging open communication

between caring adults and teens, we can support and affirm their choices to avoid

pregnancy, finish high school, and enjoy happy and fulfilling lives; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Department of Health joins with the National Campaign to Prevent Teen

and Unplanned Pregnancy, Advocates for Youth, the Office of Adolescent Health, the Department of Health and Human Services, the Family and Youth Services Bureau, and many dedicated local public health agencies, youth serving organizations, volunteers, health care professionals, schools and school districts, faith based organizations, and communities, in bringing awareness to Teen Pregnancy Prevention Month and the

important goal of reducing teen pregnancy.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of May 2014, as:
