RICE COUNTY ATTORNEY BIENNIAL ADULT PRE-TRIAL DIVERSION REPORT 2017 and 2018

Purpose of Report

This report is made pursuant to Minnesota Statute §401.065 which requires each county attorney to report biennially to the state court administrator and the legislature on the operation of its mandated pre-trial diversion program.

Pre-Trial Diversion Program

The Rice County Adult Pre-Trial Diversion Program is offered as an alternative to criminal prosecution with the goals of providing responsible alternatives to conviction, reduction of recidivism, restoration of the victim, and reduction of prosecution costs. There are three different programs available in Rice County: Traffic Diversion, Pre-Charge Diversion, and Property Crimes Diversion. The programs are available to first-time offenders who have had criminal charges filed against them or have a request for charges submitted to the Rice County Attorney's Office. The offenders must meet the criteria for diversion established by the Rice County Attorney's Office.

Number of Offenders Participating in the Program during the Reporting Period.

There were 45 participations in Pre-trial Diversion Program in 2017 and 2018. Of the participants, 28 individuals successfully completed the program, 3 individuals failed the program, and 14 are still participating in the program.

Number and Characteristics of Offenders Successfully Completing Program during the Reporting Period

The following characteristics have been documented regarding those offenders who successfully completed diversion:

6 female offenders (21.4%) 22 male offenders (78.6%)

Age

11 offenders age 18-25 (39.3%) 17 offenders age 26 and older (60.7%)

Offense

- 25 Traffic Diversion (89.3%)
- 3 Property Crimes Diversion (10.7%)
 - 1 Criminal Damage to Property (33.3%)
 - 1 Check Forgery (33.3%)
 - 1 Wrongfully Obtaining Public Assistance (33.4%)

Number and Characteristics of Offenders Failing Program during the Reporting Period

The following characteristics have been documented regarding those offenders who did not successfully completed diversion:

2 male offenders (67%) 1 female offenders (33%)

2 offenders age 18-25 (67%) 1 offenders age 26 and older (33%)

Offense

- 2 Traffic Diversion (66%)
- 1 Property Crimes Diversion (33%)
 - 1 Criminal Damage to Property (100%)

Evaluation on Program's Effect on Operation of Rice County Criminal Justice System

The Rice County Pre-Trial Diversion program diverted 18 cases in 2017 and 14 cases in 2018. Of the 32 cases, 30 (93.8%) successfully completed the program or are still in the program. Of the 3 successfully completed Property Crimes Diversion Program, restitution was completely made to the victim. Diversion not only lessens the burden on the current caseload for all those involved in the Rice County criminal justice system, it is a means to restore the victim for monetary loss caused by these crimes.
