Re: Report of Interagency Agreements and Transfers

Dear Senators and Representatives,

In accordance with Minnesota Laws 2017, First Special Session, chapter 4, article 2, section 16, I am submitting this report to the chairs and ranking minority members of the state government finance and legacy finance committees, which have jurisdiction over appropriations the Arts Board receives from the general fund and the arts and cultural heritage fund.

During fiscal year 2018, the Arts Board had two transactions that met the \$100,000 reporting threshold:

- The Arts Board transferred \$205,950 to MN.IT Services for enterprise IT services and personnel costs (see attached).
- The Arts Board received a transfer of \$189,350 from the Minnesota Department of Administration to purchase or commission artwork for the Minnesota Veterans Home in Minneapolis (see attached).
