Dear Senators and Representatives:

A provision in Laws 2009, chapter 79, article 13, section 3, subdivision 10 requires the Department of Human Services to provide census data and fiscal projections for SOS services at the time of the November and February budget forecasts. The table below provides the required information.

As of October 31, 2012, 235 individuals were served within the secure perimeter of the Minnesota Security Hospital (MSH). An additional 17 individuals received care in the special needs program, 84 individuals received services within the Transition Program, and 26 individuals received care in the Forensics Nursing Home. The table above shows that the MSH population served within the secure perimeter is projected to grow at a rate of approximately 3 per year. The appropriation listed in the table provides funding for the secure, special needs, transition, community residential, and nursing home beds. The MSH operates on a fixed legislative appropriation. The projected appropriations for fiscal years 2014 through 2017 above equal the current base appropriation for fiscal year 2013.
