#### Council Members—

Mayor Frey today issued a new (second) Declaration of Local Emergency pertaining to civil disturbance in the aftermath of the death of George Perry Floyd while in the custody of MPD officers. A copy of that declaration is attached for your reference. This declaration—issued pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 12, and Minneapolis Code of Ordinances, Section 128.50—enables State resources and support to be requested as part of the City's response, recovery, and related operations. That includes support from the Minnesota National Guard, which has already been approved by Governor Walz.

Under applicable state law and municipal codes, this declared emergency becomes effective upon posting and remains in force for up to 72 hours pending initial ratification by official act of the City Council. By law, the Council must convene within that 72-hour period; thus, we will be working to identify a date and time to call a special meeting before the 72-hour period expires at approximately 5 p.m. on Sunday, May 31, 2020.

As directed, this new Declaration of Local Emergency will be posted to the City's website and will also be posted to official bulletin boards located outside the City Council and City Clerk offices on the third floor of City Hall. The Mayor's Office will send a public announcement to more broadly publicize this action soon.

## CITY OF MINNEAPOLIS MAYORAL DECLARATION OF LOCAL EMERGENCY

May 28, 2020 – Civil Disturbance

Whereas, on May 25, 2020, George Perry Floyd died while in the custody of the Minneapolis Police Department in the City's 3<sup>rd</sup> Precinct; and

Whereas, in the aftermath of the killing of Mr. Floyd, a civil disturbance has occurred within the 3<sup>rd</sup> Pct. and surrounding areas with resulting damage to people and property, including several businesses and buildings that have been significantly damaged, looted, or burned; and

Whereas, in the aftermath of the killing of Mr. Floyd and the resulting civil disturbance, public safety personnel, residents, and visitors have been and remain at risk of significant injury and death and the potential for further civil unrest or disturbance is to such an extent that extraordinary measures must be taken to protect the public health, safety, and welfare; and

Whereas, on May 28, 2020, I requested the Governor of the State of Minnesota provide appropriate and available assistance, including from the National Guard, to aid local authorities in restoring safety and calm due to the civil disturbance being beyond the capacity and resources of the City government to address alone; and

Whereas, it is my obligation as Mayor of the City of Minneapolis to restore and keep order within the City of Minneapolis to mitigate against and avoid risks to further damage to life and property, to reduce disruption to essential public services, to assure continued local governmental operations, to protect the general health and safety of the community, and to organize and direct an orderly recovery and restoration of peace;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jacob Frey, Mayor of the City of Minneapolis, do hereby declare a Local Emergency pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Ch. 12.29, and Minneapolis Code of Ordinances (MCO), Section 128.50.

#### I further declare that:

- The emergency exists on the date of this declaration as indicated below and shall continue and remain in
  effect pending initial ratification by official act of the Minneapolis City Council within seventy-two (72)
  hours of this declaration. Pursuant to MCO Section 128.50(a), the City Council retains the ability to
  disapprove of the declaration at any time.
- 2. Such declaration provides the authority to immediately issue emergency regulations pursuant to MCO Section 128.50 to protect the public health, safety, and welfare.
- 3. The Director of Emergency Management for the City of Minneapolis shall immediately request and coordinate the appropriate aid and resources from surrounding city and county jurisdictions, the State of Minnesota, and the United States Federal Government.
- 4. The emergency executive authority section of the Minneapolis Emergency Operations Plan, and all other applicable sections of the Plan, is immediately invoked.

- 5. Emergency regulations promulgated by mayoral proclamation to protect the public health, safety, and welfare during this emergency are subject to rescission by the City Council at any time. If not sooner rescinded, every such regulation shall expire at the end of thirty (30) days after its effective date or at the end of the declared emergency, whichever occurs first.
- 6. A Policy Group is hereby convened to coordinate, support, advise, and assist in the communication of and discharge of the duties and responsibilities pertaining to this declared state of emergency and the City's response and mitigation efforts. The Policy Group shall consist of the Mayor, the President and Vice President of the City Council, the City Coordinator, City Clerk, the Director of the Office of Emergency Management, and additional selected Department Heads.

This declaration of local emergency, all emergency regulations of any kind, any additions or changes to this declaration, and the eventual termination of this declaration, and all official communications pertaining to same, shall be posted by the City Clerk on the front page of City's website.

## Governor Walz Signs Executive Order Activating National Guard to Protect the People of Minnesota

Order will help maintain safety in wake of George Floyd's death

[ST. PAUL, MN] – Governor Tim Walz today signed Executive Order 20-65, activating the Minnesota National Guard to help protect Minnesotans' safety and maintain peace in the wake of George Floyd's death. Local leaders have requested National Guard resources after extensive damage to private property occurred and peaceful protests evolved into a dangerous situation for protesters and first responders.

"It is time to rebuild. Rebuild the city, rebuild our justice system, and rebuild the relationship between law enforcement and those they're charged to protect. George Floyd's death should lead to justice and systemic change, not more death and destruction. As George Floyd's family has said, 'Floyd would not want people to get hurt. He lived his life protecting people.' Let's come together to rebuild, remember, and seek justice for George Floyd," said Governor Walz.

"The anger and grief of this moment is unbearable. People deserve to be seen. People deserve to be heard. People deserve to be safe," said Lieutenant Governor Peggy Flanagan. "While many Minnesotans are taking extensive safety precautions while exercising their right to protest, the demonstration last night became incredibly unsafe for all involved. The purpose of the National Guard is to protect people, to protect people safely demonstrating, and to protect small business owners."

"As Governor, I will always defend the right to protest," Governor Walz continued. "It is how we express pain, process tragedy, and create change. That is why I am answering our local leaders' request for Minnesota National Guard assistance to protect peaceful demonstrators, neighbors, and small businesses in Minnesota."

The National Guard Adjutant General will work with local government agencies to provide personnel, equipment, and facilities needed to respond to and recover from this emergency.

Additionally, the Minnesota State Patrol will assist in public safety efforts for the next several days. Approximately 200 troopers will work with state, county, and local community and public safety partners. State Patrol helicopters and fixed wind aircraft will also be available to assist law enforcement officers on the ground.

This Executive Order also declares a peacetime emergency, which activates the State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) to help coordinate the state's response. As the SEOC is already activated due to the COVID-19 pandemic, it will concurrently support the COVID-19 response and the City of Minneapolis and surrounding communities during this situation.

On May 27, 2020, George Floyd died while in custody of the Minneapolis Police Department. The Walz-Flanagan Administration is committed to addressing the systemic inequities and discrimination that led to this incident and seeking justice.

#### **Emergency Executive Order 20-64**

Activating the Minnesota National Guard and Declaring a Peacetime Emergency to Provide Safety and Protection to the People of Minneapolis, St. Paul, and Surrounding Communities

**I, Tim Walz, Governor of the State of Minnesota,** by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes, do hereby issue this Executive Order:

On May 27, 2020, George Floyd died while in custody of the Minneapolis Police Department. Our state watched Mr. Floyd's humanity be erased. Our feelings of anguish, anger, and disillusionment are justified, and we must continue to seek justice and fairness. We must continue to examine and address the systemic inequities and discrimination that led to this incident and many others in the past.

Since Mr. Floyd's death, thousands of Minnesotans have expressed their frustration in a peaceful and constructive manner. Demonstrators have gathered in Minneapolis, St. Paul, and surrounding communities to protest Mr. Floyd's death. Peaceful demonstrations are a keystone of our democratic system. We must also allow those who wish to protest peacefully to do so safely.

Unfortunately, some individuals have engaged in unlawful and dangerous activity, including arson, rioting, looting, and damaging public and private property. These activities threaten the safety of lawful demonstrators and other Minnesotans, and both first responders and demonstrators have already been injured. Many businesses, including businesses owned by people of color, have suffered damage as a result of this unlawful activity.

The City of Minneapolis has exhausted its resources and called for assistance from mutual aid partners to ensure immediate response to protect life, safety, and property. These mutual aid partners have fully committed their available resources. The Cities of Minneapolis and St. Paul have activated their emergency operations plan, and the Mayors of both cities have requested the assistance of the Minnesota National Guard to help provide security and restore safety.

The State Emergency Operations Center ("SEOC") is currently activated for the COVID-19 response and has implemented the Minnesota Emergency Operations Plan. State agencies are providing assistance to local governments. The SEOC will concurrently support both the

COVID-19 response and the City of Minneapolis, the City of St. Paul, and surrounding communities during this situation.

For these reasons, I declare a peacetime emergency in the City of Minneapolis, the City of St. Paul, and surrounding communities and order as follows:

- 1. The Adjutant General will order to state active duty on May 28, 2020 the personnel, equipment, and facilities needed to support emergency operations and response.
- 2. The Adjutant General is authorized to procure the goods and services needed to accomplish the mission.
- 3. The Department of Public Safety's Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management will continue to coordinate the provision of on-site support and assistance to affected local government and assess the need for supplementary emergency assistance.
- 4. State agencies, in cooperation with appropriate federal agencies, will provide assistance to local units of government as they respond to and recover from this emergency.
- 5. The costs of this assistance shall be paid from the general fund as allowed by Minnesota Statutes 2019, section 192.52.

This Executive Order and declaration of peacetime emergency is effective immediately under Minnesota Statutes 2019, section 4.035, subdivision 2, and its duration is governed by Minnesota Statutes 2019, section 12.31, subdivision 2.

#### Governor Walz Implements Temporary Nighttime Curfew

Curfew to go into effect across Minneapolis-Saint Paul tonight at 8pm

[ST. PAUL, MN] – Governor Tim Walz today signed Executive Order 20-65, implementing a temporary nighttime curfew that will provide safety for Minnesota residents from individuals who have engaged in unlawful and dangerous activity in recent days and threatened the security of lawful demonstrators and first responders.

"It's time to rebuild our community and that starts with safety in our streets," said Governor Walz.

"Thousands of Minnesotans have expressed their grief and frustration in a peaceful manner. But the unlawful and dangerous actions of others, under the cover of darkness, has caused irreversible pain and damage to our community. This behavior has compromised the safety of bystanders, businesses, lawful demonstrators, and first responders. Now, we come together to restore the peace."

"Minnesota, we're hurting, and we need to begin the healing process," said Lt. Governor Flanagan. "We need to bring peace to our streets and calm to our neighborhoods. This is an important step to ensure safety, so we can begin to rebuild and seek justice for George Floyd."

The temporary curfew is scheduled from 8pm to 6am tonight (Friday) and tomorrow (Saturday) night. During the curfew, no one may travel on Minneapolis and Saint Paul streets or public places, except for first responders, members of the media, people going back and forth to work, individuals seeking emergency care or fleeing danger, and people experiencing homelessness. Curfews are not limited to Minneapolis and St. Paul, mayors across the state can issue their own curfews.

All Minnesotans in Minneapolis and Saint Paul are urged to voluntarily comply. Peace officers will enforce the curfew and arrest those who refuse to comply.

The state has activated a Multi-Agency Command Center (MACC). The MACC will serve as a unified command of several different law enforcement and public safety agencies to support the state's response.

On May 25, 2020, George Floyd died while in custody of the Minneapolis Police Department. The Walz-Flanagan Administration is committed to addressing the systemic inequities and discrimination that led to this incident and seeking justice.

On May 25, 2020, George Floyd died while in custody of the Minneapolis Police Department. Our state watched Mr. Floyd's humanity be erased. Since Mr. Floyd's death, thousands of Minnesotans have expressed their frustration in a peaceful and constructive manner. Demonstrators have gathered in Minneapolis, Saint Paul, and surrounding communities to protest Mr. Floyd's death. Peaceful demonstrations are essential to our democratic system.

Unfortunately, some individuals have engaged in unlawful and dangerous activity, including arson, rioting, looting, and damaging public and private property. These activities threaten the safety of lawful demonstrators, the surrounding communities, and first responders—and Minnesotans have already been injured. Many businesses, including those owned by people of color, have suffered damage as a result of this unlawful activity.

In response to the widespread civil unrest and unlawful activity in Minneapolis, Saint Paul, and surrounding communities, I declared a peacetime emergency and activated the Minnesota National Guard on May 28, 2020. Destructive and dangerous activity has continued. Individuals have looted businesses, destroyed residential buildings, and set a precinct police station on fire. This senseless violence tears at the fabric of our society. Indiscriminate destruction is not the tribute owed to Mr. Floyd, and it does not reflect our values as Minnesotans. We must restore peace and safety immediately.

Because much of the destruction and violence has taken place under the cover of darkness, we must implement a temporary nighttime curfew, in coordination with the Cities of Minneapolis and Saint Paul, to ensure public safety.

In Minnesota Statutes 2019, section 12.02, the Minnesota Legislature conferred upon the Governor emergency powers to "generally protect the public peace, health, and safety" and to "preserve the lives and property of the people of the state." Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 2019,

section 12.21, subdivision 1, the Governor has general authority to control the state's emergency management and to carry out the provisions of Minnesota's Emergency Management Act.

Minnesota Statutes 2019, section 12.21, subdivision 3(7), authorizes the Governor to cooperate with federal and state agencies in "matters pertaining to the emergency management of the state and nation." This includes "the direction or control of . . . the conduct of persons in the state, including entrance or exit from any stricken or threatened public place, occupancy of facilities, and the movement and cessation of movement of pedestrians, vehicular traffic, and all forms of private and public transportation during, prior, and subsequent to . . . actual emergencies." This authority also extends to the direction and control of "public meetings or gatherings."

Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 2019, section 12.21, subdivision 3(1), the Governor may "make, amend, and rescind the necessary orders and rules to carry out the provisions" of Minnesota Statutes 2019, Chapter 12. When approved by the Executive Council and filed in the Office of the Secretary of State, such orders and rules have the force and effect of law during the peacetime emergency. Any inconsistent rules or ordinances of any agency or political subdivision of the state are suspended during the pendency of the emergency.

For these reasons, I order as follows:

- 1. **Nighttime Curfew.** A curfew is imposed in all public places within the City of Minneapolis and the City of Saint Paul during the following times:
  - a. From 8:00 pm on Friday, May 29, 2020 until 6:00 am on Saturday, May 30, 2020.
  - b. From 8:00 pm on Saturday, May 30, 2020 until 6:00 am on Sunday, May 31, 2020.
- 2. **Travel Prohibited**. During the curfew, all persons must not travel on any public street or in any public place.
- 3. **Exemptions**. All law enforcement, fire, medical personnel, and members of the news media, as well as other personnel authorized by the City of Minneapolis, City of Saint Paul, Minnesota Department of Public Safety, Minnesota State Patrol, or Minnesota National Guard, are exempt from the curfew. Individuals traveling directly to and from work, seeking emergency care, fleeing dangerous circumstances, or experiencing homelessness are also exempt.

#### 4. **Definitions**.

- a. For the purposes of this Executive Order, "travel" includes, without limitation, travel on foot, bicycle, skateboard, scooter, motorcycle, automobile, public transit, or any other mode of transporting a person from one location to another.
- b. For the purposes of this Executive Order, a "public place" is any place, whether on privately or publicly owned property, accessible to the general

public, including but not limited to public streets and roads, alleys, highways, driveways, sidewalks, parks, vacant lots, and unsupervised property.

5. **Enforcement**. I urge all Minnesotans to voluntarily comply with this Executive Order. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 2019, section 12.45, an individual who willfully violates this Executive Order is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction must be punished by a fine not to exceed \$1,000 or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days.

Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 2019, section 4.035, subdivision 2, and section 12.32, this Executive Order is effective immediately upon approval by the Executive Council. It expires on May 31, 2020 at 6:00 am or until it is rescinded by proper authority.

A determination that any provision of this Executive Order is invalid will not affect the enforceability of any other provision of this Executive Order. Rather, the invalid provision will be modified to the extent necessary so that it is enforceable.

# Multiple Fire Responses Last Night During Protests across the City

#### May 29, 2020

Last night MFD crews responded to approximately multiple fire events including at least 19 structure fires across the City during last nights protest, including the MPD 3<sup>rd</sup> Precinct Building. MFD crews were unable to respond to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Precinct fire and several others until the scenes were secured by the National Guard. The MFD had to respond to several of the scenes multiple times as fire were reset and/or rekindled. Fire department apparatus again suffered damage from rocks and other projectiles thrown at the responding vehicles.

There were no victims or fatalities reported as a result of last night's fires. There were no injuries to firefighters reported.

Crews continue to respond and extinguish fires throughout the City at this time.

The cause of these fires is intentional.

Dear Mayor Frey and Chief Arradondo,

Three days ago, the country watched in horror as a Minneapolis Police Department (MPD) officer killed George Floyd with three other officers standing idly by as he begged for his life and as bystanders pleaded with officers to stop. Two days ago, you condemned this behavior and we welcomed your swift response in firing the four officers responsible for Mr. Floyd's death and requesting an independent investigation by state and federal law enforcement agencies. Yesterday, we woke to alarming images of police using tear gas and projectiles against demonstrators, most of whom were peacefully protesting Mr. Floyd's killing at the hands of MPD officers. This type of militarized response to communities mourning the death of a member only serves to escalate tensions – as we saw last night.

We do not purport to represent the views of countless local communities who have unique relationships with local law enforcement or to supplant the need for direct engagement and dialogue with community members. Instead, we offer a perspective based on our collective 450-year history of activism and advocacy. It is through our collective experience that we can attest to the fact that these types of events deepen distrust in law enforcement, reopen old wounds, and inflict new ones. They remind us of our historically fraught relationship with a profession that is sworn to serve and protect the public. They remind us of violence against activists during the civil rights movement, of the enforcement of segregation and Jim Crow laws during the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> centuries, and of fugitive slave laws in centuries past.

This history is in part why Minneapolis is reeling in pain. The wanton killing of George Floyd on a city street has left the city's residents grasping for answers as they try to understand and cope with the needless death of another Black man at the hands of police. Like so many other incidences of police violence, Jamar Clark's death in 2015 still has not been forgotten. The demonstrations we are witnessing in the aftermath of Mr. Floyd's death are the people of Minneapolis letting out that collective pain and calling for accountability. Yet, demonstrators exercising their First Amendment rights have been met with a militarized police response that only stands to escalate tensions, inflict harm and pain, and chill free speech. When police respond in such a manner, it validates the reasons these communities have taken to the street – the long-standing use of excessive force against Black and Brown people. To take this route is to fan the flames of racial tensions, leading to an escalation of conduct as we saw play out last night on the streets of the city.

We know that hundreds of thousands of police officers report for duty every day, with a mission to keep us safe and protect us from harm. And we are grateful to the police officers and departments across the country that are committed to fair and impartial public safety strategies, dedicated to principles of fairness, equity, and accountability, and working actively to build the bridges that lead to substantial change. Nonetheless, the challenge of instituting reform uniformly across the country to eliminate the unfair burden borne by Black people in communities that are too often the victims of racial profiling and biased policing remains as urgent as ever.













While mass assemblies may sometimes turn violent, the goal of law enforcement in these circumstances should always be peaceful resolution. Indeed, MPD's current policies reflect this very principle. To this end, we encourage MPD to commit to preventing, mitigating, and de-escalating the potential for violence at large crowd events.

We need to learn from past lessons to avoid repeating mistakes.<sup>3</sup> Indeed, the 18-day occupation of the Fourth Precinct by demonstrators in the aftermath of Mr. Clark's killing in 2015 led to a U.S. Department of Justice Community Oriented Policing Service (COPS) assessment of MPD's response, which embodied many of the same principles embodied in the practices we offer here.<sup>4</sup>

These best practices should provide a roadmap for reform and guidance for managing demonstrations and that we collectively endorse:

• Refrain from Using Military Equipment for Crowd Control and Require Officers to Interact with Assemblers in a Respectful and Positive Manner: The use of military equipment and riot gear encourages an "us vs. them" battlefield mentality and heightens tensions between police and demonstrators. Military force should not be used for domestic protests. Consistent with Minnesota's Law Enforcement Code of Ethics, MPD should require all officers to interact with assemblers in a respectful and professional manner before, during, and after assemblies, and they should avoid militarized responses unless responding to high-risk threats. Evidence suggests that this type of militarized policing heightens the risk of violent conflict that puts officers as well as the public at greater risk of injury. Indeed, officers may be more willing to engage in a confrontation when armed with military grade weaponry.

Instead, police departments should require officers assigned to demonstrations to wear regular uniforms and to interact with members of the public in a friendly, respectful, and positive manner before, during, and after an assembly. This helps all parties recognize their shared humanity, which decreases the likelihood that assemblers will feel threatened by or fear them and resort to self-defense. As DOJ's COPS office recognized in its after-action report of the Ferguson, Mo., demonstrations in 2014 ("Ferguson Assessment"), these actions help ensure that every interaction officers have with members of the public has the potential to enhance police legitimacy and procedural justice.

- Promote Crowd Control Tactics, Including De-escalation, That are Less Likely to Cause Injury and Set Clear Limits on The Use of Force: Leaders should understand that nonlethal uses of force can escalate tensions, cause injury, and endanger members of the public as well as officers. Police responses to mass demonstrations should be "proportional to the actions and mood of the crowd [because it] is critical to making sure the police do not unintentionally escalate tensions during protests." De-escalation tactics should be the priority and use of force a last resort when interacting with large crowds. This includes refraining from using force unless absolutely necessary, including a counseled determination that there is a risk of death or serious injury and all reasonable alternatives have been exhausted, adequate warnings have been issued, and there are safe means of egress for demonstrators.
- Prohibit the Use of Tear Gas for Crowd Control: Tear gas can be sprayed at people or thrown like a grenade into crowds, where it "explodes" with gas. It cannot be targeted when sprayed; as such, it carries a high risk of affecting unintended targets or bystanders. When tear gas canisters explode, the gas disperses widely to surrounding areas. For these reasons, departments should restrict the use of tear gas to situations in which crowds engage in acts that risk death or serious injury and all other options have been exhausted. The use of tear gas also should require approval from the highest level of the department, (i.e., from the chief or commissioner). In the midst of the current pandemic, more than ever, police departments must carefully consider when to use dispersal agents that can cause stampedes and increase the risk of social contact. As DOJ's COPS office recognized in the Ferguson Assessment following the uprising in Ferguson, "[f]or the very limited circumstances when tear gas is used, law enforcement must deploy tear gas only when people have a means of safe egress and after appropriate warnings are clearly announced and sufficient time is allowed for individuals to leave the area."9

• Engage with Community Leaders to Create Dialogue Before and During Assemblies: To successfully manage large crowd events, MPD should create clear pathways for the proactive dissemination of information to the media and the community during mass assemblies. When the media and the community know that there are centralized locations for information, there is less opportunity for confusion and misinformation.

Command staff at police departments should hold formal meetings with event organizers and/or protesters as early as possible to determine where the event will occur and what is permitted. This process might be more difficult when demonstrations are organized on short notice or on social media, which are rarely led by a single, identifiable leader (and which often identify all participants as leaders). In these situations, officers should not expect organizers to present a single leader; rather, they should remain flexible and consider using social media to communicate. Officers' relationships with community members are valuable and should be leveraged when preparing for "leaderless" or spontaneous demonstrations. 12

We counsel against the use of force, including lethal force, in response to large demonstrations even when legally permissible. It is in such times, when tensions are at their highest, that officials should exercise their discretion and lead the way toward peaceful resolution. The department should enlist community leaders to serve as liaisons and to provide guidance to demonstrators – guidance that encourages the peaceful exercise of their First Amendment rights. And leadership should work with these communities to find ways to facilitate the demonstrations in ways that serve the communities' interests and allow for their voices to be amplified. To this end, the city should be careful in its decision to deploy the national guard and seek instead to pursue a response centered on the principles of communication, de-escalation, and peaceful resolution.

• **Protect and Respect Constitutional Rights:** The First Amendment protects the rights of the people to peacefully assemble to air grievances. While the police are working to preserve public safety, they must also remember that they are protecting the constitutional rights of those gathered to demonstrate. This means that officers should ensure that any restraint imposed on demonstrators is necessary to ensure public safety and does not unreasonably constrain the demonstrations or violate constitutional rights.

It also called for the creation of an office similar to the federal Office of Community Relations Services in the Department of Justice to serve as "Minnesota's Peacemaker." Per the report, "[t]he component would have the authority and responsibility to work with communities in conflict . . . [t]he" Office would work with community groups, public officials, law enforcement, and other relevant stakeholders to promote healing and restoration, resolve community conflicts arising from highly charged incidents, and prevent and respond to alleged hate crimes involving the targeting of individuals based on their race, color, national origin, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, religion, or disability."

The Department of Justice has recognized that "[l]aw enforcement has the responsibility to protect persons and groups exercising their right to assemble peacefully, all while ensuring public safety and the protection of privacy and the associated rights of individuals. Ensuring these protections starts at the planning and training stage, during the event, and after the event." This includes the right of the public to record police activities, and policies that prohibit officers from retaliating against people who lawfully record police activity, including by using force.

• Ensure Officers Are Accountable and Identifiable During Protests: Community trust is built when there are transparent means of holding law enforcement accountable. To do this, police officers must be identifiable either by name or by badge number. There must also be a publicized complaint process that allows protestors to lodge complaints of misconduct.

Department leaders should create formal protocols to (1) investigate violations of policy; (2) address complaints arising from mass demonstrations; and (3) evaluate the effectiveness of pertinent policies, resources, tactics, and training. This formal process should include not only the transparent investigation of complaints from members of the public but also evaluation of uses of force, stops, searches, and arrests, and officer injury reports (along with relevant video footage) to assess how well officers followed policies, obeyed the rules of engagement, and carried out their overall mission. Both successes and failures should be analyzed and used to inform future training and deployment plans.

It is crises such as the police killing of Mr. Floyd that provide opportunities for true leadership and to forge the path toward a truly equitable and safe society for all people. By committing to policies and practices that provide all Minneapolis residents the dignity and respect due to them, MPD can begin to build trust and earn legitimacy in all the communities it serves.

Real change in the relationship between communities of color and law enforcement is only possible with real accountability for this department and the officers involved. Therefore, we urge you and the police departments you oversee to use this moment and the ensuing protests as an opportunity to grapple with the ongoing legacy of police violence in communities of color, and to re-examine and reform public safety and policing. #### May 29, 2020

Last night MFD crews responded to approximately multiple fire events including at least 19 structure fires across the City during last nights protest, including the MPD 3<sup>rd</sup> Precinct Building. MFD crews were unable to respond to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Precinct fire and several others until the scenes were secured by the National Guard. Fire department apparatus again suffered damage from rocks and other projectiles thrown at the responding vehicles.

There were no victims or fatalities reported as a result of last night's fires. There were no injuries to firefighters reported.

Crews continue to respond and extinguish fires throughout the City at this time.

The cause of these fires is intentional.

Thanks Daniel: I got into a relationship with the Minneapolis PD in 2000 when a lady named Barbara Schneider died tragically in an officer involved shooting in her home when she was in mental health crisis. I have been working to encourage de-escalation as an alternative to violence and force since then.

We train police, corrections, hospital staff, educators and we tell them that part of the reason people are in crisis is because they don't trust. Many have lost trust in government, even I community. That's part of what we are seeing. We also teach that trauma is a part of every crisis. Events today take us back to past injuries and traumas. We are all endowed with the fight of flight response. In trauma, many respond with the fight response even when it makes no logical sense. Police do it. Community members do it. Our task is to find a way to help people trust so we can de-escalate this situation. I do trust our Chief. I also trust our Mayor, our Public Safety Commissioner, our Minnesota Attorney General. There may be a long legal process. We have to help people understand that and that these officials have proven themselves to be guardians of community safety and justice for the community.

I believe finding a way to help people see that we can trust these individuals, rather than some bland trust in the system, will help. No guarantees. But that's the message I am sending those I am in contact with. Stay safe, stay strong. m





### **Key Takeaways**

- -- To minimize the risk of COVID-19 spreading in jails, prosecutors are working closely with other criminal justice partners to help reduce jail populations. They are focusing on detailed assessment and screening of individual inmates based on their charges, criminal history and flight risk, as opposed to large-scale releases of groups of inmates.
- -- Prosecutors are using technology to improve efficiency and minimize the risk to their staffs. Many prosecutors are working remotely, and video is replacing inperson meetings for many preliminary and status hearings, arraignments, and victim and witness interviews. Some prosecutors expect these changes to continue after the pandemic has subsided and courts begin to reopen.
- -- Some criminal cases, such as homicides and juvenile cases, still require inperson interactions. To reduce the risk of exposure, prosecutors' offices are taking

steps to minimize the number of prosecutorial staff and criminal justice partners who need to attend hearings and other meetings.

- -- With jury trials suspended in most locations, prosecutors are concerned that a growing backlog of cases could overwhelm their offices when the courts reopen. Offices are working to resolve cases through plea agreements, which defense attorneys support in many cases too.
- -- Prosecutors are concerned that some victims in particular victims of domestic violence are unable to report their crimes and seek assistance. Prosecutors' offices are developing innovative approaches to serve victims during the pandemic, including electronic filing, issuance, and serving of protection orders.
- -- Prosecutors are concerned that the push to release large numbers of jail inmates may be contributing to an uptick of violence in some jurisdictions. It will be important to closely monitor this issue.

# MINNEAPOLIS POLICE PROTESTS —

Parts of south Minneapolis were unrecognizable Thursday morning as damage stretched for miles following the second night of violent protests over the death of George Floyd.

In response to the wreckage, city leaders called for peace while acknowledging the anger and pain in the community after the death of a black man who was pinned under the knee of a white police officer. The second night of protests started much like the first, with peaceful demonstrations Wednesday afternoon at the Powderhorn neighborhood intersection where Floyd was pinned down by a police officer. Like Tuesday night, violence later broke out after protesters marched to the 3rd Precinct police station, where they clashed with police in riot gear.

Over the next several hours, looters ransacked, vandalized and burned numerous buildings in the blocks around the 3rd Precinct. Video captured people running out of Target and Cub Foods with their arms full of merchandise. Meanwhile, fires shot up at various businesses and some burned without fire crews there to battle the flames. "Last night was a totally different, different crowd," said Steve Peterson, who has been a bartender at Schooner Tavern for 25 years. He said the customers are like family, but instead of getting ready to reopen, he's now wondering how long they'll be shut down. Doors and windows were kicked out and heat from a fire across the street melted signs and siding. Nearby, AutoZone was also set on fire and destroyed. "I teared up. I walk through here and I teared up and I said there's got to be something I can do," Verla Perry said. A stranger handed Perry a trash bag and they went to work picking up the pieces- both literally and figuratively. "It just moves you. Mentally, it moves you. You just have to do something to help your neighborhood," Perry said.

Throughout the day, the 3rd Precinct continued to be the epicenter of tension between protesters and police.


Further down the street, looters ran in and out of Target and employees at Cub Foods were assessing damage inside their store. "We shouldn't have to go through this. This is our neighborhood. Now, what Target are you going to go to? What Cub are you going to go to? Now you have to go outside your neighborhood to get something to eat," Kevin Williams said. Williams said his heart hurts for George Floyd and his family, but it also pains him to see neighborhood businesses destroyed. "Burning stuff up, that's not the way to go. We can still get together and have a peaceful protest and do things in a better way. That's how I feel about it you know," Williams said.

### **Emergency Executive Order 20-64**

Activating the Minnesota National Guard and Declaring a Peacetime Emergency to Provide Safety and Protection to the People of Minneapolis, St. Paul, and Surrounding Communities

**I, Tim Walz, Governor of the State of Minnesota,** by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes, do hereby issue this Executive Order:

On May 25, 2020, George Floyd died while in custody of the Minneapolis Police Department. Our state watched Mr. Floyd's humanity be erased. Our feelings of anguish, anger, and disillusionment are justified, and we must continue to seek justice and fairness. We must continue to examine and address the systemic inequities and discrimination that led to this incident and many others in the past.

Since Mr. Floyd's death, thousands of Minnesotans have expressed their frustration in a peaceful and constructive manner. Demonstrators have gathered in Minneapolis, St. Paul, and surrounding communities to protest Mr. Floyd's death. Peaceful demonstrations are a keystone of our democratic system. We must also allow those who wish to protest peacefully to do so safely.

Unfortunately, some individuals have engaged in unlawful and dangerous activity, including arson, rioting, looting, and damaging public and private property. These activities threaten the safety of lawful demonstrators and other Minnesotans, and both first responders and demonstrators have already been injured. Many businesses, including businesses owned by people of color, have suffered damage as a result of this unlawful activity.

The City of Minneapolis has exhausted its resources and called for assistance from mutual aid partners to ensure immediate response to protect life, safety, and property. These mutual aid partners have fully committed their available resources. The Cities of Minneapolis and St. Paul have activated their emergency operations plan, and the Mayors of both cities have requested the assistance of the Minnesota National Guard to help provide security and restore safety.

The State Emergency Operations Center ("SEOC") is currently activated for the COVID-19 response and has implemented the Minnesota Emergency Operations Plan. State agencies are providing assistance to local governments. The SEOC will concurrently support both the

COVID-19 response and the City of Minneapolis, the City of St. Paul, and surrounding communities during this situation.

For these reasons, I declare a peacetime emergency in the City of Minneapolis, the City of St. Paul, and surrounding communities and order as follows:

- 1. The Adjutant General will order to state active duty on May 28, 2020 the personnel, equipment, and facilities needed to support emergency operations and response.
- 2. The Adjutant General is authorized to procure the goods and services needed to accomplish the mission.
- 3. The Department of Public Safety's Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management will continue to coordinate the provision of on-site support and assistance to affected local government and assess the need for supplementary emergency assistance.
- 4. State agencies, in cooperation with appropriate federal agencies, will provide assistance to local units of government as they respond to and recover from this emergency.
- 5. The costs of this assistance shall be paid from the general fund as allowed by Minnesota Statutes 2019, section 192.52.

This Executive Order and declaration of peacetime emergency is effective immediately under Minnesota Statutes 2019, section 4.035, subdivision 2, and its duration is governed by Minnesota Statutes 2019, section 12.31, subdivision 2.

The BURGB calls were never-ending tonight. Each shift was held over beyond their normal end times.

#### **Notable Calls**

Foot Locker at 23 7<sup>th</sup> St. S. was broken into 3 or 4 times tonight. Transit Police ended up catching 2 suspects inside the store just before 0400 hours. I advised the keyholder on the previous call to secure their business, but they did not secure it very well, and more looters re-entered the store and looted again before being caught.







Hello from John B of Midtown Safety Center in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Police Precinct of South Minneapolis. This has been a difficult week for all of us. Before I say anything else, I want to share my introduction to this week's report here:

These have been troubled times in Minneapolis and throughout the metro area. The death of George Floyd was a horrible and avoidable tragedy. Protests that started peacefully turned to violence. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Precinct building was set on fire. Many local businesses have been destroyed and the community has lost access to important services.

At last report, the Safety Center office in the western part of 3<sup>rd</sup> Precinct was intact but our neighbors around the corner in the same building have been looted and had fires.

My heart goes out to the family, friends and neighbors of George Floyd, members of our community who experience discrimination in the criminal justice system, those who have lost livelihoods or property in the recent unrest, the many first responders who remain focused on working with the public professionally during these chaotic days and everyone who has great love for our City (as I do).

Please know that despite recent events, 3<sup>rd</sup> Precinct officers continue to protect and serve our community. I urge you to continue calling 911 for police service as needed.

May we soon find it possible to move past these troubled times and focus on ways to heal.

The Safety Center remains closed due to the COVID-19 virus. I am working from home; you can reach me at **john.baumann@minneapolismn.gov**.

I now continue my message about the Midtown weekly crime report with community announcements for the week ending **May 25, 2020**. The text of the report is reprinted below the Safety Center logo. The attached document may be easier to read.

For this report, Midtown is the area from 35W to Hiawatha Avenue, between 28<sup>th</sup> and 32<sup>nd</sup> Streets. Portions of the **Phillips West, Midtown Phillips, East Phillips, Central, Powderhorn Park** and **Corcoran** neighborhoods are included in Midtown.

Reported Part 1 crime decreased in Midtown last week, while violent crime increased. Here are the details:

- There were 10 Part 1 (most serious) crimes reported, down from 12 last week.
- The Part 1 crimes were 1 robbery, 3 aggravated assaults, 2 burglaries and 4 larcenies.
- 4 violent crimes were reported-1 robbery and 3 aggravated assaults. There was 1 violent crime last week.
- The 2 burglaries occurred at Lake St businesses and involved breaking glass to make entry. They could be related to a pattern of burglaries noted last week.
- Police took 11 offenders in Midtown into custody this week.
- 5 of these arrests were for felony crimes.

Midtown is the area between Highway 35W and Hiawatha Ave, from 28th St E to 32nd St E in Minneapolis, MN

These have been troubled times in Minneapolis and throughout the metro area. The death of George Floyd was a horrible and avoidable tragedy. Protests that started peacefully turned to violence. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Precinct building was set on fire. Many local businesses have been destroyed and the community has lost access to important services.

At last report, the Safety Center office in the western part of 3<sup>rd</sup> Precinct was intact but our neighbors around the corner in the same building have been looted and had fires.

My heart goes out to the family, friends and neighbors of George Floyd, members of our community who experience discrimination in the criminal justice system, those who have lost livelihoods or property in the recent unrest, the many first responders who remain focused on working with the public professionally during these chaotic days and everyone who has great love for our City (as I do).

Please know that despite recent events, 3<sup>rd</sup> Precinct officers continue to protect and serve our community. I urge you to continue calling 911 for police service as needed.

May we soon find it possible to move past these troubled times and focus on ways to heal.



# THOUSANDS PROTEST AS MINNEAPOLIS BURNS

Last night, Minnesota National Guard troops were called in as fires spread across Minneapolis, burning a police precinct building and other structures as thousands protested the death of George Floyd, an unarmed Black man who died in police custody. None of the involved officers have been charged. Responding to the protests, President Donald Trump tweeted, "When the looting starts, the shooting starts" — a post Twitter hid behind a warning, saying it violates policies against glorifying violence. Meanwhile, seven people were injured by gunfire at a Kentucky protest for Breonna Taylor, a Black EMT who was killed in March when police raided her apartment.

# TRUMP EXECUTIVE ORDER TARGETS SOCIAL MEDIA

Shares in Twitter fell 4.5 percent yesterday after President Trump signed an executive order aimed at curbing the legal protections social media platforms currently enjoy in the United States. He asked for a wide-ranging review of Section 230 of the Communications Decency Act after Twitter attached fact checks to misleading tweets he sent to his 80 million followers. Trump has raged before about what he sees as anti-conservative bias on such platforms, and said yesterday that he'd shut Twitter down completely if he were allowed to. His account is still active.

# HONG KONG SIMMERS AS CHINA, US TRADE THREATS

China's Ministry of Public Security promised to "guide" Hong Kong police as many protested China's decision to move forward with a new national security law that abolishes much of the city's autonomy. The U.S. threatened to revoke the city's special status under American law and treat it as **part of China**, which could be bad news for the 1,300 U.S. firms with bases there, and Hong Kong warned the White House to stay out of its internal affairs. Meanwhile, analysts blamed a drop in global stocks on the tensions, as further response is expected today from the Trump administration.

About 30 million Americans are now receiving unemployment benefits, of 40 million who applied since the start of the crisis. But an extra \$600 weekly unemployment benefit is set to expire at the end of July, eviction moratoriums are ending and the government's one-time \$1,200 checks are largely spent. The lack of money for consumers to spend could further deepen the country's economic crisis. Meanwhile, a Reuters investigation found that dozens of companies that paid zero U.S. taxes last year still got millions from taxpayer-funded American coronavirus relief programs.

Dear Board Members,

First of all, my great thanks to each of you for your support and offers to help. We are all safe and doing as okay as possible here, which is my wish for all of you and our community.

Based on the escalation of events over the past 48 hours and the physical proximity of Harriet Tubman Center West to the Minneapolis Police's 5<sup>th</sup> Precinct (directly across the street), early this morning I made the decision to get everyone out of Tubman West for the weekend, out of an abundance of caution.

The shelter and housing teams have been working all day to move everyone currently residing at West into other locations, either at Tubman East or in the community, and will continue to support them with advocacy, transportation, and other needs and logistics. The plan had been to move shelter residents to East in smaller groups today, Monday, and Tuesday, so this is simply an acceleration of that plan. The remaining transitional housing apartment tenants have been moved to hotels or are staying with friends until Monday at least. I have also communicated that there should be no staff onsite at West over the weekend, even to pack.

Whatever may come this weekend, the health and wellbeing of our clients and staff are our primary priority, and I take that responsibility very seriously along with the trust our clients place in us when they move into our buildings. We don't want anyone to be in physical danger should a fire spread to the building. Additionally, as the National Guard moves forward into this situation, we want to minimize the trauma that can come from anyone in the building who may see heightened police and Guard activity out their windows. We have also been coordinating with MN Adult and Teen Challenge (our landlords) regarding plans to help keep the building safe.

We've also put additional safety measures in place at both Harriet Tubman Center East and Tubman Chrysalis Center to help keep both people and the buildings safe. As an aside, the security company we have contracted with is not available to start earlier than the planned June 3 date.

Dear all,

I just spoke with Jen and wanted to provide an update regarding Tubman clients, staff and facilities.

- First and foremost, all residents, staff and facilities are all safe at this time.
- The focus right now is taking care of residents and staff during these very challenging times related to George Floyd's death and related subsequent events. Primary focus is providing support, space and options for both residents and staff to take care of themselves as they navigate a wide range of emotions and life's experience tapped and impacted by these events. (In a separate email and for your awareness, I will forward Jen's email to all Tubman staff.)
- There are community protests near Tubman West, the Chrysalis site as well as some in Oakdale near Tubman East. All buildings are currently safe although businesses and buildings near to some of our facilities have been damaged and looted.
- We had previously hired security to be added to each of our buildings (primarily related to the upcoming moves). We had interviewed and vetted the firm we hired to ensure they are in line with our values and are there to provide additional sense of safety. They were scheduled to start June 3 and we are seeing if they can start ASAP.
- The original plan was to begin moving families June 2 from Tubman West to Tubman East. We are evaluating whether it makes sense to potentially move people sooner.

I am grateful for Jen and her leadership team. I am confident in their leadership of Tubman and its people through these times. Additionally, I want to lift up one of our fellow board members, Chief Rondo. I am grateful for your leadership in this community and in particular now. I wish for you strength, wisdom, courage and calm as you lead through some particularly challenging and charged times.

Hi Cmdr. Blackwell,

My name is Teresa Burns and a Minneapolis resident. I am also the former shelter manager at Casa de Esperanza (and just began staying home full-time with my kids). Casa de Esperanza had a long-standing relationship with the Minneapolis Police Department, and historically has had an advocate placed at the Midtown Safety Center and working collaboratively with the 3rd precinct. I personally have worked in the investigations unit as an advocate assisting victims of domestic and sexual assault. I've worked side-by-side with many of your colleagues and value the hard work you all do.

I don't need to go into detail about how devastating the death of George Floyd is for the Minneapolis community, which includes the MPD. I was working in the unit when the protests broke out at the 4th precinct a few years ago and remember how challenging it can be...

I wanted to reach out and offer my assistance now or in the future. When reading the bystander comments present at George Floyd's arrest all I can think about is how I know your team is trained in identifying strangulation, as I have participated in the MPD's training on domestic assault (including strangulation) and I am shocked that the arresting officers did not react to the complaint that George Floyd couldn't breathe.

I am sure there will be updated training and protocols for all of the MPD as this case develops further. Please ask for expert trainers to equip your team with on-going training and evaluate Minneapolis Police training. How do you know if your team is effectively trained if you're not getting evaluation results? If evaluation is being conducted-- please make those results public. I want our police force to be respected and trusted. As another professional in the field of ending violence, please don't hesitate to let me know if I or the greater community can be of any assistance to get you and your team what you need to keep our communities safe and to build healthy, trustworthy relationships in Minneapolis.

COVID-19 protocols are still in-place, with many businesses, restaurants and bars being closed. CenturyLink had an outage affecting Minneapolis 911 service. Due to the large crowds of thieves and rioters tonight, most of the officers from 1<sup>st</sup> Precinct were called to 3<sup>rd</sup> Precinct to assist with the riots, looting, shootings, arson, assaults on police officers, Officers had all they could do to take call after call all night. This spilled over into 5<sup>th</sup> Precinct and even into 1<sup>st</sup> Precinct. Officers had to respond to several calls at HCMC for SHOOT victims on several calls. The BURGB calls were never-ending tonight. Each shift was held over beyond their normal end times.

#### **Notable Calls**

Foot Locker at 23 7<sup>th</sup> St. S. was broken into 3 or 4 times tonight. Transit Police ended up catching 2 suspects inside the store just before 0400 hours. I advised the keyholder on the previous call to secure their business, but they did not secure it very well, and more looters re-entered the store and looted again before being caught.



# Video: City leaders plea for peace, acknowledge deep pain in community following death of George Floyd

Mayor Jacob Frey, City Council Vice President Andrea Jenkins, Minneapolis Police Chief Medaria Arradondo and Fire Chief John Fruetel provided an update on the City's response to fires and damage from last night's protests at a <u>press conference</u> earlier today.

While acknowledging the tremendous pain and trauma in Minneapolis, City leaders condemned the violence and widespread damage that has occurred in the city following the protests sparked by the death of George Floyd while in the custody of Minneapolis Police in south Minneapolis on May 25.

Gov. Tim Walz has also activated the Minnesota National Guard to help protect Minnesotans' safety and maintain peace in the wake of Floyd's death. Frey has also issued a <u>new</u>

#### declaration of local emergency.

"We need to offer radical love and compassion that we all have in us," Frey said. "I believe in this city and I know that you do to."

Jenkins called for peace and calm in our streets. "As we stand here grieving, yet another loss of black life, I am asking my colleagues, the mayor, and anyone else who is concerned about the state of affairs in our community, to declare a state of emergency declaring racism as a public health issue."



The City encourages everyone to exercise caution to stay safe while participating in demonstrations, including wearing masks and physical distancing as much as possible to prevent the spread of COVID-19. The City has made hundreds of masks available to protesters this week.

# City outlines guidance for restaurants, other businesses that can open June 1 at limited capacity

The City of Minneapolis has released <u>guidance</u> for restaurants, bars and other businesses in anticipation of the governor's order allowing limited outdoor dining and personal services businesses to open at a limited capacity June 1.

The guidance is part of the City's framework to move through and emerge from the pandemic. Mayor Jacob Frey has issued an <a href="mailto:emergency regulation">emergency regulation</a>, which includes several measures to allow for greater use of outdoor space and will also waive fees associated with the expansions.

The City of Minneapolis has streamlined the permission process for restaurants and bars interested in expanding their outdoor dining venues. Businesses can apply for a temporary expansion of premises permit to allow for outdoor dining in an adjacent parking lot, parking spaces and available green space.

The City is also holding webinars this week for businesses as they prepare to open. For more information on the City's guidance for businesses, visit the <u>City's website</u>.

# City's requirement to wear masks or face coverings in indoor public places takes effect

Mayor Jacob Frey's <u>emergency regulation</u> requiring people in Minneapolis to wear cloth face masks or coverings when they are in an indoor place of public accommodation is now in effect.

The <u>Centers for Disease Control (CDC)</u>
<u>recommends</u> wearing cloth face coverings in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain (e.g., grocery stores and pharmacies).

Masks or cloth face coverings can help with preventing your germs from infecting others – especially in situations where

you may spread the virus without symptoms. Wearing a mask does not protect you from others who may spread the virus. So, whether or not you wear a mask, you still need to wash your hands frequently, cover your cough, and practice physical distancing by keeping at least 6 feet of space between people.

# State transitions to next phase of COVID-19 response: Stay Safe MN

The next phase of the state's <u>COVID-19 response</u>: <u>Stay Safe MN</u> began May 18. All gatherings are limited to 10 and social distancing with masks, hand-washing and other safety measures should be followed to protect one another.


As of May 27, places of worship may open at 25 percent occupancy if they adhere to social distancing and other public health <u>guidelines</u> to keep congregants safe.

Retail stores and other main street businesses can reopen if they have a social distancing plan and operate at 50 percent occupancy.

Starting Monday, June 1, limited outdoor dining at restaurants and bars will be allowed. Salons and barbershops will be allowed to open June 1 at 25% occupancy to ensure the safety of both the employees and the customers inside.

In both industries, customers will be either strongly recommended or required to wear masks, make reservations, and adhere to social distancing requirements to keep themselves, other customers, and employees safe.

#### Minneapolis sick and safe time ordinance

Under the City's <u>sick and safe time ordinance</u>, employers are required to provide access to sick leave (or more generous leave) to all employees in Minneapolis. Leave must be paid by employers (unless they employ five or fewer workers) and accrual and use balances must be provided on pay stubs.



Today, Governor Walz activated the Minnesota National Guard to help protect Minnesotans' safety and maintain peace in the wake of George Floyd's death. Local leaders have requested National Guard resources after extensive damage to private property occurred and peaceful protests evolved into a dangerous situation for protesters and first responders.

"It is time to rebuild. Rebuild the city, rebuild our justice system, and rebuild the relationship between law enforcement and those they're charged to protect. George Floyd's death should lead to justice and systemic change, not more death and destruction. As George Floyd's family has said, 'He would not want people to get hurt. He lived his life protecting people.' Let's come together to rebuild, remember, and seek justice for George Floyd," said Governor Walz.

"As Governor, I will always defend the right to protest," Governor Walz continued. "It is how we express pain, process tragedy, and create change. That is why I am answering our local leaders' request for Minnesota National Guard assistance to protect peaceful demonstrators, neighbors, and small businesses in Minnesota."

## Everyone can work to reduce the spread of COVID-19

- Wear masks when in public. 10-50% of virus carriers are asymptomatic wearing masks helps control the virus and has been shown to lower COVID-19 spread.
- Avoid enclosed spaces with groups of people, where the virus can linger in the air for long periods of time.
- Get tested if you have cold or flu-like symptoms <u>Find testing locations</u>.
- Stay six feet away from others.
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with your elbow or sleeve, or a tissue and then throw the tissue in the trash and wash your hands afterwards.
- Washing your hands often with soap and water for 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom or before eating. If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching your face especially your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.



Dear Board Members,

First of all, my great thanks to each of you for your support and offers to help. We are all safe and doing as okay as possible here, which is my wish for all of you and our community.

Based on the escalation of events over the past 48 hours and the physical proximity of Harriet Tubman Center West to the Minneapolis Police's 5<sup>th</sup> Precinct (directly across the street), early this morning I made the decision to get everyone out of Tubman West for the weekend, out of an abundance of caution.

The shelter and housing teams have been working all day to move everyone currently residing at West into other locations, either at Tubman East or in the community, and will continue to support them with advocacy, transportation, and other needs and logistics. The plan had been to move shelter residents to East in smaller groups today, Monday, and Tuesday, so this is simply an acceleration of that plan. The remaining transitional housing apartment tenants have been moved to hotels or are staying with friends until Monday at least. I have also communicated that there should be no staff onsite at West over the weekend, even to pack.

Whatever may come this weekend, the health and wellbeing of our clients and staff are our primary priority, and I take that responsibility very seriously along with the trust our clients place in us when they move into our buildings. We don't want anyone to be in physical danger should a fire spread to the building. Additionally, as the National Guard moves forward into this situation, we want to minimize the trauma that can come from anyone in the building who may see heightened police and Guard activity out their windows. We have also been coordinating with MN Adult and Teen Challenge (our landlords) regarding plans to help keep the building safe.

We've also put additional safety measures in place at both Harriet Tubman Center East and Tubman Chrysalis Center to help keep both people and the buildings safe. As an aside, the security company we have contracted with is not available to start earlier than the planned June 3 date.

Dear all,

I just spoke with Jen and wanted to provide an update regarding Tubman clients, staff and facilities.

• First and foremost, all residents, staff and facilities are all safe at this time.

- The focus right now is taking care of residents and staff during these very challenging times related to George Floyd's death and related subsequent events. Primary focus is providing support, space and options for both residents and staff to take care of themselves as they navigate a wide range of emotions and life's experience tapped and impacted by these events. (In a separate email and for your awareness, I will forward Jen's email to all Tubman staff.)
- There are community protests near Tubman West, the Chrysalis site as well as some in Oakdale near Tubman East. All buildings are currently safe although businesses and buildings near to some of our facilities have been damaged and looted.
- We had previously hired security to be added to each of our buildings (primarily related to the upcoming moves). We had interviewed and vetted the firm we hired to ensure they are in line with our values and are there to provide additional sense of safety. They were scheduled to start June 3 and we are seeing if they can start ASAP.
- The original plan was to begin moving families June 2 from Tubman West to Tubman East. We are evaluating whether it makes sense to potentially move people sooner.

I am grateful for Jen and her leadership team. I am confident in their leadership of Tubman and its people through these times. Additionally, I want to lift up one of our fellow board members, Chief Rondo. I am grateful for your leadership in this community and in particular now. I wish for you strength, wisdom, courage and calm as you lead through some particularly challenging and charged times.

Please let me know if you have any questions.

Thank you all for your continued commitment to Tubman.

To the leadership of the Minneapolis PD. Specifically Inspector Johnson of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Precinct and Chief of Police Arradondo. As a citizen of this nation, and a proud supporter of Law Enforcement, you have a duty, by your respective oaths to arrest the officers responsible for this horrific, gut wrenching, reprehensible, dehumanizing incident. There is NO Training in Law Enforcement, that I have any knowledge of, that teaches you to restrict or compromise a suspects air way. This use of force is completely unacceptable and I am quite certain that it is not departmental policy. I am astounded that those responsible are not in custody at this very moment for aggravated assault, at a minimum. Honestly, from what I have seen, this rises to at least 2<sup>nd</sup> degree murder, conspiracy to commit murder.

Actions such as these do nothing more than expand the gap between society and law enforcement. This is a bad outcome not just for LEO but more importantly for the citizens your department is supposed to serve. And in this case, the ultimate sacrifice for George Floyd. This type of behavior speaks very poorly to the leadership of your department. This is already spawning the seeds of increased distrust of law enforcement and rightfully so. Unfortunately, for those that continue to SERVE the citizens, doing good work and are good cops, ( like my brother for example) congratulations, this just made their job that much more difficult and dangerous.

I sincerely hope that action will be taken against those responsible for this utterly horrific act. I pray that justice prevails, swiftly, decisively. It may very well be the only thing that prevents further unrest and will hopefully aid in the restoration of order, trust and peace. The citizens should be able to trust, believe and have confidence in the integrity of the institutions that SERVE them. Please, do not forget, your department serves, only because the people allow it to.

Respect your oaths, be the leaders that your posts demand. Bring justice to the people. Deliver justice to George Floyd and his family. Take the full measures for your community. Anything short of this result, I would encourage you both to resign your posts immediately. The people deserve nothing less. Do the right thing, please, for the safety of officers throughout this country, for the citizens they are sworn to protect, for the oath you have taken to uphold the Constitution, to secure peace, order and the public trust. DO THE RIGHT THING. Anything short of this is a catastrophic failure of your duties and leadership. More importantly a failure to the people and community you are sworn to protect.

Dear Board Members,

First of all, my great thanks to each of you for your support and offers to help. We are all safe and doing as okay as possible here, which is my wish for all of you and our community.

Based on the escalation of events over the past 48 hours and the physical proximity of Harriet Tubman Center West to the Minneapolis Police's 5<sup>th</sup> Precinct (directly across the street), early this morning I made the decision to get everyone out of Tubman West for the weekend, out of an abundance of caution.

The shelter and housing teams have been working all day to move everyone currently residing at West into other locations, either at Tubman East or in the community, and will continue to support them with advocacy, transportation, and other needs and logistics. The plan had been to move shelter residents to East in smaller groups today, Monday, and Tuesday, so this is simply an acceleration of that plan. The remaining transitional housing apartment tenants have been moved to hotels or are staying with friends until Monday at least. I have also communicated that there should be no staff onsite at West over the weekend, even to pack.

Whatever may come this weekend, the health and wellbeing of our clients and staff are our primary priority, and I take that responsibility very seriously along with the trust our clients place in us when they move into our buildings. We don't want anyone to be in physical danger should a fire spread to the building. Additionally, as the National Guard moves forward into this situation, we want to minimize the trauma that can come from anyone in the building who may see heightened police and Guard activity out their windows. We have also been coordinating with MN Adult and Teen Challenge (our landlords) regarding plans to help keep the building safe.

We've also put additional safety measures in place at both Harriet Tubman Center East and Tubman Chrysalis Center to help keep both people and the buildings safe. As an aside, the security company we have contracted with is not available to start earlier than the planned June 3 date.

Dear all,

I just spoke with Jen and wanted to provide an update regarding Tubman clients, staff and facilities.

- First and foremost, all residents, staff and facilities are all safe at this time.
- The focus right now is taking care of residents and staff during these very challenging times related to George Floyd's death and related subsequent events. Primary focus is providing support, space and options for both residents and staff to take care of themselves as they navigate a wide range of emotions and life's experience tapped and impacted by these events. (In a separate email and for your awareness, I will forward Jen's email to all Tubman staff.)
- There are community protests near Tubman West, the Chrysalis site as well as some in Oakdale near Tubman East. All buildings are currently safe although businesses and buildings near to some of our facilities have been damaged and looted.
- We had previously hired security to be added to each of our buildings (primarily related to the upcoming moves). We had interviewed and vetted the firm we hired to ensure they are in line with our values and are there to provide additional sense of safety. They were scheduled to start June 3 and we are seeing if they can start ASAP.
- The original plan was to begin moving families June 2 from Tubman West to Tubman East. We are evaluating whether it makes sense to potentially move people sooner.

I am grateful for Jen and her leadership team. I am confident in their leadership of Tubman and its people through these times. Additionally, I want to lift up one of our fellow board members, Chief Rondo. I am grateful for your leadership in this community and in particular now. I wish for you strength, wisdom, courage and calm as you lead through some particularly challenging and charged times.

## Good Morning Director Elder:

I am writing this note to offer a suggestion for the Chief of Police and the Minneapolis Police Department, when the crisis the city is going through calms down.

My name is Jace Smith and I am a former employee of the Minneapolis Police Department.

During the late 90's and through the early 2000's, Minneapolis Police had a progressive and innovative program that provided structured conduits for community engagement and involvement. This was the S.A.F.E. unit.

I am not sure if you are familiar with this program, but it had some unique advantages and provided some core community relationships that helped defuse situations like the one the city faces, before they escalated.

The program involved citizen/police officer partnerships that addressed all nature of crimes and crime prevention. One of the most innovative parts of the program was the appointment of civilians as leaders (instead of lieutenants or captains) of the units. All police including a sergeant reported to the civilian leader and the same with all crime prevention specialists.

These teams attended meetings of business organizations, block clubs, neighborhood associations, etc.

Unfortunately, the program was de-funded and many of us were cut from the city, even though the overall success of the unit was not in doubt.

My personal experience as the leader of the unit in 3's was extremely positive and optimistic. We contributed greatly to CODEFOR reductions, set records for National Night Out, and developed cases, methods, and successes.

I was tasked by the precinct commander, my boss, and the chief and assistant chief of police to attend meeting on their behalf several times. My role was to de-escalate and bring a civilian face to community concerns and questions.

We were often able to reduce tension and respond directly to community problems.

Police, although initially resentful of civilian authority in these units, came to understand that "arresting our way out of crime problems", was futile as a strategy.

Also, officers who served a tour in the units usually found that their careers were on the fast track afterwards. Skills in serving the community, versus traveling form call to call as 911 responders, were valued by the culture of the department.

As for me, I was able to think of some unconventional strategies for code enforcement and crime suppression that I was quite proud to initiate. The Deputy Chief at the time offered me command of *all* safe units at the time and not just 3's. I declined in favor of a colleague who had greater time in service. I later went on to direct several private services and then to be a Chief at a school in Oregon and now a Captain at a very large public College in Florida.

At any rate, I offer a proven model for the Chief to consider that emphasizes community connection, goodwill, partnership, confidence-building, and mutual trust.

I have no idea if the Department has a current, similar program or not.

Finally, I want to share how deeply saddened I am at the loss of the 3rd Precinct station. I was officed in the City Annex, but I had many meetings with officers and the community at 3's and of course my supervisor worked from there.

I hope that something in this message provides a core action step to help the city in this situation.

I still have a home in Plymouth, while I live in Florida - but regardless - a part of my heart always goes back to Minneapolis.





Minnesota Statute 340A.410 subdivision 7 requires an retail alcoholic beverage licensed premises to be compact and contiguous <a href="https://www.revisor.mn.gov/statutes/cite/340A.410">https://www.revisor.mn.gov/statutes/cite/340A.410</a>.

Minnesota Rules Chapter 7515.0430 subpart 2 define the types of additions license holders can include as part of their licensed premises. <a href="https://www.revisor.mn.gov/rules/7515.0430/">https://www.revisor.mn.gov/rules/7515.0430/</a>.

The rule states that the licensed premises can include physically connected attachments to the main structure such as patios, decks, or pavilions.

The space would have to be owned and/or leased and be a part of the business. The city would have to approve any compact and contiguous additions to the licensed premises and include such additions in the license files and on documentation defining the licensed premises.

Local zoning and building codes would apply.

- -- To minimize the risk of COVID-19 spreading in jails, prosecutors are working closely with other criminal justice partners to help reduce jail populations. They are focusing on detailed assessment and screening of individual inmates based on their charges, criminal history and flight risk, as opposed to large-scale releases of groups of inmates.
- -- Prosecutors are using technology to improve efficiency and minimize the risk to their staffs. Many prosecutors are working remotely, and video is replacing inperson meetings for many preliminary and status hearings, arraignments, and victim and witness interviews. Some prosecutors expect these changes to continue after the pandemic has subsided and courts begin to reopen.

# MINNEAPOLIS POLICE PROTESTS —

Parts of south Minneapolis were unrecognizable Thursday morning as damage stretched for miles following the second night of violent protests over the death of George Floyd.

In response to the wreckage, city leaders called for peace while acknowledging the anger and pain in the community after the death of a black man who was pinned under the knee of a white police officer. The second night of protests started much like the first, with peaceful demonstrations Wednesday afternoon at the Powderhorn neighborhood intersection where Floyd was pinned down by a police officer. Like Tuesday night, violence later broke out after protesters marched to the 3rd Precinct police station, where they clashed with police in riot gear.

Over the next several hours, looters ransacked, vandalized and burned numerous buildings in the blocks around the 3rd Precinct. Video captured people running out of Target and Cub Foods with their arms full of merchandise. Meanwhile, fires shot up at various businesses and some burned without fire crews there to battle the flames. "Last night was a totally different, different crowd," said Steve Peterson, who has been a bartender at Schooner Tavern for 25 years. He said the customers are like family, but instead of getting ready to reopen, he's now wondering how long they'll be shut down. Doors and windows were kicked out and heat from a fire across the street melted signs and siding. Nearby, AutoZone was also set on fire and destroyed. "I teared up. I walk through here and I teared up and I said there's got to be something I can do," Verla Perry said. A stranger handed Perry a trash bag and they went to work picking up the pieces- both literally and figuratively. "It just moves you. Mentally, it moves you. You just have to do something to help your neighborhood," Perry said.

Throughout the day, the 3rd Precinct continued to be the epicenter of tension between protesters and police.

Further down the street, looters ran in and out of Target and employees at Cub Foods were assessing damage inside their store. "We shouldn't have to go through this. This is our neighborhood. Now, what Target are you going to go to? What Cub are you going to go to? Now you have to go outside your neighborhood to get something to eat," Kevin Williams said. Williams said his heart hurts for George Floyd and his family, but it also pains him to see neighborhood businesses destroyed. "Burning stuff up, that's not the way to go. We can still get together and have a peaceful protest and do things in a better way. That's how I feel about it you know," Williams said.

Yesterday it was Minneapolis, today we are seeing looting, and rioting in the east Metro. I want to thank all of the brave and talented police and fire leaders who have stepped up during one of the most challenging times I've been party to. Governor Walz has at the request of Mayor Frey brought in the MN National Guard and we have pulled together state law enforcement resource to assist. See attached EO 20-64

## **Emergency Executive Order 20-64**

Activating the Minnesota National Guard and Declaring a Peacetime Emergency to Provide Safety and Protection to the People of Minneapolis, St. Paul, and Surrounding Communities

**I, Tim Walz, Governor of the State of Minnesota,** by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes, do hereby issue this Executive Order:

On May 25, 2020, George Floyd died while in custody of the Minneapolis Police Department. Our state watched Mr. Floyd's humanity be erased. Our feelings of anguish, anger, and disillusionment are justified, and we must continue to seek justice and fairness. We must continue to examine and address the systemic inequities and discrimination that led to this incident and many others in the past.

Since Mr. Floyd's death, thousands of Minnesotans have expressed their frustration in a peaceful and constructive manner. Demonstrators have gathered in Minneapolis, St. Paul, and surrounding communities to protest Mr. Floyd's death. Peaceful demonstrations are a keystone of our democratic system. We must also allow those who wish to protest peacefully to do so safely.

Unfortunately, some individuals have engaged in unlawful and dangerous activity, including arson, rioting, looting, and damaging public and private property. These activities threaten the safety of lawful demonstrators and other Minnesotans, and both first responders and demonstrators have already been injured. Many businesses, including businesses owned by people of color, have suffered damage as a result of this unlawful activity.

The City of Minneapolis has exhausted its resources and called for assistance from mutual aid partners to ensure immediate response to protect life, safety, and property. These mutual aid partners have fully committed their available resources. The Cities of Minneapolis and St. Paul have activated their emergency operations plan, and the Mayors of both cities have requested the assistance of the Minnesota National Guard to help provide security and restore safety.

The State Emergency Operations Center ("SEOC") is currently activated for the COVID-19 response and has implemented the Minnesota Emergency Operations Plan. State agencies are providing assistance to local governments. The SEOC will concurrently support both the

COVID-19 response and the City of Minneapolis, the City of St. Paul, and surrounding communities during this situation.

For these reasons, I declare a peacetime emergency in the City of Minneapolis, the City of St. Paul, and surrounding communities and order as follows:

- 1. The Adjutant General will order to state active duty on May 28, 2020 the personnel, equipment, and facilities needed to support emergency operations and response.
- 2. The Adjutant General is authorized to procure the goods and services needed to accomplish the mission.
- 3. The Department of Public Safety's Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management will continue to coordinate the provision of on-site support and assistance to affected local government and assess the need for supplementary emergency assistance.
- 4. State agencies, in cooperation with appropriate federal agencies, will provide assistance to local units of government as they respond to and recover from this emergency.
- 5. The costs of this assistance shall be paid from the general fund as allowed by Minnesota Statutes 2019, section 192.52.

This Executive Order and declaration of peacetime emergency is effective immediately under Minnesota Statutes 2019, section 4.035, subdivision 2, and its duration is governed by Minnesota Statutes 2019, section 12.31, subdivision 2.



### Good Evening,

Please see the responses to your questions below:

- Is there a sense whether rioting / looting will continue tonight and will it be more intense tonight? (It was already approaching maximum intensity last night). Unlike most protesters, they do not communicate with us or let us know what they plan on doing. Often groups will share with us their plans and routes to march, block traffic or locations to hold speeches. This group has done none of this.
- Is there a guess as to which business districts might be hit next? It is believed that the same group that caused the issues last night went and caused major issues in multiple suburban areas and St. Paul. They are currently in the area of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Precinct again
- Should businesses be taking precautions now, like clearing valuables out of their spaces, boarding up windows before they are broken, etc.? What specifics are suggested? We are suggesting to people to do what they feel most comfortable doing. Erring on the side of caution is always a strong suggestion of mine.
- Might housing (occupied homes, apartments) be targets? These are not known to be common targets for these groups
- What precautions should residents take? Stay in homes, board up windows, etc.? Again, people need to respond in a manner that makes them most comfortable. For some it is staying away while others want to stay home with or without boarded up windows.
- It was challenging to not have any communication/updates overnight as to when/if we should evacuate our homes. Is there any emergency messaging alert system that covers these kinds of events and how would people sign up for something like that if it exists? If there is an immediate threat or information to get out, we (MPD) tried to post on our FB page.

What else should the public know with regard to protection public safety? If you see something, please say something.

These are really hard times... I hope you're okay. Thank you for the email. Yes, these are tough times and I am sorry you have to endure all of this!







Langer. The Governor described how this week has been one of the most difficult in our state's history and how the state plans to support Minnesotans' right to protest while keeping Minnesotans, first responders, communities, and small businesses safe.

This afternoon, Hennepin County Attorney Mike Freeman announced murder and manslaughter charges against former Officer Chauvin, who killed George Floyd on May 25. The Governor responded, saying "Former Officer Chauvin's actions were horrific. His arrest is a good first step toward justice for George Floyd. But it doesn't change the systemic problems and persistent inequities that led to his death or the pain our communities live with every day. We're committed to change."

Finally, Governor Walz today implemented a temporary nighttime curfew that will provide safety for Minnesota residents from individuals who have engaged in unlawful and dangerous activity in recent days and threatened the security of lawful demonstrators and first responders.

The temporary curfew is scheduled from 8pm to 6am tonight (Friday) and tomorrow (Saturday) night. During the curfew, no one may travel on Minneapolis and Saint Paul streets or public places, except for first responders, members of the media, people going back and forth to work, individuals seeking emergency care or fleeing danger, and people experiencing homelessness. Curfews are not limited to Minneapolis and Saint Paul, mayors across the state can issue their own curfews.

"It's time to rebuild our community and that starts with safety in our streets," said Governor Walz.

"Thousands of Minnesotans have expressed their grief and frustration in a peaceful manner. But the unlawful and dangerous actions of others, under the cover of darkness, has caused irreversible pain and damage to our community. This behavior has compromised the safety of bystanders, businesses, lawful demonstrators, and first responders. Now, we come together to restore the peace."

Governor Walz and Lt. Governor Flanagan will continue to pursue justice for George Floyd. As we await the process of our justice system, we must be safe. We must protect each other. And we must rebuild. Starting in Minneapolis and Saint Paul, and across our state and country.

### **Everyone can work to reduce the spread of COVID-19**

- Wear masks when in public. 10-50% of virus carriers are asymptomatic wearing masks helps control the virus and has been shown to lower COVID-19 spread.
- Avoid enclosed spaces with groups of people, where the virus can linger in the air for long periods of time.
- Get tested if you have cold or flu-like symptoms <u>Find testing locations</u>.
- Stay six feet away from others.
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with your elbow or sleeve, or a tissue and then throw the tissue in the trash and wash your hands afterwards.
- Washing your hands often with soap and water for 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom or before eating. If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching your face especially your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.

Dear Governor Walz:

As you know, there is significant civil unrest currently taking place in the City of Minneapolis based on understandable outrage, anger and protests after the in-custody death of George Floyd.

In addition to seeking swift investigative action from the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension (BCA) and charges from the Hennepin County Attorney against the arresting officer, keeping our Minneapolis residents safe is a top priority.

There have already been injuries to first responders and protesters, including at least one further loss of life. There is also widespread looting and arson. Several structures in the City of Minneapolis are burning as I write this.

The ongoing situation is well-beyond the capability of our police and fire departments to respond. Accordingly, I am requesting that you deploy the Minnesota National Guard to the City of Minneapolis to assist our local authorities with restoring order and calm in the City.

I will direct our Emergency Management Director, our Police Chief, and our Fire Chief to coordinate any assistance that the Minnesota National Guard can provide to us and we will coordinate that effort using the National Incident Management System.

Your statement leaves out salient details of what actually happened, including that George Floyd's neck was being crushed by, now former, Officer Derek Chauvin. Perhaps the citizen-provided video of the scene was not available to you when you wrote your statement/press release, and maybe your statement was based solely on the information provided by the Officers on the scene. Forgive me if that is the case.

I want to believe that the Minneapolis Police Department is sincere about changing their culture. I met Sean McGinty, head of the Third Precinct, last fall. He talked about the work being done by the Police Department to improve their culture and how he supported that. He said it would take time for the culture to change (it <u>always</u> does in any organization) and he asked the community members to be patient. I was impressed with Office McGinty and left the community meeting feeling good about what I had heard.

My ask of you is to remember that your position is one that has tremendous influence where the public perception of the Police Department is concerned. Omissions of critical information feeds distrust, and the Police Department is now back in a position of distrust.

May 25, 2020 (MINNEAPOLIS) On Monday evening, shortly after 8:00 pm, officers from the Minneapolis Police Department responded to the 3700 block of Chicago Avenue South on a report of a forgery in progress. Officers were advised that the suspect was sitting on top of a blue car and appeared to be under the influence.

Two officers arrived and located the suspect, a male believed to be in his 40s, in his car. He was ordered to step from his car. After he got out, he physically resisted officers. Officers were able to get the suspect into handcuffs and noted he appeared to be suffering medical distress. Officers called for an ambulance. He was transported to Hennepin County Medical Center by ambulance where he died a short time later.

At no time were weapons of any type used by anyone involved in this incident.

The Minnesota Bureau of Criminal Apprehension has been called in to investigate this incident at the request of the Minneapolis Police Department.

No officers were injured in the ident.



Dear Board Members,

First of all, my great thanks to each of you for your support and offers to help. We are all safe and doing as okay as possible here, which is my wish for all of you and our community.

Based on the escalation of events over the past 48 hours and the physical proximity of Harriet Tubman Center West to the Minneapolis Police's 5<sup>th</sup> Precinct (directly across the street), early this morning I made the decision to get everyone out of Tubman West for the weekend, out of an abundance of caution.

The shelter and housing teams have been working all day to move everyone currently residing at West into other locations, either at Tubman East or in the community, and will continue to support them with advocacy, transportation, and other needs and logistics. The plan had been to move shelter residents to East in smaller groups today, Monday, and Tuesday, so this is simply an acceleration of that plan. The remaining transitional housing apartment tenants have been moved to hotels or are staying with friends until Monday at least. I have also communicated that there should be no staff onsite at West over the weekend, even to pack.

Whatever may come this weekend, the health and wellbeing of our clients and staff are our primary priority, and I take that responsibility very seriously along with the trust our clients place in us when they move into our buildings. We don't want anyone to be in physical danger should a fire spread to the building. Additionally, as the National Guard moves forward into this situation, we want to minimize the trauma that can come from anyone in the building who may see heightened police and Guard activity out their windows. We have also been coordinating with MN Adult and Teen Challenge (our landlords) regarding plans to help keep the building safe.

We've also put additional safety measures in place at both Harriet Tubman Center East and Tubman Chrysalis Center to help keep both people and the buildings safe. As an aside, the security company we have contracted with is not available to start earlier than the planned June 3 date.

Dear all,

I just spoke with Jen and wanted to provide an update regarding Tubman clients, staff and facilities.

- First and foremost, all residents, staff and facilities are all safe at this time.
- The focus right now is taking care of residents and staff during these very challenging times related to George Floyd's death and related subsequent events. Primary focus is providing support, space and options for both residents and staff to take care of themselves as they navigate a wide range of emotions and life's experience tapped and impacted by these events. (In a separate email and for your awareness, I will forward Jen's email to all Tubman staff.)
- There are community protests near Tubman West, the Chrysalis site as well as some in Oakdale near Tubman East. All buildings are currently safe although businesses and buildings near to some of our facilities have been damaged and looted.
- We had previously hired security to be added to each of our buildings (primarily related to the upcoming moves). We had interviewed and vetted the firm we hired to ensure they are in line with our values and are there to provide additional sense of safety. They were scheduled to start June 3 and we are seeing if they can start ASAP.
- The original plan was to begin moving families June 2 from Tubman West to Tubman East. We are evaluating whether it makes sense to potentially move people sooner.

I am grateful for Jen and her leadership team. I am confident in their leadership of Tubman and its people through these times. Additionally, I want to lift up one of our fellow board members, Chief Rondo. I am grateful for your leadership in this community and in particular now. I wish for you strength, wisdom, courage and calm as you lead through some particularly challenging and charged times.

DAILY COVID-19 MEDIA UPDATE: May 29, 2020

This morning, Governor Walz <u>held a press briefing</u> to address the state's response to protests and public safety concerns in Minnesota. He was joined by Attorney General Keith Ellison, National Guard Major General Jon Jensen, Public Safety Commissioner Harrington, and Minnesota State Patrol Colonel Matt Langer. The Governor described how this week has been one of the most difficult in our state's history and how the state plans to support Minnesotans' right to protest while keeping Minnesotans, first responders, communities, and small businesses safe.

This afternoon, Hennepin County Attorney Mike Freeman announced murder and manslaughter charges against former Officer Chauvin, who killed George Floyd on May 25. The Governor responded, saying "Former Officer Chauvin's actions were horrific. His arrest is a good first step toward justice for George Floyd. But it doesn't change the systemic problems and persistent inequities that led to his death or the pain our communities live with every day. We're committed to change."

Finally, Governor Walz today implemented a temporary nighttime curfew that will provide safety for Minnesota residents from individuals who have engaged in unlawful and dangerous activity in recent days and threatened the security of lawful demonstrators and first responders.

The temporary curfew is scheduled from 8pm to 6am tonight (Friday) and tomorrow (Saturday) night. During the curfew, no one may travel on Minneapolis and Saint Paul streets or public places, except for first responders, members of the media, people going back and forth to work, individuals seeking emergency care or fleeing danger, and people experiencing homelessness. Curfews are not limited to Minneapolis and Saint Paul, mayors across the state can issue their own curfews.

"It's time to rebuild our community and that starts with safety in our streets," said Governor Walz.

"Thousands of Minnesotans have expressed their grief and frustration in a peaceful manner. But the unlawful and dangerous actions of others, under the cover of darkness, has caused irreversible pain and

damage to our community. This behavior has compromised the safety of bystanders, businesses, lawful demonstrators, and first responders. Now, we come together to restore the peace."

Dear MPD,

I'm a former 3rd precinct resident watching the events in Minneapolis unfold and I'm ashamed of the MPD. I'm emailing about the murder of George Floyd by officers Derek Chauvin and Tou Thao.

These officers were not upholding the law, they committed murder and terrorized the community. The public is told time and again police officers are so well trained to respond in times of crisis and panic, yet we see again and again this is untrue when they interact with anyone who is not white. Derek Chauvin's use of force is unacceptable - yet he somehow felt he could do it even on camera. Being simply fired is not an appropriate response to murder. All officers involved should be charged and sent to serve time in prison for murder.

This type of abuse by both MPD and the Saint Paul Police has gone on for years. It needs to end now.
