Overview

Restrictive Housing is a placement that requires an inmate to be confined to a cell at least 22 hours per day for the safe and secure operation of the facility. There are a total of 582 restrictive housing beds across eight state correctional facilities operated by the Minnesota Department of Corrections. 549 of these beds are located in male correctional facilities, while Minnesota Correctional Facility (MCF) Shakopee has 33 beds in its restrictive housing unit. All restrictive housing across the Minnesota Department of Corrections facilities are single bed cells/rooms.

There are a variety of reasons for an incarcerated person's placement in a restrictive housing setting. Those include disciplinary segregation, temporary housing status, administrative segregation, special management status (Step-Down Management Program), pre-hearing detention, mental health observation or other status.

- <u>Disciplinary segregation</u> a specified number of days of confinement in a room/cell with fewer privileges and amenities for violation of the offender discipline rules.
- <u>Temporary housing status</u>— a non-punitive status assigned to an offender temporarily housed in a restrictive housing unit due to non-availability of space in the general population.
- <u>Administrative segregation</u>- a non-punitive form of separation from the general population when an offender's continued presence in the general population poses a serious risk of harm to self, others, of property, or a serious threat to the security or orderly operation of the facility.
- <u>Special Management Status (Step-Down Management Program)</u> a program designed to ensure that certain offenders in restrictive housing who present an increased risk to the safety, security, or orderly operation of the facility can gradually transition back to general population or the community.
- <u>Mental Health Observation</u>-increased monitoring for any offender/resident who demonstrates serious mental illness, or a potential for harm to self or others.
- Other assignment certain incarcerated people live within the restrictive housing unit and work on the living unit but have all privileges as those in general population.

Movements from one segregation bed to another are excluded. An offender may have more than one such admission during the fiscal year.
