

PRIMARY ABSENTEE BALLOTS REMAINING TO BE COUNTED

[Chapter 77](#), enacted by the 2020 Minnesota Legislature, contains this provision:

A county must report to the secretary of state the number of absentee ballots remaining to be counted after the 24-hour period prescribed in Minnesota Statutes, section 203B.121, subdivision 5, paragraph (c). The report must be made as soon as practicable, but not more than four hours after that period ends. The secretary of state must publish these data on the secretary's website as soon as practicable, but not more than 24 hours after its receipt.

The data as reported to the Secretary of State by each county is below.
