AT A GLANCE

Conservation Corps Minnesota, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, provides youth (ages 15-18) and young adults (ages 18 to 25), with hands-on service-learning opportunities that improve access to outdoor recreation, restore habitat, protect water waterways, and respond to natural disasters.

- In 2019, 208 Young Adult participants received education awards after completing service:
 - 133 field crew participants working in natural resource management.
 - 22 individuals serving with various natural resource agencies and non-profits.
 - 53 participants serving as youth leaders for summer and afterschool youth programs.


189 Youth participants earned wages or a stipend restoring resources and gaining job skills:

- 89 youth who serving as part of the rural residential Summer Youth Corps
- 100 youth who serving in an afterschool program providing job training, science education, and outdoor service-learning for participants from low-income urban communities.

PURPOSE

Conservation Corps Minnesota's purpose is to help young people from diverse backgrounds become more connected to natural resources and the environment, promote their equitable access to nature, equip them to succeed in career and life, and empower them to make a difference in conserving natural resources.

Conservation Corps Minnesota's mission is to engage youth and young adults in meaningful service, leadership development, and environmental stewardship. The organization provides training to members in natural resource management, technical skills, and job readiness and helps develop personal responsibility and a strong work ethic.

Despite a diverse funding base, fee-for-service revenue supports more than 73 percent of Conservation Corps' expenses and serve as the primary funding source for the young adult service programs in combination with

federal funding. Youth programs also derive revenue from fee-for-service contracts but rely more heavily on individual giving, private foundations, corporate contributions, and government grants. Fee-for-service partners include federal, state, local and nonprofit partners. General funds include state appropriations. Federal funds include grants awarded through AmeriCorps and the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS). Other funding also includes various state and local grants and funding, private foundation, corporate and individual giving, and miscellaneous.

STRATEGIES

Throughout Conservation Corps' five program areas, young people are involved in hands-on, service-learning activities that protect, enhance natural resources, and promote workforce skills and readiness.

- 1. AmeriCorps Field Crew program for young adults, ages 18-25, includes non-residential crews in northern, central, and southern Minnesota that engage young adults in natural resource management and disaster response work from February to December. Crew members receive a monthly stipend, health insurance, and an education award for college expenses. Beside career and work-skills training, members receive certifications in wildfire suppression, defensive driving, chainsaw safety and first aid.
- 2. AmeriCorps Single Placement program for young adults, ages 18-25, provides positions s natural resource and community outreach specialists at natural resource agencies and nonprofit organizations, from February to December. In addition, Apprentice Academy program during the summer provides apprentice service opportunities with Minnesota Soil and Water Conservation Districts. Single Placement members receive a monthly stipend, health insurance, and an education award for college expenses.
- 3. Youth Outdoors, an afterschool service-learning program for Twin Cities youth, serves predominantly youth, (ages 15-18), from low-in households. Youth receive an hourly training-wage, participate for one academic semester at a time, meet two days a week after school and on Saturdays to explore science and the environment and complete projects to improve local public parks, and restore natural resources and native habitat. Summer opportunities are also available. Youth in this program, 90 percent of whom are people of color, are predominantly from low income communities and high schools in the Twin Cities. This program engages young adult AmeriCorps members as youth leaders.
- 4. **Summer Youth Corps** residential program serves youth, (ages 15-18), and engages young adult AmeriCorps members (18-24) as youth leaders, in environmental restoration field crew-oriented work in national and state forests for two summer sessions. Participants, —about 10 percent of whom are deaf or hard of hearing— receive a living stipend as well as room and board. Youth Leaders at the residential program, receive a monthly stipend, health insurance, and an education award for college expenses.
- 5. Increasing Diversity in Environmental Careers (IDEC) engages college students pursuing STEM degrees who are interested in a career in natural resources. Established in 2018 and initiated in 2019, through partnership between the Conservation Corps, the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, the Minnesota Board of Water and Soil Resources and the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, students participate in fellowships, mentorships, and paid internships. The program targets students from backgrounds typically underrepresented in natural resource careers, including women, people of color, and individuals with disabilities. Participants receive a fellowship payment to support academic expenses for the school year.
