At the request of the Brooklyn Center Police Department (BCPD), True Blue Services conducted the biennial audit of the police department's use of the Portable Recording System (Body-Worn Camera System (BWCs).) This was conducted on April 6, 2022. The purpose of this audit was to verify if the Brooklyn Center Police Department is in compliance with the following Minnesota State Statute sections relating to Body-Worn Cameras.

Minnesota §13.825 – Portable Recording Systems

Minnesota §626.8473 – Portable Recording Systems Adoption; Written Policy Required

Overview:

This analysis and audit were conducted using the current Minnesota State Statutes as reference. The data reviewed was from 1 July 2019 to 6 April 2022.

As of 6 April 2022, the Brooklyn Center Police Department was authorized 49 sworn police officers who are authorized and directed to use their department issued BWCs according to policy.

Brooklyn Center Police utilize the *Panasonic Arbitrator* system. This system handles both the police department's body-worn cameras and the dashboard mounted in-squad recorders. This audit, per Minnesota statute, only analyzes the body-worn cameras, policies, and practices.

True Blue Services does not own, operate, or have any access to any *Panasonic Arbitrator* system, thereby fulfilling the required independence of this audit. The Brooklyn Center Command Staff, Support Services Division, and with the support of the Information Technology Department, provided access to the *Panasonic Arbitrator* system to allow independent review of the data and complete this audit.

The results of this analysis and audit are detailed below.
