### Administration

#### Capitol Complex Parking Fund Debt Relief

General Fund Cash	13,000
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The Governor recommends a permanent waiver of user financing for the repayment of debt service for Ramp F, a parking facility west of the Transportation Building on the Capitol Complex. The impact of this request is \$1,085,227 annually to the general fund in FY 2023 through FY 2034, or about \$13 million over 12 years. This would provide financial relief to the Department of Administration's parking fund.

#### Ford Building Demolition Phase I

General Obligation Bonds	3,626
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The Governor recommends \$3.626 million for the demolition of the Ford Building and site work necessary for future development. The Ford Building has been vacant since 2004 and is in critical condition, according to the department's facility condition assessment. This project will address safety hazards and allow the site to be repurposed to meet state facility needs.

#### Capital Asset Preservation and Replacement Account (CAPRA)

General Obligation Bonds	7,500
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The Governor recommends \$7.5 million to fund the Capital Asset Preservation and Replacement Account (CAPRA). This account is for emergency repairs and unanticipated hazardous material abatement needs for state owned facilities.

#### State Building Energy Conservation Revolving Loan Fund

General Fund Cash	10,000
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The Governor recommends \$10 million to expand a revolving loan fund from which the Department of Administration will lend funding to other agencies to finance energy efficiency and water conservation facility improvement projects.

#### State Building Renewable Energy Production Account

General Fund Cash	5,000
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The Governor recommends \$5 million to fund renewable energy investments for state facilities. Agencies would apply for this funding to make improvements to their facilities designed to reduce the energy use and long-term operating costs of the facilities.

#### State Fleet Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure

General Fund Cash	5,000
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The Governor recommends \$5 million to expand the state's electric vehicle charging infrastructure by installing additional charging stations in state-owned facilities across the state.

#### Capitol Complex Security Upgrades Phase II

The Governor recommends a total of \$46.4 million for design, construction and equipment to increase physical security in and around the Capitol Complex. This project incorporates recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Capitol Area Security.

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The Governor recommends \$1 million to correct physical issues in state buildings that hinder the public's access to state services and employment. The Minnesota Council on Disability will review and recommend state governmental entities' requests for project funds.

#### MDA East Grand Forks Building Repair

The Governor recommends \$377,000 to renovate the MDA potato inspection facility located in East Grand Forks. This building is used primarily for potato-related services, including Seed Potato Certification, laboratory testing for pathogens, potato cyst nematode surveys, USDA shipping point inspections, federal crop insurance grading, and sampling.

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### Amateur Sports Commission

#### NSC Asset Preservation

	General Obligation Bonds	10,800
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The Governor recommends \$10.8 million for asset preservation for projects at the National Sports Center (NSC) in Blaine. These projects are intended to ensure the safety and health of participants and staff using the Center's facilities. The National Sports Center has an estimated \$70 million in deferred maintenance needs.

#### Mighty Ducks Grant Program

	General Obligation Bonds	1,000
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The Governor recommends \$1 million to provide grants to local communities to upgrade ice arenas, primarily through replacing refrigerant and improving air quality. This would help communities meet safety guidelines for arenas, as well as make other improvements.

#### St. Paul Regional Sports Center Predesign

	General Obligation Bonds	295
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The Governor recommends \$295,000 to predesign a Regional Sports Center in St. Paul. This center will be a four-field complex that can accommodate soccer, rugby, lacrosse, and other field sports. The purpose of these regional centers is to increase sports participation, as well as promote sports tourism and economic benefit.

#### Asset Preservation

	General Obligation Bonds	58,133
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The Governor recommends \$58.133 million for asset preservation to repair and renew correctional facilities around the state. This includes, but is not limited to, safety hazards and code compliance issues, perimeter security systems upgrades, tuck pointing, roof replacement, window and door replacement, and abatement of hazardous materials. The DOC deferred maintenance backlog is an estimated \$644 million.

#### MCF-Faribault Dakota Building Renovation and Addition

	General Obligation Bonds	8,003
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The Governor recommends \$8.003 million to demolish a two story building that is in crisis condition, renovate the Dakota building, and construct an addition to accommodate support functions and programming at the Faribault Correctional Facility. The new space will house programming such as religious services, education, training for transition to the community, and treatment.

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### Corrections

#### MCF-Shakopee Programming Space Addition and Interior Renovation

General Obligation Bonds	15,164
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The Governor recommends \$15.164 million to expand and renovate the Shakopee Correctional Facility. The new space will accommodate more programming and support functions including education and family support services.

#### MCF-Lino Lakes-Building E Renovation and Repurposing

General Obligation Bonds	6,358
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The Governor recommends \$6.358 million to renovate vacant space at the Lino Lakes Correctional Facility. This project will accommodate more programming by adding flexible classroom space and space for support staff.

#### Business Development Public Infrastructure Grant Program (BDPI)

General Obligation Bonds	7,000
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The Governor recommends \$7 million for the Business Development Public Infrastructure (BDPI) program. BDPI is a competitive grant program that provides cities in Greater Minnesota with up to 50% of public infrastructure costs necessary to support economic development. Eligible public infrastructure projects include sewers, streets, wastewater collection and treatment, drinking water, and utility extensions.

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### Employment and Economic Development

#### Transportation Economic Development Infrastructure Program (TEDI)

General Obligation Bonds	4,000
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The Governor recommends \$4 million for the Transportation Economic Development Infrastructure (TEDI) program. TEDI is a statewide, competitive grant program that provides communities up to 100% of road and public infrastructure project costs to support economic development, private investment, and create jobs. TEDI can be combined with the Minnesota Department of Transportation's Transportation Economic Development (TED) program.

#### Innovative Business Development Public Infrastructure Grant Program (IBDPI)

General Obligation Bonds	1,000
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The Governor recommends \$1 million for the Innovative Business Development Public Infrastructure (IBDPI) program. IBDPI is a statewide competitive grant program that provides local government units with up to 50% of public infrastructure costs necessary to support economic development in innovative industries. Eligible public infrastructure projects include sewers, streets, utility extensions, land acquisition, and telecommunications.

Projects are prioritized based on long range planning, building analysis, and structural conditions. These sites have a total estimated \$67 million in deferred maintenance needs.

#### County and Local Historic Preservation Grants

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The Governor recommends \$750,000 for grants to preserve historic assets owned by county and local entities. This program leverages local funding to preserve historic structures such as depots, senior and community centers, schools, bridges, theaters, park buildings, museums, water towers, and township halls.

### Housing Finance

#### Housing Infrastructure Bonds

	Appropriation Bonds	250,000
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The Governor recommends authorizing the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency to sell \$250 million in Housing Infrastructure Bonds and recommends a corresponding appropriation of up to \$20 million annually for 20 years from the general fund to pay the debt service on the bonds. Funds will be awarded through competitive request for proposal processes to for-profit developers, non-profit developers, Indian Tribes or tribal housing corporations, and local units of government for supportive housing, preservation, senior housing, single family development, and manufactured home communities. The Governor also recommends expanding the eligible uses of Housing Infrastructure Bonds to include new construction of rental housing for households with incomes at or below 50% of area median income.

#### Public Housing Rehabilitation

	General Obligation Bonds	60,000
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The Governor recommends \$60 million for the Public Housing Rehabilitation program to preserve existing public housing and keep it safe and healthy for residents. Funds are awarded statewide on a competitive basis to local public housing authorities for improvements in fire suppression systems, accessibility improvements, heating and cooling systems, building envelopes, energy efficient windows, elevators, and other critical health and safety items.

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### Human Services

#### Sunrise & Tomlinson Building Renovation

General Obligation Bonds	17,800
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The Governor recommends \$17.8 million to design, remodel, construct, and equip buildings for the Minnesota Sex Offender Program on the St. Peter campus. This project will renovate 63,335 square feet in the Sunrise and Tomlinson building and expand capacity in the program's Community Preparation Services. This additional capacity will allow more individuals to be served in less restrictive settings, allowing DHS to comply with court-ordered transfers out of the secured perimeter and additional clients to participate in reintegration programming.

#### Early Childhood Facilities

General Obligation Bonds	5,000
General Fund Cash	5,375
<b>Total:</b>	<b>10,375</b>

The Governor recommends \$10 million for Early Childhood Facilities grants to political subdivisions, nonprofits, and tribal governments to construct and renovate early childhood facilities. The purpose of this funding is to ensure families have access to early childhood programs housed in safe facilities. DHS will select projects through a RFP process and require a 50% non-state match. The Governor also recommends \$375,000 in general fund dollars for program administration.

#### Anoka Miller Building Phase I

General Obligation Bonds	13,450
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The Governor recommends \$13.45 million for the Anoka Metro Regional Treatment Center (AMRTC) to remodel the north and south wings of the Miller building. This remodeling will allow this vacant space to be used to serve patients with substance use disorder. This project is Phase I of a multi-phase effort to remodel this building on the AMRTC campus. This phased renovation allows for safety and client service improvements without disrupting operations.

#### St. Peter Water and Sewer Upgrades

General Obligation Bonds	10,400
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The Governor recommends \$10.4 million to upgrade and replace the water, sanitary and storm sewer infrastructure at the St. Peter Campus. These systems have exceeded their useful life and their replacement will ensure 1,100 clients and staff have access to functioning and safe water infrastructure.

#### DCT Energy Upgrades

General Fund Cash	8,600
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The Governor recommends \$8.6 million in general fund cash to design and install renewable energy systems at the Anoka Metro Regional Treatment Center (AMRTC), the St. Peter campus, and the Moose Lake campus.

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The Governor recommends \$72.006 million to establish Emergency Shelter Facilities grants for local governments, nonprofits, and tribal governments for capital enhancements to existing shelters or to acquire new shelter space across the states. The Department will use \$2.006 million of this appropriation to cover the operating costs of administering the remaining \$70 million for the grant program.

#### Asset Preservation

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The Governor recommends \$7.4 million for asset preservation needs at DHS facilities throughout Minnesota to ensure they are functional, safe and in good repair. The Department's total estimated deferred maintenance needs are \$165 million.

#### Johnson Hall Demolition

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The Governor recommends \$475,000 in general fund cash to demolish Johnson Hall, a 23,822 square foot building on the St. Peter campus. This building has been vacant since 2017. This building is no longer needed by the department and the most recent Facility Condition Assessment rated the building with a "Poor" condition rating.

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The Governor recommends \$5.484 million to add new and or upgrade current security systems, communications and security monitoring systems at Direct Care and Treatment (DCT) facilities. These improvements will enhance the security and safety of patients and staff within the state operated facilities.
