The MASC is a party to cell phone tower leases with Cingular/AT&T (\$20,631/year) and Verizon (\$19,044/year) on the light poles at the National Sports Center stadium. The lease payments are directed to be paid to the National Sports Center Foundation for ongoing maintenance expenses related to maintaining the stadium. The estimated revenue for future years is as follows: AT&T (\$20,631) and Verizon (\$21,900).
