Subject: 2022 Operating Costs Report

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 462A.20, subd. 4, I am submitting the Agency's Operating Costs Report for FY 2021 and Budget Plan for FY 2022.

Our FY 2021 operating budget was \$38.1 million and we anticipate our operating budget will be \$39.6 million for FY 2022, an estimated increase of 3.9%. Total assistance provided in FY 2021 was \$1.9 billion and our ratio of operating expenses to assistance provided was 1.99%. Total assistance provided increased by 20.0% from FY 2020 to FY 2021.

Also enclosed is the Agency's FY 2021 Financial Report, which includes the audited financial statements for all of the Agency's funds. An independent certified public accounting firm audits the Agency's financial statements every year. The procedures used to audit the Agency's administrative expenses are primarily analytical in nature. For the larger individual amounts included in the salaries and benefits and other general operating expense lines, comparisons are made to the prior year. Large fluctuations, if any, are identified, reviewed and assessed for reasonableness. The total amount of payroll is consistent with the Agency's payroll records. The FY2021 Financial Report fulfills the statutory requirement that the financial statement include information on expenditures and receipts relating to debt issuance and administration, and loan origination and administration.
