

Dear Chairs McDonald, Snyder and Commissioners:

The Annual Report of the Inspector of Mines for 2021 is herewith submitted.

Mining activity for 2021 showed an increase in production schedule for St. Louis and Itasca counties. A total of 39,951,315 tons of taconite were shipped from area operations compared to 31,921,917 in 2020. Mining related employment was reported at 4,323 individuals. This represents an increase of 761 employees compared to the 3,562 reported in 2020. The total work hours reported for area mining operations was 8,165,371 for the year.

Throughout 2021 the COVID-19 pandemic continued to impact the world and area operations. However, unlike in 2020, all area mining operations remained in operation all 12 months of the year which contributed to an increase in production comparatively. These operations include: Cleveland Cliffs Minorca, Hibbing Taconite, Keetac, Minntac, Northshore and United Taconite.

The objective of growth during the coming years remains on the forefront. PolyMet carried on efforts to obtain the final mine permits associated with the NorthMet project (copper/nickel/precious metal mining), and Twin Metals continued to move forward with efforts directed toward their semi-precious metal mining project near Ely.

During 2021, area mining operations reported a total of 12 lost-time or serious accidents. This is an increase in comparison to the 11 experienced in 2020. No fatalities were reported for the 2021 year.

Excerpts from the Law On

INSPECTOR OF MINES

CHAPTER 180

MINNESOTA STATUTES

SECTION 180.08

ACCIDENTS; NOTICE, INVESTIGATION

Upon the occurrence of a reportable accident, it is the duty of the manager or designee of the mine to give notice to the inspector of mines, as soon as practical but at least within one hour of stabilization of the accident scene, stating the particulars of the accident. Upon notification, the inspector shall, if the inspector deems it necessary, go immediately to the scene of the accident and make suggestions and render assistance as the inspector may deem necessary in the premises and personally investigate the cause of the accident and take steps as the inspector may deem necessary for the safety of the employees of the mine and to prevent accident of a like or similar nature. The inspector shall be accompanied by three persons appointed by the manager or other person in charge of the mine and by three persons appointed by a majority of the employees of the mine. The requirement for accompaniment may be modified by a waiver signed by representatives from the employees, management, and inspector.

NON-FATAL LOST-TIME AND SERIOUS ACCIDENTS

CLEVELAND CLIFFS MINORCA MINE INC:

Service Technician, Date of Accident – January 15, 2021. Employee was pulling a steel cable to hook up a haul truck that was stuck. The conditions were packed snow, and the employee was wearing ice cleats, but as the task was being performed the employee slipped and landed on the left shoulder causing a tear of the rotator cuff. The injury resulted in surgery. Days Lost – 33

Maintenance Mechanic, Date of Accident – January 27, 2021. Employee was performing maintenance on a rod mill trommel and as the employee was repositioning the left shoulder came in contact with a pad eye. This caused soreness and bruising. Days Lost – 2

Utility Technician, Date of Accident – February 1, 2021. Employee was lifting a 50-lb. box about three feet off the ground to place onto a shelf. During the lift the box came in contact with the shelf it was destined for and abruptly stopped the employee's lifting motion. This caused a tear of the employee's left rotator cuff. The injury resulted in surgery. Days Lost – 42

Operations Technician, Date of Accident – February 1, 2021. Employee was exiting a pickup truck and slipped, falling to the ground injuring the left wrist. A fracture of the bone resulted. Days Lost – 34

Utility Technician, Date of Accident – September 30, 2021. Employee was taking apart a two-piece rim that was 10" in diameter; the last remaining bolt on the rim was stripped so the employee used a grinder to cut the bolt off. As this occurred and the bolt was cut free, the pressure from the tire tube caused the rim to strike the employee in the hands, upper chest, and face area. The injuries resulted in lost time. Days Lost - 63

HIBBING TACONITE:

Tractor Operator, Date of Accident – May 25, 2021. Two light fleet vehicles were both traveling eastbound through the pit, one vehicle was coming from the Mine view on the south leg of the road. The other was coming down the main haul road on the north leg of that road. The roads meet at a "V" intersection coming down the hill. One vehicle slowed at the "V" to cross over the haul road to a dump. As they were creeping toward the haul road to look around a cobbing pile on their left, the other vehicle was coming over a gradual hill in the road by the intersection. Neither vehicle saw the other resulting in the vehicles making contact. A passenger in one vehicle received minor whiplash and sore back. Days Lost – 1

HIBBING TACONITE COMPANY (cont)

Maintenance Mechanic, Date of Accident – November 2, 2021. MMG was assisting other MMGs on the task of replacing the ~18" diameter rubber lined "Y" pipe. The 1st section of piping was removed with the overhead crane and placed on the floor. One section of the 2-piece Victaulic clamp was removed and placed on the platform of a rolling stair. The injured began moving the rolling stair to prepare for replacement of the next section of piping. The section of clamp (~32 lbs.) fell from the platform of the rolling stair (7.5 ft.) striking the injured in the face area which resulted in stitches to lips and front teeth damage. Days Lost - 2

NORTHSHORE MINING COMPANY

Babbitt:

Coarse Crusher Maintenance Technician, Date of Accident – May 10, 2021. The employee had just finished rigging two 30" crusher wall liners and was standing with his foot positioned between the rigged liners and another liner lying on the floor. When a co-worker started to raise the liners, the load slid back and pinned the affected employee's foot/ankle against the stationary liner. The impact resulted in a fracture to the employee's ankle. Days Lost - 21

Plant Operator, Date of Accident – February 12, 2021. While attempting to remove built-up concentrate from a chute liner, the employee was operating a jack hammer and a large slab slid down off the chute and pinned the employee's left leg. Days Lost - 53

Line Attendant, Date of Accident - January 27, 2021. Employee was attempting to clean in the line 8 basement south of the 147 pumps by the 23-03-1 belt. As the employee was moving a piece of classifier skirting about 10 feet, they slipped and fell up against the 120-08-1 feed end wall. The employee noted pain in their left shoulder resulting in an arm fracture. Days Lost -67

Maintenance Technician, Date of Accident – February 10, 2021. Employee was removing a bottom wear plate from the bucket of the 247 loader. In the process of arc airing the weld on the top right corner of the wear plate, the left side of the plate swung downward and the right-side weld broke free causing the plate to land on the employee's left foot. Estimated weight of plate was approximately 500 pounds with dimensions of 85" x 28" x 1". The employee was wearing a steel toe boot with metatarsal protection and the boot was in good condition. Two toes were amputated following the incident. Days Lost – 180

Maintenance Technician, Date of Accident – April 19, 2021. Employee was using a T-handle chuck wrench to tighten one of the jaws on a 4-jaw chuck and felt pain in his right shoulder. The T-handle wrench being used weighs 5 lbs. and measures 20" wide at the handles and 10-1/4" long. Employee suffered a torn rotator cuff. Days Lost - 59
