Subject: Interagency agreements and transfers

In accordance with Minnesota Statutes 15.0395, I am submitting this report to the chairs and ranking minority members of the state government finance and legacy finance committees, which have jurisdiction over the Arts Board's general fund and the arts and cultural heritage fund appropriations.

During fiscal year 2022, the Arts Board had interagency agreements with two state agencies that met the \$100,000 reporting threshold:

• The board had a service level agreement with MN.IT to provide IT personnel and services. FY 2022 payments related to that agreement were \$213,819.

• The board had four interagency agreements with Management Analysis and Development, a division of Minnesota Department of Administration, to perform or subcontract research services for the board.

FY 2022 payments on those four agreements totaled \$174.781.

Minnesota Statutes 129D.04, subdivision 5, authorizes the Arts Board to contract as necessary in performance of its duties. Minnesota Statutes 471.59 allows two or more governmental unit to enter into cooperative agreements or contracts.
