Subject: Annual Report of Obsolete, Unnecessary, or Duplicative Rules per Minnesota Statutes section 14.05 subdivision 5.

Submitted by the Minnesota Board of Barber Examiners

Dear Governor Walz, Senators, Representatives, Director Weber and Revisor Inman:

The Board of Barber Examiners has conducted a review of its Administrative Rules in Minnesota Chapter 2100 and finds the following obsolete, unnecessary, or duplicative rules:

- 1. Minnesota Rule Part 2100.0100, subpart 3 defines the phrase "has practiced as a barber" formerly found under Minn. Stat. §154.11. This definition is not referenced within the current version of Minn. Stat. §154.11 and therefore is obsolete.
- 2. Minnesota Rule 2100.4500 Instructor Registration Qualifications is duplicative of Minnesota Statute Section 154.056(3).
- 3. Minnesota Rule 2100.2500 Examination dates states that examinations are held in the second week of February, May, August, and November. Examinations are currently held in the first week of these months. Statute

The Minnesota Board of Barber Examiners proposed legislation in 2022 to fix obsolete rules, but the bill did not survive the legislature. The board intends to pursue this legislation again in 2023.
