The Department of Commerce has reviewed its rules and at this time and has one rule to report that has become obsolete, unnecessary, or duplicative:

• Annual Examination Report, Minnesota Administrative Rule 2675.2610 (2022). This rule is no longer necessary with current advancements in banking practices and newer regulations. Therefore, this rule is now obsolete and duplicative as has been recommended by the agency advisory group. The Department will begin the rulemaking process to repeal this rule.
