

Dear Chairs Boyle, Ives and Commissioners:

The Annual Report of the Inspector of Mines for 2022 is herewith submitted.

Mining activity for 2022 showed a decrease in production schedule for St. Louis and Itasca counties. A total of 33,514,485 tons of taconite were shipped from area operations compared to 39,951,315 in 2021. Mining related employment was reported at 3,770 individuals. This represents a decrease of 553 employees compared to the 4,323 reported in 2021. The total work hours reported for area mining operations was 7,695,613 for the year.

Throughout 2022 the COVID-19 pandemic continued to impact the world and area operations although to a lesser extent than in previous years. Five of six area mining operations remained in operation throughout the 12 months of the year. These include: Cleveland Cliffs Minorca, Hibbing Taconite, Keetac, Minntac, and United Taconite. Northshore Mine was idled in May of 2022 and reported operating for 4 months, which contributed to a decrease in production for the area.

On the copper/nickel/precious metal front, PolyMet continued to work through plans to build an open pit mine near Babbitt and reuse a former iron ore processing plant near Hoyt Lakes. Twin Metals pressed forward with efforts to obtain federal leases and to resume the environmental review process directed toward their semi-precious metal mining project near Ely.

2022 was marked with the loss of industry and mine safety advocate Senator David Tomassoni who, among other things, was an instrumental part of facilitating revisions to the Mine Inspector Statute in both 2013 and 2018.

During 2022, area mining operations reported a total of 11 lost-time or serious accidents. This number is a decrease in comparison to the 12 experienced in 2021. No fatalities were reported for the 2022 year.

St. Louis County Mine Inspectors successfully completed all required inspections of area operations as mandated by Minnesota State Law Chapter 180, Section 180.03 during 2022.

Acknowledgement and appreciation is extended to both Labor and Management for their continued interest, efforts and cooperation in the field of Safety and Health throughout the mines and plants in St. Louis and Itasca counties.

Excerpts from the Law On

INSPECTOR OF MINES CHAPTER 180

MINNESOTA STATUTES

SECTION 180.03

DUTIES: SUBDIVISION 1. INSPECTIONS

The duties of the inspector of mines shall be to visit all mining operations for which a permit to mine has been obtained from the commissioner of natural resources in the inspector's county at least once every 90 days and more often if requested so to do as hereinafter provided, and closely inspect the mines so visited and condemn all such places where the employees are in danger from any cause. In the event that the inspector of mines finds that a place is dangerous from any cause, it shall be the inspector's duty immediately to order those engaged in the work at that place to cease work, and notify the superintendent, agent, or person in charge to secure the place from the existing danger, which notification or order shall be in writing, clearly define the limits of the dangerous place, and specify the work to be done or change to be made to render the same secure. ordinary mine risks excepted. It shall be the duty of the inspector of mines to order the person, persons, or corporation working any mine, or the agent, superintendent, lead supervisor, or other person having immediate charge of the working of any mine, to mitigate the identified hazard.

NON-FATAL LOST-TIME AND SERIOUS ACCIDENTS

CLEVELAND CLIFFS MINORCA MINE INC:

None

HIBBING TACONITE:

Maintenance Mechanic, Date of Accident – February 9, 2022. Employee was unclogging an 8" screen line 15' above the rougher floor from a 19' scissor lift. The employee's partner was working from the finisher floor above and below the lift. The employee attempted to lower the lift to get a part when the electronic controls failed. The employee's partner tried to lower from the ground with the manual emergency control, but was having difficulty. The employee in the lift unhooked their fall harness connection point from the provided tie-off anchor to exit the lift and climb down the cross supports between the scissors. The employee hopped from the last cross brace, 4' from the ground, striking their hip on the base of the lift resulting in a bruised hip and a compression fracture to their back. Days Lost – 98

Tractor Operator, Date of Accident – April 1, 2022. A tractor operator arrived at a D11 CAT and used access via the tracks to board the cab as the man basket was in the "up" position upon arrival. Once in the cab, the employee needed to get down and proceeded to use the basket to exit the CAT due to material buildup on the tracks and track boarding steps. The basket would not release and lower to the ground. The employee attempted to release the basket a few more times without success. The employee then stepped out of the basket. The basket jumped over the catch/stop mechanism and struck the employee in the left lower leg area resulting in a fracture. Days Lost – 36

Crane Operator, Date of Accident – April 14, 2022. An employee was walking out of the bullgang shack alongside a portable barricade to get to the vehicle they were using. The employee was turning to the right just past the barricade when they slipped and fell landing on their shoulder area. Ice and snow had accumulated on the ground on top of previously frozen precipitation. The area had not been sanded prior to the incident. The employee stated they had anti-slip foot protection on at the time of the incident. Incident resulted in right shoulder surgery. Days Lost – 21

Tractor Operator, Date of Accident – October 6, 2022. The employee arrived at a D-11 CAT at the beginning of the shift. The hydraulic stairway was BO at the time, so the operator used the CAT tracks to climb up to the operator's cab to put their lunch pail away. The employee then stepped back down on the tracks to gain access to the engine compartment to check the oil as part of the pre-shift inspection. The employee opened the inspection door and placed

their left foot on the corner of the cabinet door opening. The employee had their right foot on the track and was using their rear/lower back area to hold the door open due to the windy conditions. The employee reached down to grab the dipstick handle when their right foot slipped off the track and into an 8" gap between the tracks and the frame of the D-11 CAT. This caused the employee to land on their tailbone on the tracks resulting in a bruised tailbone. Days Lost – 1

NORTHSHORE MINING COMPANY

Babbitt:

Mine Operations, Date of Accident – February 14, 2022. Employee states that while moving a drill over a new hole, the drill power cable was frozen into snow and ice, and pulled tight and undercut her legs, causing the employee to fall backwards to the ground. The employee landed on their left shoulder, resulting in broken clavicle and torn rotator cuff. Days Lost – 143

Silver Bay:

Maintenance Technician, Date of Accident – December 14, 2022. Employee states that when he stepped out of the small fleet vehicle he was riding in, the fresh, wet snow compacted under his boots, and he slipped and fell. He was wearing boot cleats, but because of the snow depth, the cleats did not contact the ground/ice. As he fell, he stuck his arm out to brace himself and he landed on his elbow, resulting in torn rotator cuff. Davs Lost – 0

Operations Technician, Date of Accident – May 10, 2022. Employee states while attempting to travel down the ramp between 61/161 conveyor shuttles, they slipped on pellets and fell backwards. The employee tried to catch themself with left hand, fracturing their wrist. Days Lost – 82

UNITED TACONITE:

Plant Operator, Date of Accident – April 23, 2022. Process upset caused the Line 2 West dust valves to put hot dust into the air, giving an operator in the area burns to their face and wrists. Days Lost – 4

Crusher Mechanic, Date of Accident – September 22, 2022. Mechanic was installing a crusher adjustment ring when a spring bolt pinched their finger. Days Lost – 5

Plant Operator, Date of Accident – October 31, 2022. Operator slipped descending loader ladder from material that was built up on the bottom rung causing the operator to have low back pain. Days Lost -1

Pit Mechanic, Date of Accident – November 21, 2022. Mechanic's hand became caught between the hydraulic shovel side frame and the lower roller unit that was being installed. Days Lost – 5
