We, Mrs. Virginia Holm, Secretary of State, Clarence R. Magney, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Theodore Christianson, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Robert V. Rensch, Judge of District Court, Second Judicial District, and D. E. LaBelle, Judge of District Court, Fourth Judicial District, the legally constituted and acting State Canvassing Board, as required by law, opened and canvassed on November 18, 1952, the certified copies of the statements made by the County Canvassing Boards of the votes cast at the November 4, 1952, General Election, and we have prepared therefrom a statement of the whole number of votes cast at said election for and against the Proposed Amendments to the Constitution of the State of Minnesota, for Presidential Electors, United States Senator in Congress, the several State Officers, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Representatives in the Legislature from such districts as are required by law to be certified by this Board, Representatives in Congress, Judges of District Court, and Clerk of the Board of Education, School District No. 6, Itasca County, and we have specified the persons receiving such votes and the number received by each, which statement is as follows:

Investment of Permanent Trust Funds

Amendment of Section 6, of Article VIII of the Constitution, relating to changing the requirements for investment or loan of the permanent school and permanent university funds.

YES, received	604,384
NO, received	500,490

And it appearing that a majority of the electors voting at said election have voted No, said First Amendment is hereby declared Lost.

Second—

Revision of Constitution by a Convention

Shall the Constitution of the State of Minnesota be amended by adding to Article 14 thereof a new section to be known as Section 3, providing for the submission at the next general election after any revision of the constitution by any convention called for that purpose to the people of the state any such revision for their approval or rejection and that, before the same shall go into effect, there shall be an approval and ratification thereof by three-fifths of all the electors voting on the question?

And it appearing that a majority of the electors voting at said election have voted No, said Second Amendment is hereby declared Lost.

Third—

Clarifying Qualifications of Voters

Shall the Constitution, Article VII, Section 1, relating to who may vote, be amended so as to provide for changes in the wording thereof in order to clarify the meaning, without materially changing the actual meaning thereof?

And it appearing that a majority of the electors voting at said election have voted No, said Third Amendment is hereby declared Lost.

Fourth—

Probate Judge and Probate Court

Shall Section 7 of Article VI of the Constitution of the State of Minnesota, relating to office of probate judge, be so amended that the second sentence thereof shall read as follows: It shall be held by one judge, whose qualifications may be established by law and who shall be elected by the voters of the county for the term of four years.

and the last sentence of said section shall read as follows: A probate court shall have jurisdiction over the person and estate, either or both, of persons under guardianship; over estates of deceased persons; and such further jurisdiction as the legislature may from time to time establish by a two-thirds vote.

Fifth—

Motor Vehicle Tax Distribution

Shall the Constitution, Article XVI, Section 3, be amended so as to provide for apportionment of the excise tax on motor vehicles so that 65 per cent be paid into the trunk highway sinking fund, ten per cent be apportioned to cities, villages, and boroughs in proportion to population, and 25 per cent be apportioned to counties according to the following computation: One-half in the ratio which the rural population of the county bears to the total rural population of the state. One-half in the ratio which the total mileage of county and township roads bears to the total mileage of all the county and township roads in the state.
