We, Mrs. Virginia Holm, Secretary of State, Clarence R. Magney, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Theodore Christianson, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Robert V. Rensch, Judge of District Court, Second Judicial District, and D. E. One-half in the ratio which the total mileage of county and township roads bears to the total mileage of all the county and township roads in the state.
