

## City of South St. Paul Police Department Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) Biennial Audit Results Report August 11, 2023

At the request of the City of South St. Paul Police Department (SSPPD), LOGIS has conducted the biennial audit of their Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) Systems pursuant to Minnesota Statute §13.824 Subd. 6.

Minnesota Statute §13.824 data elements include:

- Data Collection, Classification and Use Restrictions
- Destruction of Data
- Sharing Among Law Enforcement Agencies
- Log of Use Required
- Biennial Audit
- Authorization to Access Data
- Notification to the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension (BCA)

After analysis of the statutory requirements and evaluation of the City of South St. Paul Police Department's management and use of Automated License Plate Reader technology, LOGIS has found the City of South St. Paul Police Department in compliance with Minnesota Statute §13.824 based on the following findings:
