STEELE COUNTY ATTORNEY BIENNIAL ADULT PRE-TRIAL DIVERSION REPORT 2021 & 2022

Purpose of Report:

This report is made pursuant to Minnesota Statute §401.065, which requires each county attorney to report biennially to the state court administrator and the legislature on the operations of its mandated pre-trial diversion program.

Pre-Trial Diversion Program:

The Steele County Adult Pre-Trial Diversion program provides eligible defendants with an alternative to confinement and a criminal conviction, reducing the costs and caseload burdens on district courts in the criminal justice system. Additionally, the pre-trial program minimizes the recidivism among diverted defendants, promoting the collection or restitution to the victim of the defendant's crime.

Number of Offenders Participating in the Program during the Reporting Period:

There were 33 referrals in the Pre-Trial Diversion Program in 2021 and 30 referrals in 2022 for a total of 63 referrals within the reporting period.

Evaluation on Program's Effect on Operation of Steele County Criminal Justice System:

The Steele County Attorney's Office together with Steele County Community Corrections created a policy to establish and operate and fair and just diversion program that promotes equal access of participation in the Pre-Trial Diversion Program on July 1, 2017. Since then, the program has offered offenders who meet qualifying criteria to remain out of the criminal justice system while accessing the supports probation has to offer. Victims have also been made whole by the payment of restitution as part of the Diversion agreement. Overall, the program reduced the burden upon the court system, prosecution, and public defenders. Of those who met the criteria, 76% successfully completed Diversion in 2021, and 45% of people who entered the program in 2022 have successfully completed Diversion with 36% still participating in the program.
