



### TWIN CITIES ARMY AMMUNITION PLANT – TCAAP ENVIRONMENTAL BASELINE SURVEY(S) PROJECT SUMMARY

Summary of Environmental Baseline Survey (EBS) conducted by Minnesota Army National Guard and Montgomery Watson Inc. (Consultant) for portions of the Twin Cities Army Ammunition Plant (TCAAP) at Arden Hills, Minnesota.

Professional/ Technical Contract #95255 Effective Dates: August 15, 1996 – December 31, 1999

Authorized Amount: \$211,907.95

**Background:** The Minnesota Army National Guard (MNARNG) requested transfer of accountability for approximately 1500 acres of land at TCAAP. This land is no longer needed by the Army Industrial Operations Command (IOC). MNARNG had been training on 412 acres of this site since 1971. In addition, MNARNG had an Organizational Maintenance Shop at the site.

Some of the land at TCAAP was known to be contaminated. The entire facility is a National Priorities List (NPL) Superfund Site. All areas of concern have been identified, clean-up of soils and groundwater began in the early 1980's, a Record of Decision (ROD) was signed between the responsible parties (Army IOC, Alliant Techsystems) and the regulators (Environmental Protection Agency, Minnesota Pollution Control Agency).

**Purpose of this Study**: Environmental Baseline Surveys are required for property transfers such as this between the IOC and MNARNG. These surveys establish a baseline of information about the condition of the environment at the time of transfer. The parties conduct EBSs to determine the potential for contamination and who might be liable for cleanup if necessary. This investigation process is called due diligence.

This study was conducted to -

- 1. Review the existing record and clean-up results.
- 2. Determine if there were any additional areas of concern for MNARNG.
- 3. Define responsibility for conditions found on the site
- 4. Recommend further actions for MNARNG.

Actions and Reports: This EBS produced a number of actions and reports. They are listed below:

1. Twin Cities Army Ammunition Plant, Contaminated Site Summary for Minnesota Army National Guard, November 12, 1996.

1

This was the first background document providing information to the MNARNG about the specific problems that had been discovered and were being addressed by Army IOC under the Installation Restoration Program.

2. Minnesota Army National Guard, Environmental Baseline Survey, Twin Cities Army Ammunition Plant, Final Report, June 1997.

This report resulted from a review of Installation Restoration Program (IRP) documents, environmental documents, and interviews with key facility personnel.

In addition to the report, a geographic information system (GIS) was created to further display and interpret significant data.

Often EBSs are complete after this first step, however, in this case, data gaps were identified and further work recommended.

3. Final Phase II Environmental Baseline Survey, Minnesota Army National Guard, Twin Cities Army Ammunition Plant, Arden Hills, Minnesota, April 1998.

This report resulted from extensive property inspections and environmental sampling of specific sites that had the potential to be areas of concern. It also included a qualitative evaluation of risk to guardsmen from potential contaminants and exposure routes that may affect human health.

First, site walks and background reviews and interviews were conducted. Then field investigations and sampling were conducted to identify if there were hazardous wastes in farmsteads and other shallow soil areas.

This survey covered the 1280 acres of property presently available for transfer. This land was divided into 16 areas. Site walks were done in each area. Approximately 50 features were examined such as farmstead areas, buildings, areas where buildings had been removed and features where the surface had been disturbed in the past (including a large gravel pit).

Some of these areas were sampled for metals and chemicals that had been found associated with the contamination of other areas in TCAAP.

No contamination was found during this investigative process. However, one feature was located adjacent to a superfund site area of concern at the grenade range. The area of concern was expanded to include this feature and the contaminated soil was removed in 1999.

4. Memorandum-Environmental Concerns and Potential Remedial Costs – Building 535, May 26, 1998.

This memorandum was prepared to examine the potential concerns and costs if this building was to be restored and used for cold storage. After reviewing this information, MNARNG decided not to use the building.

5. Primer Tracer Area Addendum, Phase II Environmental Baseline Survey, Minnesota Army National Guard, Twin Cities Army Ammunition Plant, Arden Hills, Minnesota, Draft - October, 1998; Final – December 1999.

6. Geophysical Investigations at the Twin Cities Army Ammunition Plant, Arden Hills, Minnesota, October 1998.

These two reports were directed at one area called the 535 primer tracer area because the Phase II EBS identified this area as requiring additional survey work. The geophysical investigation report is an appendix to the primer tracer addendum.

Results of these two reports showed no environmental concerns for shallow soils. Two buildings require abatement of lead or asbestos and asbestos lined steam lines and potential explosives in sanitary sewers remain an environmental concern.

The geophysical survey located 28 high and medium response anomalies but no purported burial areas.

The information from these two studies was given to Army IOC. This same area had been previously scored as "medium" by USACHPPM. In response, Army IOC requested FY 2000 funds for further remedial investigations. These investigations will determine if remediation or removal is necessary. MNARNG does not have any plans for invasive construction in this area.

7. Memorandum – Building 576 Evaluation, Twin Cities Army Ammunition Plant, October 22, 1999.

This memorandum included the results of a building 576 walk-through and historical document review. It further used an Army National Guard EBS-SOP to evaluate a draft EBS prepared by Alliant Techsystems.

Building 576 will be vacated by Army IOC and if there is contamination, it will be remediated prior to deeding the building to Ramsey County. The initial walk-through was conducted by the consultant in June, 1999, when it was assumed the MNARNG would become the responsible party for the building.

8. Training Area F Addendum, Phase II Environmental Baseline Survey, December 1999.

The field investigations and report focused on an area called training area F that is designated as a future transfer to MNARNG. It lies within the 1500 acres requested but outside the 1280 acres that encompass the first transfer of accountability.

The investigation concluded that further work might be required before MNARNG can assume training area F is in a satisfactory condition to permit its intended use.

The fieldwork located a small area near the top of the glacial kame adjacent to the reservoir where there was potential metals contamination. This information was passed to Army IOC who subsequently investigated the site and removed the contaminated soil in 1999.

9. Environmental Baseline Survey, Building 576 Parking Area, December 1999.

This report investigated a portion of the Arden Hills MNARNG Organizational Maintenance Shop (OMS) parking lot that will be transferred by Army IOC to Ramsey County in accordance with Congressional authorization. This report was called an exit environmental baseline survey. The report concluded no further investigations were necessary in the parking lot area.

**Conclusion:** In summary, the nine reports comprised the total environmental baseline survey for the anticipated transfer of real property accountability. After the transfer, Army IOC will still be the responsible party in the unlikely event that further significant contamination from past practices is discovered. The MNARNG/National Guard Bureau will be responsible for contamination that might be caused by future training activities.

The land is suitable for military training. A master planning process has been initiated to outline a basic framework for the use of the property that will enhance military readiness and protect the environment.







The project of such significance and magnitude requires constant adjustments to the changing social and economic conditions in the selected corridor. Therefore, despite the Five Years Limitation Statute has interrupted the development of the project at the 95% level of completion, we are convinced that contracting out the Final Design for TH 212 was cost effective and beneficial to the State of Minnesota.

In order to complete the plan set and specifications, Mn/DOT had to provide not only for the remaining 5% of the original contract work but additional resources were also needed to update the project to the most current standards. Therefore, the Agreement No.76823 with the same contractor has been executed.

The Office of Information Resource Management's <u>Implementation Plan for Shared Information</u> <u>Resources</u> project P115, Network Connectivity and Capacity, was charged with identifying, analyzing, and making recommendations for the present and near-term connectivity and capacity of the department's LANs, MAN, and WAN in order to ensure accessible and shareable information resources. Part of this charge was to procure and install appropriate tools to analyze network bandwidth use and thereby establish a base line from which the department could better manage the network infrastructure and from which the department could attempt to forecast future bandwidth needs.

The purpose of this contract was to develop an operating plan and pro-forma business plan for a joint use intermodal rail freight terminal. A study was completed in 1995 to assess the need for additional intermodal terminal capacity in the Twin Cities Area. The Study was funded and prepared under the direction of the Minnesota Intermodal Terminal Study (MIRTS). MIRTS is a public/private partnership of mutual interest made up of representatives from the Burlington Northern Santa Fe (BNSF), CP Rail System (CPRS) the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT), the Metropolitan Council (Council). partnership was expanded to include the Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR).

The Twin Cities Metropolitan Area is presently served by two intermodal terminal facilities. The CPRS operates a facility in Northeast Minneapolis. The BNSF operates a facility in the Midway area of St. Paul. The BNSF facility is approaching the limits of its capacity and options for increasing capacity at the current location are very limited. Approximately 70 percent of the region's intermodal traffic is served by this facility. The CPRS facility has some opportunity to expand and meet its capacity requirements into the year 2012.

The study concluded that intermodal shipping demand will continue to grow steadily. The current 250,000 combined lifts per year at the two terminals is expected to increase in volume at a rate of 5.6 percent per year until the year 2002 and then grow at a reduced rate of 2.8 percent into the year 2012. The total forecast for lifts in 2012 is 530,000. To meet this forecasted demand, the MIRTS group recommended moving forward in a partnership to develop a new multi-user intermodal terminal sufficiently sized and conveniently located to meet terminal capacity needs for the next 20 years with some additional expansion potential. The facility will enable the railroads to expand intermodal service to their international and domestic customers and take advantage of the benefits of a shared This project was contracted out as Mn/DOT did not have facility. the necessary expertise, personnel available to perform a intermodal rail study.

The total cost of this contract was \$75,000

The conduct of this project through an outside contractor was cost effective to the State because the expertise needed for this project would not be normally required by the department and because of the time constraint of the project. Therefore, purchasing this one time service was cost effective and necessary.
