

ACADEMIC LEAGUE



Product Development: Have deployed one product/service for 4 years. Need to quickly develop new products and services to expand impact. Increasing # of current customers are not renewing since do not have need for same service.

Personal Sales: Have improved over time and continue to meet goal. Need to reduce variation among sales force and use less time for sales if new products are to be delivered.

Delivery of Service: Has improved over time. Need to reduce variation and deliver more quickly. Need to develop alternative delivery methods to sustain customer needs within existing budget.

Promotion / advertising: Has been well-used via limited mailings and speeches, booth exhibits, and MAEF newsletters.

Project Management: Good leadership and vision: timelines set and met; budget on target; staff active - results.

IMPACT GOALS:


School culture will value academic achievement

PARTNERS FOR QUALITY: SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT



Product Development: Has improved. Need to quickly develop strategic options for continuing sites. Primary focus to date has been on training. Need to explore best practices and policy/advocacy services.

Personal Sales: Needs improvement in quantity, persistence, and cultivation quickly. Concentrate personnel here and on school board targets. Has not met goal.

Delivery of Service: Has improved. Need to develop and manage a plan especially with clusters and business partners to reduce variation in quality and to reduce time before receiving service.

Promotion / advertising: Most effective at national and specific state levels. Need to focus local outreach on school boards and principals and deploy quickly. Have missed some key targets and generated much paper promotion with little results.

Project Management: Needs improvement in directing action - results and attention to details; budget on target.

IMPACT GOALS:


Education in Minnesota will improve toward world class performance (quality results) which meet the needs of business, industry, next level of education and communities (external customer validation)

PARTNERS FOR QUALITY: STATE AND NATIONAL ADVOCACY



Product Development: Good platform developed - using Baldrige framework to direct policy decisions toward establishing and meeting world class standards for learning and management.

Personal Sales: Adequate, but need to add volunteers and increase efforts January - June, 1994

Promotion / advertising: Adequate

Project Management: Adequate now, but to involve more people, need a tighter process.

IMPACT GOALS:

Education plicy in Minnesota will be directed toward establishing world class standards and a process for attaining these standards.

1. Policymakers will understand and use quality process (Baldrige approach) to make decisions and provide incentives for school improvement
2. Business, government and education groups will work with MAEF to advocate for world class performances.

PERFORMANCES:

Understanding and awareness are increasing at both state and national level, but this will continue to demand time. Four key groups are moving; need to involve more.

PARTNERS FOR QUALITY: NATIONAL CONFERENCE


Project Development: An above average conference program has been developed.

Delivery of Service: Not available at this time

Personal Sales: Need to quickly deploy in January - March in Minnesota. Good results to date.

Promotion / advertising: Good to date; now need an efficient national mail and publication outreach plan for January - March. Underway, but about 3 weeks behind schedule. Hired a national consultant to promote outside of Minnesota.

Project Management: Excellent direction of staff, volunteers, resources - results: timelines met; budget shaky but on target.




IMPACT GOALS:

Establish quality as a strategy for transforming schools toward meeting world class graduation outcomes and for organizing communities to meet the national education goals; establish visibility for MAEF and for Minnesota Partners for Quality Initiative.

PERFORMANCE:

To date, project has resulted in progress toward these goals.

Product Development: No new products/services have been developed. Survey responses indicate need for a clearinghouse/ resource function

Delivery of service: No delivery of service has been deployed. Existing sites were contacted to determine status of current involvement and level of activity.

Personal sales: No contacts have been made. Need a plan for action and action.

Promotion/advertising: Our state-level report has been completed.

Project management: Needs improvement in vision, direction, action --- results. Under budget.

IMPACT GOALS:


Minnesota communities will develop and deploy plans to improve education in their local schools toward meeting the six national education goals.

2. Add # new communities.
3. Add # new volunteers (non-educators)

6. Improve performance at state and local level.

PERFORMANCE:

(None of these activities have been deployed.)

GOVERNOR'S SCHOLAR'S AND ALUMS



Product Development: Strong curriculum in place for Governor's Scholar's program; Alums need to develop a project plan and focus a quickly (overdue) but underway.

Delivery of Service: Summer Institute was above average but over budget. Winter Reunion is behind schedule. Alums have not begun this work.

Personal Sales: Both groups need to improve here. Governor's Scholars performance was below goal last year and will need to improve by February 1994. Sales activity needs a plan and a focus. Alums are behind schedule, but beginning.

Promotion/advertising: Need to initiate for this year's recruitment. Had good coverage of Summer Institute.

Project management: Needs improvement to meet timelines; established plan and use volunteers --- results - over budget.


IMPACT GOALS:




Product Development: In process. Need to establish a bolder format by January

Product Development: Plan out objectives have been established. Need to refine with strategies and approaches and timelines and implement.
 Delivery of Service: Regional efforts to train Academic League members are only activity to date.
 Personal Sales: Need immediate improvement. Only one major contact completed (Channel 5). MAEF is losing market share. Need to cultivate contacts.
 Promotion/Advertising: Need to establish a strategy to reach targeted audience of major media and implement ASAP.


IMPACT GOALS:

MAEF Will become a household word and academic excellence as a concept will be visibly valued.
 1. Regional: use Academic League members to improve linkages. Develop media kits and train members. Develop a speakers bureau to target service clubs.
 2. State: establish schedule of meetings with major media contacts and implement. Recognize good efforts from media.
 3. National: use national conference as vehicle to increase awareness.
 4. Increase # articles and major coverage.
 5. Implement a campaign to reach targeted audiences.

PERFORMANCE:

Baseline survey was completed and needs additional analysis before implementing a media campaign. Behind schedule/objectives - need to focus on cultivating major media contacts. Local/regional efforts underway.

FUND DEVELOPMENT



Product Development : Four campaigns have been developed and are underway: annual fund; endowment; corporations and foundations; and national conference. A fifth campaign targeting small businesses has just begun, and a sixth to target service clubs is only in discussion phase. Resource constraints have limited refinements in most of these activities.

Delivery of Service: Donors have been thanked and recognized and kept informed of MAEF activities.

Personal Sales: Implemented via endowment and corporate campaigns. Need to improve at annual fund level and generate more prospects.

Promotion and Advertising: No activity


IMPACT GOALS:

Improve MAEF's revenue mix and fund ongoing operations.

PERFORMANCE:

Generally on target.

VOLUNTEER DEVELOPMENT



Product Development: Work is underway to establish a system for managing volunteer personnel.

Delivery of Service: Board level volunteers and program partners presently receive best efforts at recruitment, orientation, recognition. Most other groups need better definition.

Personal Sales: Same as above, plus Partners for Quality has some processes in place. Academic League and Governor's Scholars need improvement. MN 2000 has not initiated any activity.

Promotion and Advertising: Same as above.

IMPACT GOALS:

MAEF will become a household word and people involvement will increase.

PERFORMANCE:

No results to date. Public awareness survey indicated about 15% of respondents were familiar with MAEF.


