The State Canvassing Board, consisting of Hon. Julius A. Schmahl, Secretary of State, Hon. Calvin L. Brown, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, Hon. Andrew Holt, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Hon. Hascal R. Brill and Hon.
