The State Canvassing Board, consisting of Julius A. Schmahl, Secretary of State, Hon. Geo. L. Bunn, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Hon. Andrew Holt, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Hon. Hugo Hanft and Hon. Grier M.
