We, Joseph L. Donovan, Secretary of State; Thomas Gallagher, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court; Martin A. Nelson, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court; Rolf Fosseen, Judge of the District Court, Fourth Judicial District; and Archie L. Gingold, Judge of the District Court, Second Judicial District, the legally constituted and acting State Canvassing Board, as required by law, opened and canvassed on September 22, 1964, the certified copies of the statements made by the County Canvassing Boards of the votes cast at the September 8, 1964 Primary Election for United States Senator in Congress, Representatives in Congress, State Officers, Senators and Representatives in the Legislature, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, and Judges of the District Court, and we have specified the names of the persons receiving such votes and the number received by each in the several counties in which they were cast, which statement is as follows. The candidate in each case whose name appears in capital letters having received the highest number of votes, or there being no contest for nomination, is hereby declared to be the nominee:
