We, Joseph L. Donovan, Secretary of State; Martin A. Nelson, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court; Walter F. Rogosheske, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court; Harold W. Schultz, Judge of the District Court, Second Judicial District; and Elmer R. Anderson, Judge of the District Court, Fourth Judicial District, the legally constituted and acting State Canvassing Board, as required by law, opened and canvassed on September 24, 1968, the certified copies of the statements made by the County Canvassing Boards of the votes cast at the September 10, 1968 Primary Election for Public Service Commissioner, Representatives in Congress, Representatives in the Legislature, Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, and Judges of the District Court, and we have specified the names of the persons receiving such votes and the number received by each in the several counties in which they were cast, which statement is as follows.
