We, Julius A. Schmahl, Secretary of State; Calvin L. Brown, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court; Andrew Holt, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court; Fred N. Dickson, Judge of the Second Judicial District, and Horace D. Dickinson, Judge of the Fourth Judicial District, do hereby certify that on this 23rd day of November, 1920, at the Capitol in St. Paul, Minnesota, being duly constituted and convened pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 6, General Statutes of 1913, as the State Canvassing Board, we have duly canvassed the returns of the General Election of 1920, for State Officers, Representatives in Congress from the several Congressional Districts, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court and Judges of the District Courts, report as follows:

Total number of ballots cast and counted..... 797,945
Total number ballots necessary for ratification..... 398,973

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS.

Amendment to Constitution by adding thereto a new article to be known as Article 16, and creating a trunk highway system; authorizing the taxation of motor vehicles to create a fund for the construction and improvement of the same; authorizing the enactment of laws providing for the issuance of bonds of the state, and the payment of the principal and interest of such bonds.

And it appearing that a majority of the voters present and voting at said election have voted for said amendments, it is hereby declared carried.

Amendment to Section seven (7), Article six (6) of the Constitution of the State of Minnesota, providing for extension of term of office of the Probate Judge to four (4) years.
