We, Mike Holm, Secretary of State, Homer Dibell, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, James H. Quinn, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Grier M. Orr, Judge of the District Court, Second Judicial District, and Mathias Baldwin, Judge of the District Court, Fourth Judicial District, the legally constituted and acting State Canvassing Board, as required by law, opened and canvassed on November 25, 1924, the certified copies of the statements made by the County Canvassing Boards of the votes cast at the 1924 General Election, and we prepared therefrom a statement of the whole number of votes cast at said election for and against proposed amendments to the Constitution of the state, for Presidential Electors, for candidates for United States Senator in Congress, for the several state officers, for Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, and for Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, and we have specified the names of the persons receiving such votes and the number received by each, specifying the several counties in which they were cast, and we have also stated therein the number of votes cast for and against the proposed amendments to the Constitution, which said statement is as follows:

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

Amendment to Section 5, of Article 9, of the Constitution authorizing the state to place in the "Trunk Highway Fund" any or all excise taxes levied and collected on the business of selling or dealing in fluids used, or which can be used, for motor vehicle power purposes.

And it appearing that a majority of the voters present and voting upon said amendment at said election have voted yes, said amendment is hereby declared duly adopted.

Amendment to Section 36, of Article 4, of the Constitution relating to changing of the requirements for the publication of proposed amendments to charters of cities and villages within the State of Minnesota.

And it appearing that a majority of the voters present and voting upon said amendment at said election have voted no, said amendment is hereby declared duly lost.

Amendment to the Constitution by adding thereto a new Article to be known as Article 17, authorizing the establishing of a state-owned public terminal grain elevator, the acquisition by the state of a site and for facilities for the construction, maintenance and operation by the state of a public terminal grain elevator and the issuance and sale of bonds of the state therefor.

And it appearing that a majority of the voters present and voting upon said amendment at said election have voted no, said amendment is hereby declared duly lost.

Amendment to the Constitution by adding thereto a new Article to be appropriately numbered in the order of its adoption, authorizing the enactment of laws, encouraging and promoting forestation and reforestation of lands in this state, whether owned by private persons or the public, including irrevocable provisions for definite and limited taxation of such lands during a term of years, and for a yield tax at or after the end of such term, upon the timber and other forest products so grown.

And it appearing that a majority of the voters present and voting upon said amendment at said election have voted no, said amendment is hereby declared duly lost.

Amendment to the Constitution by adding thereto a new Article to be known as Article 17, permitting the state and its political subdivisions, when authorized by the legislature, to contract debts and pledge the public credit for and to engage in any work reasonably tending to prevent or abate forest fires, including the compulsory clearing and improvement of wild lands (whether publicly or privately owned) and the assessment against such lands of the value of all benefits so conferred and the payment of damages so sustained in excess of such benefits.
