We, Mike Holm, Secretary of State, Samuel B. Wilson, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, Royal A. Stone, Justice of the Supreme Court, J. C. Michaels, Judge of the District Court, Second Judicial District, and Frank E. Reed, Judge of the District Court, Fourth Judicial District, the legally constituted and acting State Canvassing Board, as required by law, opened and canvassed on November 23, 1926, the certified copies of the statements made by the County Canvassing Boards of the votes cast at the 1926 General Election; and we prepared therefrom a statement of the whole number of votes cast at said election for and against proposed amendments to the Constitution of the state, for candidates for the several state officers, and for Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, Representatives in Congress, Judges of the District Court, Senators and Representatives in Legislature from such districts as are required by law to be certified to by this Board, and we have specified the names of the persons receiving such votes and the number received by each, specifying the several counties in which they were cast, and we have also stated therein the number of votes cast for and against the proposed amendments to the Constitution, which said statement is as follows:

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

Amendment of Section 2, Article 6, of the Constitution (relating to the supreme court), fixing the number of justices thereof.

And it appearing that a majority of the voters present and voting upon said amendment at said election have voted no, said amendment is hereby declared duly lost.

Amendment to the constitution of Minnesota by adding thereto a new article, to be appropriately numbered in the order of its adoption, authorizing the enactment of laws encouraging and promoting forestation and reforestation of lands in this state, whether owned by private persons or the public, including the fixing in advance of a definite and limited annual tax on such lands for a term of years and a yield tax at or after the end of such term upon the timber and other forest products so grown, but the taxation of mineral deposits shall not be affected by this amendment.
