We, Mike Holm, Secretary of State, Samuel B. Wilson, Justice of the Supreme Court, Clifford L. Hilton, Justice of the Supreme Court, Hugo O. Hanft, Judge of the District Court, Second Judicial District, and Thomas H. Salmon, Judge of the District Court, Fourth Judicial District, the legally constituted and acting State Canvassing Board, as required by law, opened and canvassed on November 18, 1930, the certified copies of the statements made by the County Canvassing Boards of the votes cast at the 1930 General Election, and we prepared therefrom a statement of the whole number of votes cast at said election for and against proposed amendments to the Constitution of the state, for United States Senator in Congress, for the several state officers and for Chief Justice and Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, and we have specified the names of the persons receiving such votes and the number received by each, specifying the several counties in which they were cast, and we have also stated therein the number of votes cast for and against the proposed amendments to the Constitution, which said statement is as follows:

Amendment to Section 3, of Article 10, of the Constitution, authorizing the legislature from time to time to prescribe and limit the liability of stockholders in corporations.
