We, Mike Holm, Secretary of State, Samuel B. Wilson, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, Royal A. Stone, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, John W. Boerner, Judge of the District Court, Second Judicial District, and Frank E. Reed, Judge of the District Court, Fourth Judicial District, the legally constituted and acting State Canvassing Board, as required by law, opened and canvassed on November 22, 1932, the certified copies of the statements made by the County Canvassing Boards of the votes cast at the 1932 General Election, and we prepared therefrom a statement of the whole number of votes cast at said election for and against proposed amendments to the Constitution of the state, for Presidential Electors, for the several State Officers, for Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, and for Representatives in Congress, and we have specified the names of the persons receiving such votes and the number received by each, specifying the several counties in which they were cast, which said statement is as follows:

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

Total Number of Ballots Cast and Counted, 1,054,203. Necessary for ratification, 527,102.

Amendment to Section 1, Article 9, of the Constitution of the State of Minnesota, relating to taxation, to authorize the imposing of taxes on incomes, and on franchises and privileges, including income, franchises and privileges of railroad companies, measured by income, which taxes may be classified, and may be graduated and progressive, and providing for exemptions therefrom, and that such taxes may be in lieu, in whole or in part of other taxes on real or personal property. It shall not be necessary to submit to a vote of the people any law imposing a tax upon the income, franchises or privileges of railroad companies. The legislature may enact any law required to make the taxation of national banking associations conform to the laws of the United States.
