We, Mike Holm, Secretary of State, Andrew Holt, Justice of the Supreme Court, I. M. Olsen, Justice of the Supreme Court, Richard D. O'Brien, Judge of the District Court, Second Judicial District, and Paul W. Guilford, Judge of the District Court, Fourth Judicial District, the legally constituted and acting State Canvassing Board, as required by law, opened and canvassed on November 20, 1934, the certified copies of the statements made by the County Canvassing Boards of the votes cast at the 1934 General Election, and we prepared therefrom a statement of the whole number of votes cast at said election for and against proposed amendments to the Constitution of the state, for United States Senator in Congress, for the several state officers and for Chief Justice and Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, and we have specified the names of the persons receiving such votes and the number received by each, specifying the several counties in which they were cast, which said statement is as follows:

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

Total Number of Ballots Cast and Counted, 1,064,332. Necessary for Ratification, 532,167.

Amendment to Section 1, Article 16, of the Constitution of the State of Minnesota, authorizing the legislature to add new routes to the trunk highway system.
