We, Mike Holm, Secretary of State, Andrew Holt, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Royal A. Stone, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Richard Dillon O'Brien, Judge of the District Court, Second Judicial District, and Frank E. Reed, Judge of the District Court, Fourth Judicial District, the legally constituted and acting STATE CANVASSING BOARD, as required by law, opened and canvassed on November 22, 1938, the certified copies of the statements made by the County Canvassing Boards of the votes cast at the 1938 General Election, and we prepared therefrom a statement of the whole number of votes cast at said election for and against Proposed Amendments to the Constitution of the state, for the several State Officers and Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, and we have specified the names of the persons receiving such votes and the number received by each, specifying the several counties in which they were cast, which said statement is as follows:

Total number of ballots cast and counted, 1,144,926. Number necessary for ratification, 572,464.
