We, Mike Holm, Secretary of State, Henry M. Gallagher, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, Harry H. Peterson, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, John W. Boerner, Judge of the District Court, Second Judicial District, and Arthur W. Selover, Judge of the District Court, Fourth Judicial District, the legally constituted and acting State Canvassing Board, as required by law, opened and canvassed on November 17, 1942, the certified copies of the statements made by the County Canvassing Boards of the votes cast at the 1942 General Election, and we prepared therefrom a statement of the whole number of votes cast at said election for and against the Proposed Amendments to the Constitution of the State, for United States Senator in Congress (for term beginning January 3, 1943 and ending January 3, 1949), for United States Senator in Congress (for term beginning November 3, 1942 and ending January 3, 1943), for the several State Officers and Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, Representatives in Congress, Judges of the District Court, Senators and Representatives in the Legislature from such districts as are required by law to be certified to by this board, and we have specified the names of the persons receiving such votes and the number received by each in the several counties in which they were cast, which statement is as follows:
