We, Mike Holm, Secretary of State, T. O. Streissguth, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Julius J. Olson, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Albin S. Pearson, Judge of District Court, Second Judicial District, and Paul S. Carroll, Judge of District Court, Fourth Judicial District, the legally constituted and acting State Canvassing Board, as required by law, opened and canvassed on November 21, 1944, the certified copies of the statements made by the County Canvassing Boards of the votes cast at the 1944 General Election, and we have prepared therefrom a statement of the whole number of votes cast at said election for and against the Proposed Amendment to the Constitution of the State, for Presidential Electors, for the several State Officers, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, Representatives in Congress, Judges of the District Court, Senator in the Legislature (to fill vacancy in term expiring January 6, 1947), and Representatives in the Legislature from such districts as are required by law to be certified by this Board, and we have specified the persons receiving such votes and the number received by each in the several counties in which they were cast, which statement is as follows:
