We, Mike Holm, Secretary of State, Harry H. Peterson, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, C. R. Magney, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Royden S. Dane, Judge of the District Court, Second Judicial District, and John A. Weeks, Judge of the District Court, Fourth Judicial District, the legally constituted and acting State Canvassing Board, as required by law, opened and canvassed on November 16, 1948, the certified copies of the statements made by the County Canvassing Boards of the votes cast at the November 2, 1948 General Election, and we have prepared therefrom a statement of the whole number of votes cast at said election for and against the Proposed Amendments to the Constitution of the State, for Presidential Electors, for the several State Officers, Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, Representatives in Congress, Judges of the District Court, Senators in the Legislature (to fill vacancies in terms expiring January 2, 1951), and Representatives in the Legislature from such districts as are required by law to be certified by this Board, and we have specified the persons receiving such votes and the number received by each, which statement is as follows:

**CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS**

Total number of ballots cast and counted.....	1,257,804
Necessary for ratification.....	628,903
Total number "War Ballot" — "Federal Office Ballot," cast and counted .....	61

And which total number "War Ballot" — "Federal Office Ballot" cast and counted is not considered in the total number of regular ballots cast and counted for the declarations respecting the following Constitutional Amendments since no Constitutional Amendment Ballot could be included with the "War Ballot" — "Federal Office Ballot" at this election.

First—

Shall the Constitution, Article IX, Sec. 5, be amended so as to provide that the proceeds of the excise tax on petroleum products be apportioned as follows: Of the proceeds of such tax, one-half thereof in Trunk Highway Fund and one-half thereof in State Road and Bridge Fund.

Yes received .....	534,538 votes
No received .....	539,224 votes

And it appearing that a majority of the electors voting at said election have voted no, said amendment is hereby declared lost.

**Second—**

Shall the constitution, Article XIV, Section I, be amended so that two or more alterations or amendments to the constitution may be submitted at one time without requiring that the voters shall vote for or against each separately?

And it appearing that a majority of the electors voting at said election have voted no, said amendment is hereby declared lost.

**Third—**

Shall the constitution, Article XIV, Section 2, be amended so as to permit two-thirds of the members of each branch of the legislature to provide by law for calling a constitutional convention without submitting the question to a vote of the people?

And it appearing that a majority of the electors voting at said election have voted no, said amendment is hereby declared lost.

**Fourth—**

Shall the Constitution of the State of Minnesota be amended by adding thereto a new article authorizing the state at any time to pay an adjusted compensation to persons who have served in the armed forces by the United States during the period from and including September 16, 1940, through December 30, 1946, to levy taxes and appropriate monies for such purpose; to expend monies, contract debts, issue and negotiate bonds or certificates of indebtedness or both, and to pledge the public credit if and whenever authorized and in such amounts and on such terms as may be fixed by the Legislature, and repealing inconsistent provisions of the Constitution?
