We, Joseph L. Donovan, Secretary of State; Roger L. Dell, Chief Judge of the Supreme Court; William P. Murphy, Associate Judge of the Supreme Court; Ronald E. Hachey, Judge of the District Court, Second Judicial District, and Theodore B. Knudson, Judge of the District Court, Fourth Judicial District, the legally constituted and acting State Canvassing Board, as required by law, opened and canvassed on November 18, 1958, the certified copies of the statements made by the County Canvassing Boards of the votes cast at the November 4, 1958 General Election, and we have prepared therefrom a statement of the whole number of votes cast at said election for and against the Proposed Amendments to the Constitution of the State of Minnesota, for United States Senator in Congress, for the several State Officers and for Representatives in Congress, Senators and Representatives in the State Legislature, and Judges of District Court, and we have specified the names of the persons receiving such votes and the number received by each in the several counties in which they were cast which statement is as follows. The candidate in each case whose name appears in capital letters having received the highest number of votes is hereby declared duly elected to that office.

Four Year Term for Constitutional Offices after 1962

Shall the Constitution of the State of Minnesota, Article V, Sections 3 and 5, be amended so as to provide for the election of the governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state, treasurer, and attorney general for four year terms beginning with the general election in 1962?

Authorization for Legislators to Hold Certain Offices

Shall Article IV, Section 9 of the constitution of the State of Minnesota be amended so as to permit a senator or representative to hold certain elective and non-elective offices under authority of the State of Minnesota or the United States?
