We, Joseph L. Donovan, Secretary of State; Frank T. Gallagher, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court; William P. Murphy, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court; Ronald E. Hachey, Judge of the District Court, Second Judicial District, and Paul J. Jaroscak, Judge of the District Court, Fourth Judicial District, the legally constituted and acting State Canvassing Board, as required by law, opened and canvassed on November 22, 1960, the certified copies of the statements made by the County Canvassing Boards of the votes cast at the November 8, 1960 General Election, and we have prepared therefrom a statement of the whole number of votes cast at said election for and against the Proposed Amendments to the Constitution of the State of Minnesota, for Presidential Electors, for United States Senator in Congress, for the several State Officers and for Representatives in Congress, Representatives in the State Legislature, and Judges of District Court, and we have specified the names of the persons receiving such votes and the number received by each in the several counties in which they were cast which statement is as follows. The candidate in each case whose name appears in capital letters having received the highest number of votes is hereby declared duly elected to that office.
