SOUTHWEST MINNESOTA ARTS & HUMANITIES COUNCIL Regions 6E, 6W & 8 REPORT ON FISCAL YEAR 2001

Goals and Objectives

Throughout fiscal year 2001 we continued to meet our biennial goals to increase visibility, increase accessibility and develop local resources through our re-granting programs to individual artists, schools and arts organizations, through press releases and our newsletter, through workshops and through our direct programs. Increased participation in our networking grants and technical assistance workshops facilitated continued education and communication among members of arts organizations in our region. A total of 50 people representing 24 different arts organizations attended our workshops for Nonprofit Arts Organizations that were held in Currie, Spicer and Granite Falls. SMAHC board members and staff participated in the Southwest Minnesota Foundation's Nonprofit Institute. Information from the Institute is being shared with other nonprofit arts organizations in our region.

Site evaluation of SMAHC funded arts activities by grant panelists, board members and staff increased SMAHC visibility throughout the region. Our Children's Author Program provided an opportunity for 5,658 students in grade K-8 at thirty schools to meet and listen to published Minnesota children's authors Barbara Knutson and Bonnie Graves. This program received extensive press coverage in area newspapers.

All SMAHC Grant guidelines and forms are available via e-mail and the response has been very enthusiastic. A portable display unit has been purchased and will travel throughout the region to be set up at area arts events. The display unit will provide information about SMAHC programs with one panel reserved for local arts organizations to allow them to provide information on their local arts activities. Each year we continue to simplify our guidelines and forms to increase accessibility to our programs. SMAHC staff attended conferences on diversity in order to increase understanding and communication with diverse populations in the region. Staff conducts grant-writing workshops throughout the year to assist in making SMAHC programs accessible. All the goals and objectives included in our biennial plan have been addressed or will be addressed in the current biennium. See the attached "FY2001 Highlights" for additional examples of how we have met our goals and objectives.

Monitoring & Evaluation of Grants

All grant recipients are required to submit a final report within 60 days of their project completion. The final report includes financial information and number of people served as well as narrative response to specific questions about the project and examples of how the project was advertised and promoted. Twenty percent of the grant award is withheld until the final report has been received and approved. Every effort is made to evaluate projects on site by board members, panelists and staff.

SMAHC regional artists can receive a stipend of \$500 to help defray internship related expenses.

FY 2001 HIGHLIGHTS

GRANTS TO AREA ORGANIZATIONS AND INDIVIDUALS:

SMAHC provides support to qualified arts projects throughout the region, for both developing and established organizations and artists.

- > \$178,160 matching grants to 105 area organizations and artists under 10 separate programs, including:
- > \$58,266 to 26 arts producing organizations under the matching Production Assistance Program;
- > \$45,730 to 19 arts sponsoring organizations through the matching Sponsorship Assistance Program;
- > \$43,817 to 34 area schools and arts organizations, matching grants for artist residencies and arts related field trips, including 2 ArtBridge Intergenerational Residencies through our McKnight/SMAHC Arts in Education & Communities Program;
- ➤ 4 arts organizations were awarded SMAHC/McKnight Challenge Grants to match new memberships up to a \$500 ceiling, \$2,000 was awarded;
- > 11 area individual artists were granted \$10,400 for projects to further their careers as artists: 2 projects under the Individual Artist Development Program for \$1,500; 5 projects under the Individual Artist Career Program for \$7,500; and 4 Study Grants provided \$1,400 to artists throughout the region;
- > \$12,000 for 3 Local Arts Development Grants was awarded for programming or organizational management projects that will have a long term impact on an organization's stability or development;
- > 7 area organizations received SMAHC Cultural Bank Underwriting Guarantees for projects that seemed too risky to produce otherwise. 2 organizations received a total of \$512 through this program to offset project losses;
- > 1 area organization was awarded a SMAHC Linkage Grant in the amount of \$3,575 for an after-school theater production that promoted school and community cooperation;
- ≥ 3 area organizations received a total of \$360 through Arts Organization Networking Grants for mileage reimbursement for their members to meet with members of other arts organizations or attend workshops.

AWARDS:

Where special recognition is called for, SMAHC acknowledges individuals who help promote the arts throughout the region:

> SMAHC awarded its ninth Prairie Star Award to sculptor Fred Cogelow of Willmar. Cogelow is a self-taught wood sculptor who began carving in 1973 and by late 1978 was carving professionally. He quickly rose to preeminence in North American general woodcarving competition and his works have international recognition. The award includes a \$1,000 prize provided by the McKnight Foundation. Past awardees have been writer Bill Holm, theatre director Bernie Aaker, photographer Henry Kyllingstad, poet Leo Dangel, visual artist Robert Remick, writer Frederick Manfred, visual artist Edward Evans and visual artist Agnes "Bobbie" Alsgaard-Lien.

Rallah Madision of Lismore, Minnesota is this year's recognized arts advocate as the sixth recipient of the SMAHC Prairie Disciple Award for promoting the arts in the SMAHC region. Madison is an active advocate for the arts at the local, regional and State level. He is perhaps best known for his encouragement and support of aspiring southwest Minnesota artists. Madison currently serves on the Board of Directors of the Minnesota Citizens for the Arts, the statewide arts advocacy organization. Madison has served as President of the SMAHC Board of Directors and the Nobles County Art Center Board and participated in the Americans for the Arts National Conference in Minneapolis. Previous award winners are Mercein Holzemer, Benjamin Vander Kooi, Jr., Christine (Tina) Richards, Vern Stevens and Patricia Enger. The award includes a \$500 certificate toward the purchase of art by a regional artist.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS:

SMAHC also provides some direct programs as well as offering technical assistance:

- > SMAHC Children's Author Program had 36 presentations in 30 area elementary schools and 3 public libraries. Author/Illustrator Barbara Knutson of St. Paul and Author Bonnie Graves of Bloomington were the touring authors. The program was extremely successful.
- > SMAHC provided local Technical Assistance to area arts, community and education groups through the entire eighteen counties, helping to augment their own ability to provide arts-related services. We provided on-site work with the Pipestone Artists Group, Pipestone; Marshall Area Fine Arts Council, Marshall; and the Coalition of The Arts, Marshall. Many more artists and arts organizations were provided with technical assistance at the SMAHC office and via the SMAHC toll free telephone line.
- > SMAHC cosponsored with the Marshall Area Fine Arts Council a reception for Patty (Bratnobe Saunders at the Marshall Art Center. Patty Saunders is one of the founders of SMAHC and its predecessor, SWAFA.

CONFERENCING:

SMAHC provides leadership for arts developers throughout the region through conferences and workshops. In addition, the **SMAHC** Annual Meeting is an important method for spreading information about our communities for both the board and members.

- > SMAHC held three Workshops for Nonprofit Arts Organizations. The topics presented were: Audience Development and Marketing; How to Incorporate; What is an "NPO?"; Board Development, Recruitment and Retention; and Grassroots Fundraising. The workshops were held at three locations—Slayton, Spicer and Granite Falls. Fifty people attended the conferences, representing 24 organizations. Funding for these workshops was provided by the McKnight Foundation. The featured speaker was Joan Wells of Resources & Counseling for the Arts.
- > SMAHC held its Twenty-sixth Annual Meeting in Ortonville, which included tours of several area art galleries and studios. The meeting and banquet were held at the Mallard Point Lodge in Ortonville. A variety show and barn dance followed the meeting. Local musicians and participants in the Big Stone Arts Council's Intergenerational ArtBridge project performed. The Barn Dance was cosponsored by the Big Stone Arts Council, RCAP/Blandin Community Development and SMAHC.

INFORMATION:

SMAHC promotes the arts by making information available and accessible to artists, organizations and art supporters in southwest Minnesota. Last year SMAHC:

- > mailed out over 35,400 copies of our monthly newsletter *VOICES*, which provides listings of events within the 18-county SMAHC region along with statewide opportunities for area artists and also features articles of interest to artists and supporters of the arts;
- provided a toll-free number (1-800-622-5284), fax (507-537-0040), and greatly increased the use of email as a means for sending out grant applications (smahc@starpoint.net).
- > gave radio and newspaper interviews, frequent press releases, and directly provided opportunity information to groups and individual artists during the year;
- > held grant writing workshops at several locations in the SMAHC region.

FUNDRAISING:

SMAHC fundraising is used to extend **SMAHC** programs and to provide matching funds for foundation grants.

- Received \$33,833 in membership support from 450 corporate, business, organization, government and individual members. In addition, SMAHC staff and board members presented testimony to three county commissions (Lyon, Pipestone, Rock) and contributions were received from all 18 counties and from 47 cities.
- Received \$47,000 from the McKnight Foundation
- Received \$259,195 from the State of Minnesota

NETWORKING:

Like information, the connections that members, board members and staff develop with other organizations have far reaching results.

- > SMAHC Executive Director served as a board member of the Forum of Regional Arts Councils of Minnesota (FRACM), a statewide organization whose mission is to secure resources, address common issues, and provide mutual support among regional arts councils in order to promote the arts in Minnesota.
- > SMAHC maintained partnership with the Minnesota Alliance of Arts Education, the Minnesota Citizens for the Arts, the Minnesota Council for Non-profits, VSA Minnesota and the Minnesota State Arts Board.

SMAHC Executive Director served as a board member of the Minnesota Citizens for the Arts.

SMAHC worked with the **Minnesota State Arts Board** to promote arts activities in the SMAHC region.

> 11 SMAHC region citizens attended Arts Advocacy Day at the State Legislature. Board members and staff gathered area information on the status of arts in southwestern Minnesota to provide to the State Legislature.

- > SMAHC Executive Director and Board President-Elect spoke at the Prairie Arts Center Fundraiser in Madison and presented the Prairie Disciple Award to Mercein Holzemer of Madison.
- > SMAHC Executive Director attended the national Grant Makers in the Arts Conference in Minneapolis.
- > SMAHC Executive Director met with representatives of the Marshall Area Fine Arts Councils.
- > SMAHC Executive Director attended MN State Arts Board Constituency Hearing in Ortonville and provided information on SMAHC programs.
- > SMAHC Executive Director attended Effective Performance Appraisals Seminar, Marshall
- > SMAHC Executive Director conducted grant writing workshop at Gallery on Main, Pipestone
- > SMAHC Executive Director presented information on SMAHC programs at MN State Arts Board Folk Arts Program information meeting in Marshall.
- > SMAHC Executive Director spoke at Milan Village Arts School Celebration, Milan
- > SMAHC staff attended several meetings of the Coalition of Arts Groups in Marshall.
- > SMAHC Executive Director was a guest speaker at a Community Education Advisory Councils Meeting in Granite Falls.
- > SMAHC Executive Director & Administrative Assistant attended the *Cultivating Rural Arts* meeting, hosted by the Land Stewardship Project, held in Montevideo.
- > SMAHC Executive Director attended the House Tax Committee Hearing in Marshall.
- > SMAHC Executive Director participated in a Community Circle Meeting in Marshall.
- > SMAHC Board members, Executive Director, Administrative Assistant and two SMAHC board members attended the Southwest Minnesota Foundation Nonprofit Management Institute held at Morton.
- > SMAHC Executive Director was the guest speaker at a Music Management/Public Relations class at Southwest State University in Marshall.
- > SMAHC Board members and panelists are actively involved in various local statewide and national arts associations and organizations.
- > SMAHC Executive Director attended the Minnesota Presenters Network Conference in Winona.

With an eighteen member volunteer board meeting monthly, a staff of two full-time and two part-time employees, numerous committees, two review panels comprised of twenty-seven volunteers, and the interest and involvement of 161 communities and countless volunteer hours, SMAHC is actively meeting the challenges of a growing and changing arts community in southwest Minnesota.
