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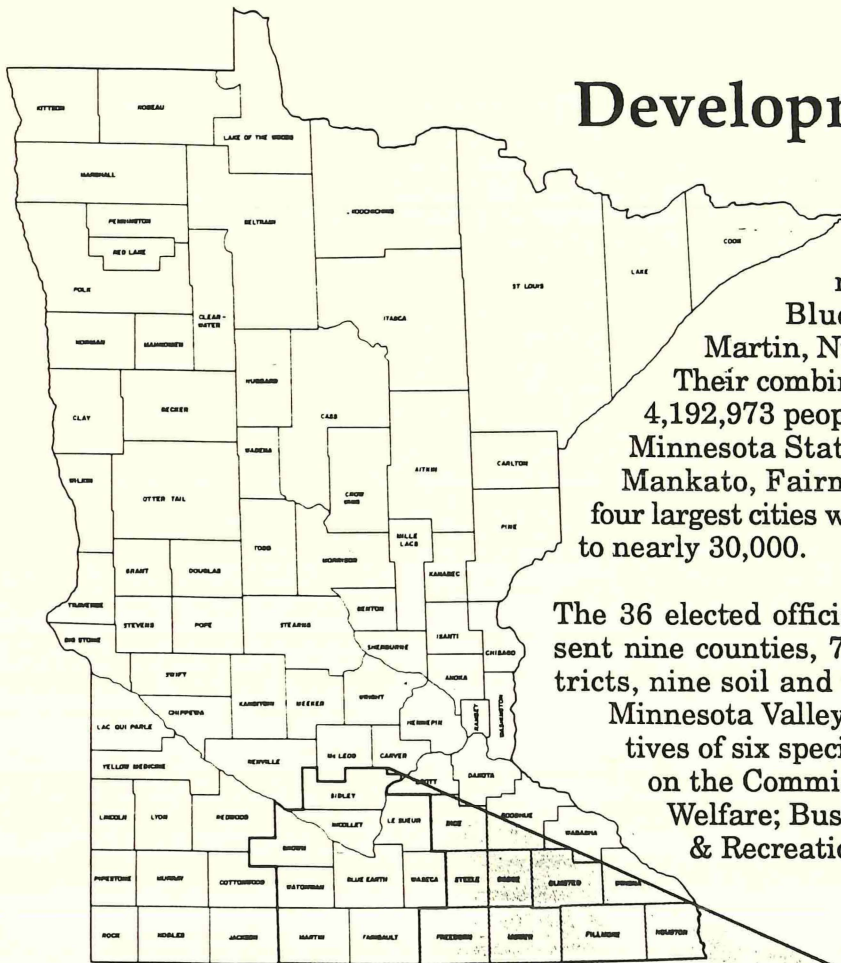
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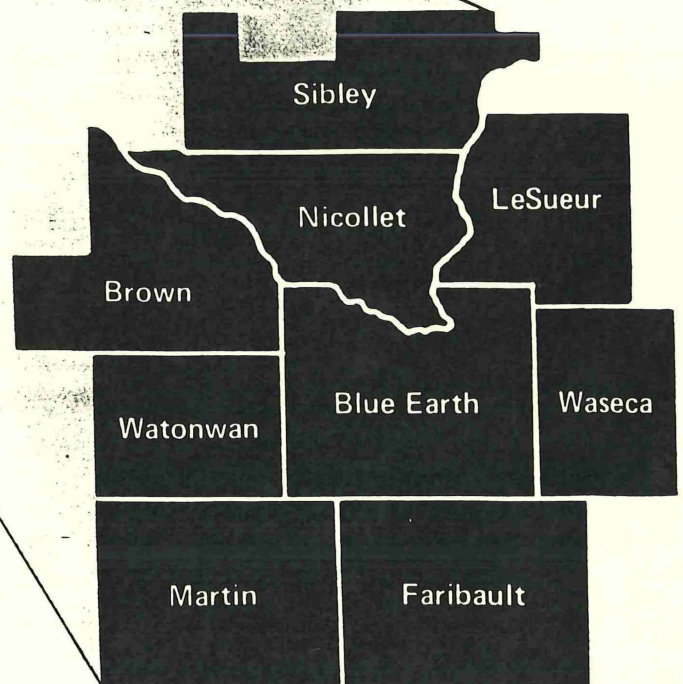
Region Nine Development Commission



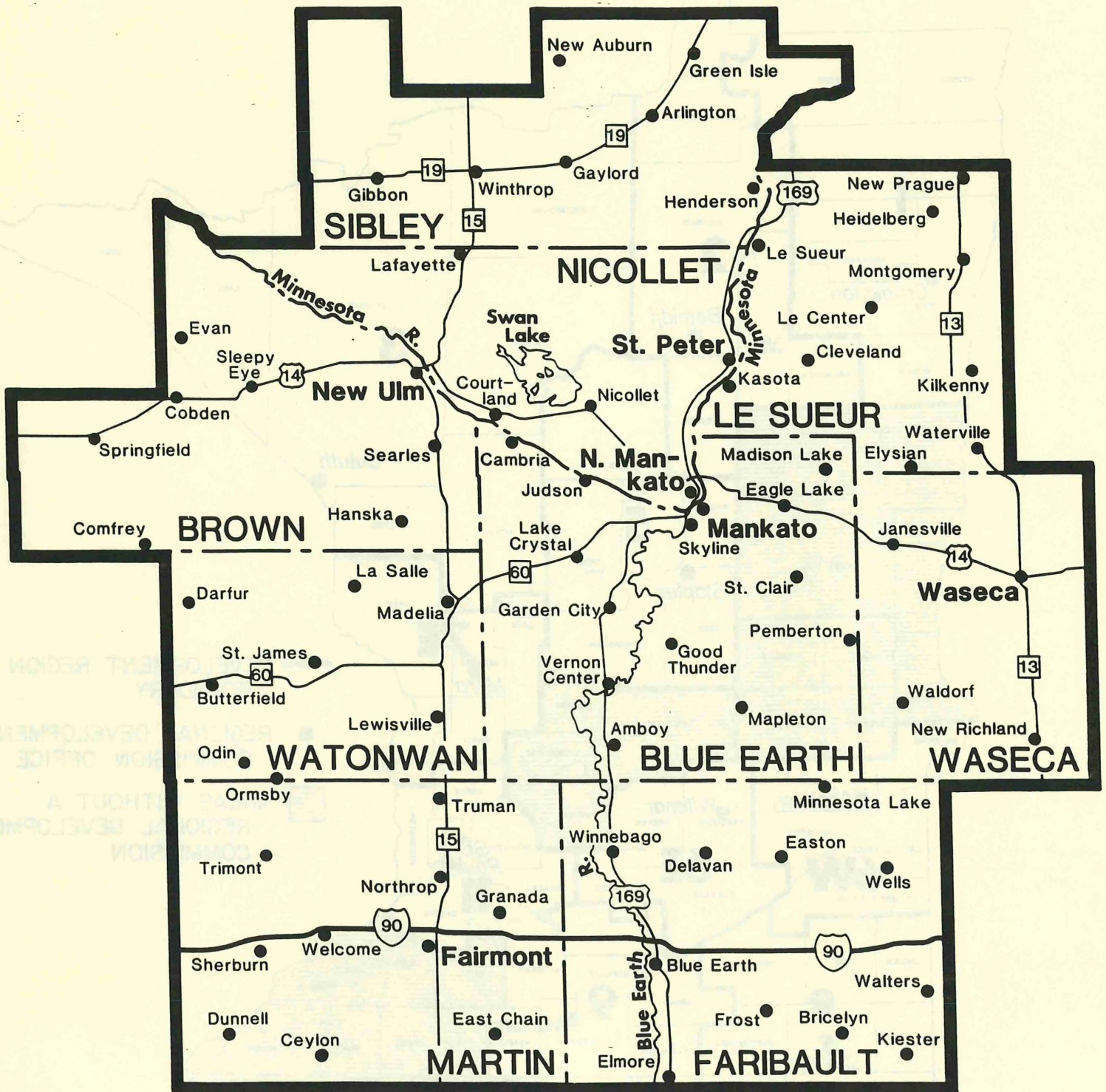
The Region Nine area is comprised of nine south-central Minnesota counties: Blue Earth, Brown, Faribault, LeSueur, Martin, Nicollet, Sibley, Waseca, and Watonwan. Their combined population is 220,914 of the state's 4,192,973 people, according to estimates made by the Minnesota State Planning Agency in 1985-86. North Mankato, Fairmont, New Ulm, and Mankato are the four largest cities with populations respectively from 10,000 to nearly 30,000.

The 36 elected officials serving on the Commission represent nine counties, 72 cities, 147 townships, 45 school districts, nine soil and water conservation districts, and the Minnesota Valley Council of Governments. Representatives of six special interest groups are also represented on the Commission. They include: Health & Human Welfare; Business & Industry; Agriculture; Tourism & Recreation; and Crime Prevention.

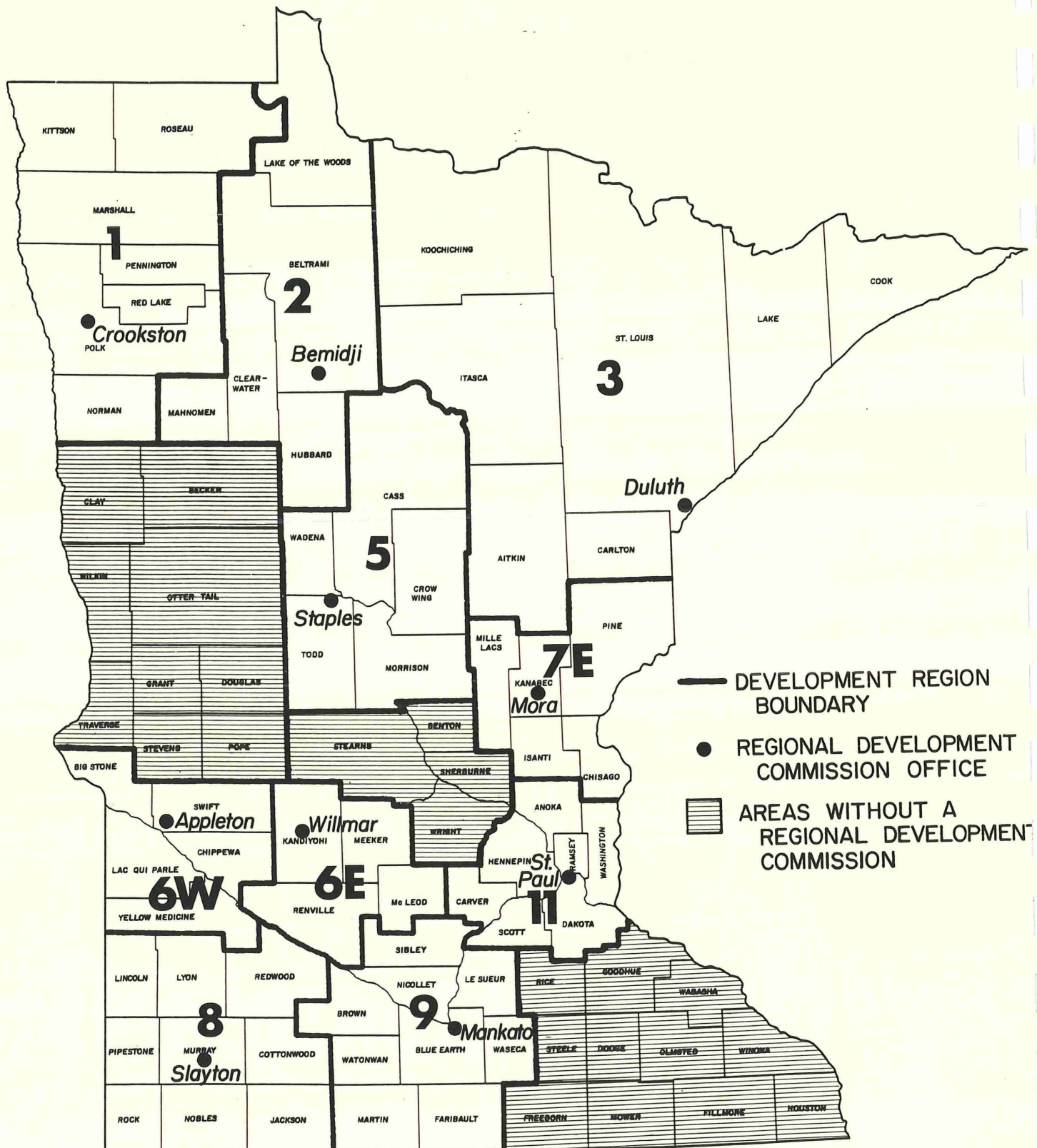
The Commission, authorized by the Regional Development Act of 1969, was organized by local officials in 1972 "to facilitate intergovernmental cooperation and to insure the orderly and harmonious coordination of state, federal and local comprehensive planning and development programs for the solution of economic, social, physical and governmental problems of the state and its citizens." (*Minnesota Statutes, Section 462.383; Subdivision 2.*)

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

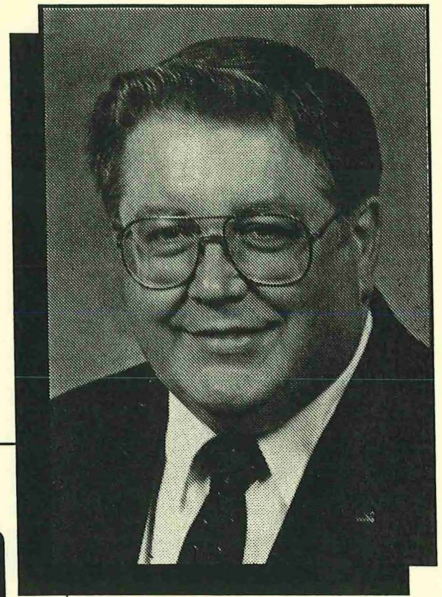

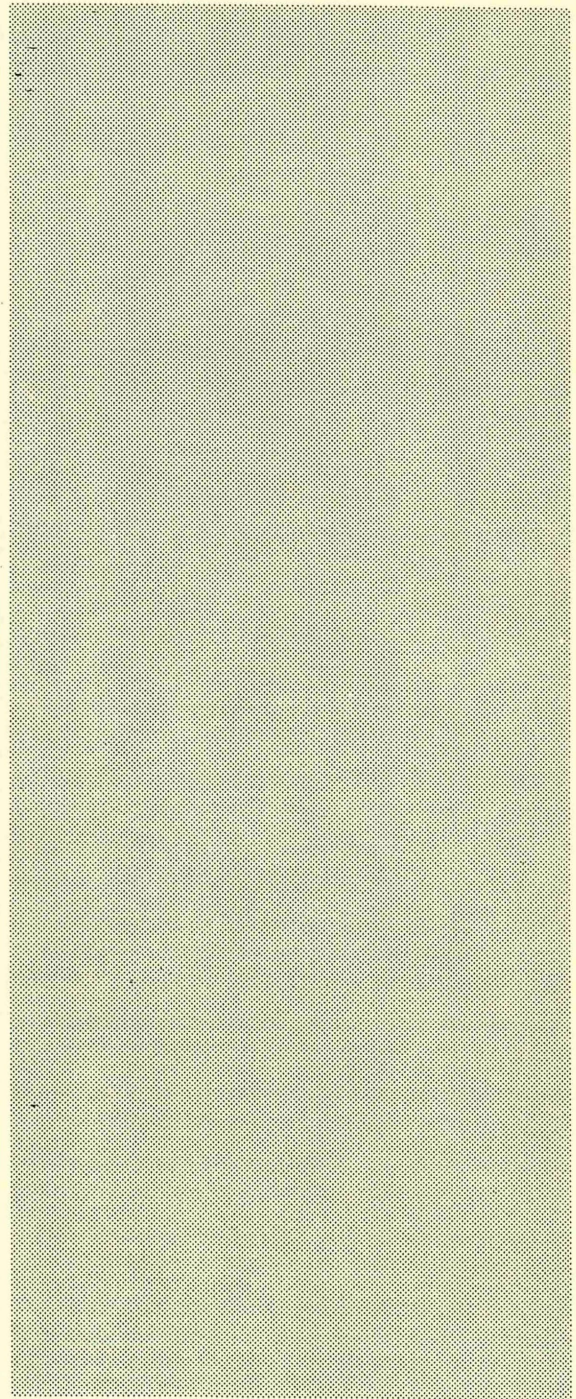

These services ranged from local financing for a project to working with local government to prepare a plan, study or ordinance. The goal was to help our local units of government identify the problem and develop viable solutions to it. Only with viable, attractive communities can the region hope to grow and prosper.

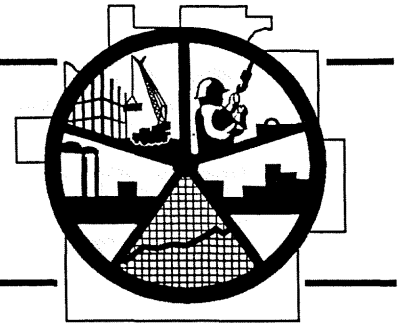

Program Objectives:

- The primary objectives of the Region Nine Economic Development program are to stabilize and increase the number of jobs and income within the Region. Four primary means were used to accomplish this mission:
 - **Assistance to Businesses** - Through the Small Business Administration, State/Federal funding programs, Initiative Fund and other programs, Region Nine staff helped match projects with available low interest, long term loans. The staff also prepared the application forms for businesses. Region Nine staff also referred businesses to other agencies, which can serve their specific needs.
 - **Assistance to Communities** - At times a barrier to economic development is lack of sewer or water capacity, streets or industrial land. The Region Nine staff can assist with state and federal grant/loans to put those facilities into place.
 - **Community Education** - At times communities are interested in establishing an economic development program but don't know how to get started. The Region Nine staff assists communities assess their situation and take positive steps to improve their local economy.
 - **Areawide Cooperation** - The lagging economy is an areawide problem calling for cooperation of many communities and organizations. Region Nine works closely with all state, regional and local agencies involved with economic development. The goal is always to assist communities through the best means possible.

Major Thrusts:

- **Economic Development Administration**

In 1989, the Region Nine Development Commission became a designated District by the federal Economic Development Administration (EDA). This designation was based on the completion of the Overall Economic Development Plan for the region and a lengthy application review process.

As a result of the District designation, five counties (Faribault, LeSueur, Martin, Sibley and Watonwan) became eligible for an areawide revolving loan fund (RLF). That \$600,000 RLF proposal has been submitted to EDA and has received favorable review by all EDA observations. Final approval is expected in the fall of 1989. The fund will be extremely useful for business expansion and start-up in these five counties.

In addition, LeSueur, Martin, Sibley and Waseca counties are eligible for EDA grants of up to 50% for public facilities – sewer, water and streets – to serve industrial land. To

date, three projects in Gaylord, Fairmont and Winthrop using EDA public works grants have been funded.

Because District designation has been achieved, Region Nine is eligible for planning grant assistance from EDA. If this funding is obtained, the region will have an additional annual source of revenue to finance economic development efforts within the region.

- Minnesota Marketplace

A second major thrust for 1989 was the initiation of the Minnesota Marketplace Program within the region.

Minnesota Marketplace is an innovative program which seeks to find local suppliers for businesses which are currently purchasing goods and services from outside Minnesota. Trained, dedicated field brokers are used to work with companies to identify products that can be purchased locally, prepare specifications for those products, and distribute the specifications to local suppliers. Based on bids received, the buying company may select a local supplier for that product. The buying company saves on the initial cost, transportation, communications and other expenses. The selling company increases its sales and the area benefits by keeping dollars within the region. As brokers visit area businesses, they may well discover other ways to assist those businesses.

Through a grant from the statewide Minnesota Marketplace, Inc. and the Southeastern Minnesota Initiative Fund, Region Nine was able to hire a field broker to work out of its Mankato office. In addition, Region Nine is contracting with Southeastern Minnesota Development Corporation to provide broker services in extreme southeast Minnesota.

This program is new and innovative, but based on pilot projects in northern Minnesota and other states, the project will be highly successful. The goal of the program is self sufficiency through commissions generated from selling companies.

- Submitted federal Revolving Loan Fund grant application for Sibley, Martin, LeSueur, Watonwan, and Martin counties.
- Prepared application for EDA/SCDG grant for Crystal Foods expansion in Gaylord.
- Prepared HUD/UDAG application and EDA application for Crystal Foods expansion in Gibbon.

- Provided technical assistance to Springfield, St. Peter, Winthrop, Janesville, Gibbon, Montgomery, Winnebago, Sherburn, LeCenter, New Richland, and other communities on a variety of economic development matters.
- Completed a 20 county directory of manufacturers, suppliers, and wholesalers.
- Spoke at numerous economic development workshops and seminars.

- The transportation program is aimed at maintaining and improving the transportation network in Region including highways, railroads, and mass transit. By contractual agreement, the Region Nine Development Commission (RNDC) serves as the substate planning agency for the Minnesota Department of Transportation (Mn/DOT).
- A sound transportation system does not stop at municipal or county boundaries. It is important therefore to coordinate transportation efforts on a regional basis.
- During the 1988 Legislative session, the RNDC was involved in educating the public and legislators on the need for increased highway funding for rural areas.

Fiscal Year 1989 Projects:

- Region Nine Highway Improvement needs and funding priorities.
- Special assistance on township road planning.
- Coordination and assistance with state/transit funding to local operators.
- Assistance with railroad abandonment and rail rehabilitation projects.
- Assistance to the City of New Ulm on its transit program.
- Assistance to the City of St. Peter on its transit program.
- Grant writing for transit and other transportation projects.
- Coordination with local government and Mn/DOT regarding the special problems that exist with low priority roads.
- Provided Mn/DOT with input on the Market Artery System.
- Intergovernmental review of state and local projects.
- Membership on the 16(b)(2) state transit grant application review committee.
- Coordination between legislators and their needs in communicating with local/regional groups (press conferences, hearings, etc.).
- Provided assistance to the Minnesota Transportation Study Board.

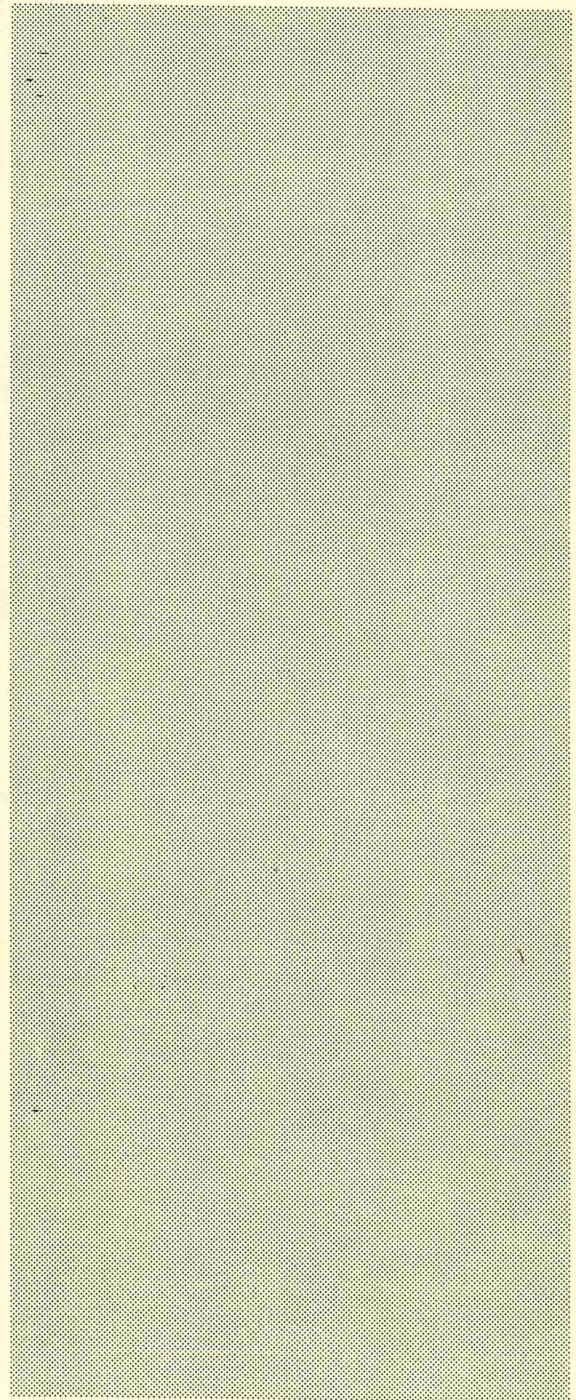

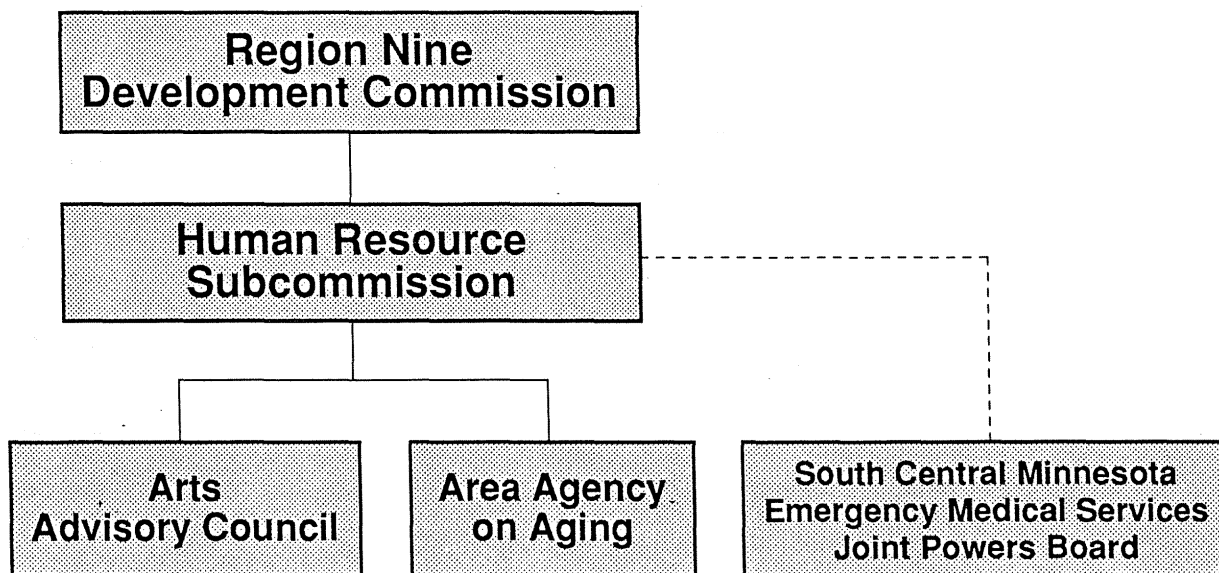

Program Objectives:

- Persons involved with the Region Nine Area Agency on Aging, whether as its staff, volunteers, or professional service providers, work to establish a strong leadership role as an advocate for the dignity, rights, and status of older people. They want to assure access to a number of services supporting wellness, independent living, long-term and acute care.
- The variety of activities the Agency is involved in allows for the coordination of services to older people. As an example, one of its objectives was to effectively encourage public and private services/resources that would improve the system of family and informal caregivers.

Fiscal Year 1989 Projects:

- Advocated for the needs of older people and their service providers through state and federal legislative hearings.
- Provided training opportunities for service providers.
- Obtained grant of \$26,302 from the Southeastern MN Initiative Fund for implementation of the Senior Leadership Development Program.
- Provided ongoing assistance to the Martin County Elder Services Network and began working with Faribault County to begin a similar group.
- Awarded 9 supportive services grants in which 6,882 persons are expected to be served.

- Sponsored focus group for clergy and lay leaders in LeSueur County to discuss needs of older persons and identify ways in which the informal church networks and formal networks can work together to address these needs.
- Assisted in developing marketing and public relations plans for agencies providing services to older people.
- Continued in its advocacy/grants management role with the Minnesota Valley Action Council Senior Nutrition and Home Delivered Meals programs.

What is the Area Agency on Aging?

An Area Agency on Aging is an agency designated to develop a coordinated system for delivering needed services to older persons in a specific geographic area. An Area Agency on Aging receives funds from the federal Older Americans Act to carry out this responsibility.

What agency serves as the Area Agency on Aging for southcentral Minnesota?

The Region Nine Development Commission (RNDC) was designated as the Area Agency on Aging for southcentral Minnesota by the Minnesota Board on Aging in 1976. The area served by RNDC includes Blue Earth, Brown, Faribault, LeSueur, Martin, Nicollet, Sibley, Waseca and Watonwan Counties.

What are the specific responsibilities of an Area Agency on Aging?

Area Agencies on Aging have a major responsibility for granting Older Americans Act funds to organizations, agencies and units of government that will provide social services and nutrition services to the elderly. They are also responsible for monitoring these organizations, to ensure that Older Americans Act funds are spent in an effective and efficient manner. In addition, Area Agencies serve as a focal point for the concerns of older persons in their region.

Other specific responsibilities of an Area Agency are as follows:

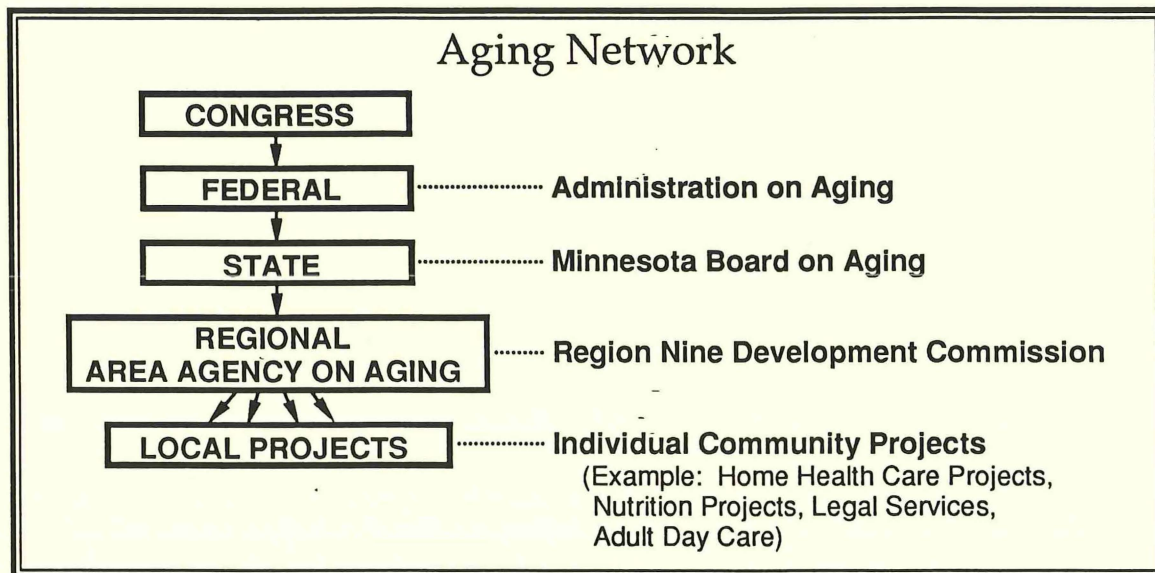
1. Assessment of older persons' needs in the community.
2. Identification of deficiencies in services available for the elderly.
3. Identification of solutions to meet the needs and fill gaps in the service delivery system.
4. Interaction with public and private agencies to ensure coordination of services offered for the elderly.
5. Advocate to introduce change in stereotypes, legislation and agency policies which impact negatively on the elderly.
6. Development of an Area Plan on Aging that identifies and prioritizes needs of older persons in its service area.
7. Disseminate information on aging throughout the area.

What is the Older Americans Act?

The Older Americans Act was first passed by Congress in 1965 to provide funds to states to set up a variety of programs to meet the needs of older persons. The Act also created a specific federal office to address concerns of the elderly. This office is called the Administration on Aging.

What is the "Aging Network"?

This is a term used to describe the various units of government and organizations involved in providing services to senior citizens. The following graphic display demonstrates how funds from the Older Americans Act are channeled from Congress through the Aging Network to local community programs.



What is the RNDC Advisory Council on Aging?

The Region Nine Advisory Council on Aging is comprised of representation from persons over 60 (50%), private, non-profit and public agencies, and county social service/public health nursing agencies. The Council meets monthly and has responsibilities in areas such as developing the region's plan on aging, advising the Region Nine Development Commission on aging issues, development of regional goals and priorities on aging and allocation of the Older Americans Act.

What types of projects for older adults can be funded by RNDC as the Area Agency on Aging and who can receive grants?

Grants can be made to local units of government or private non-profit organizations for the following types of services:

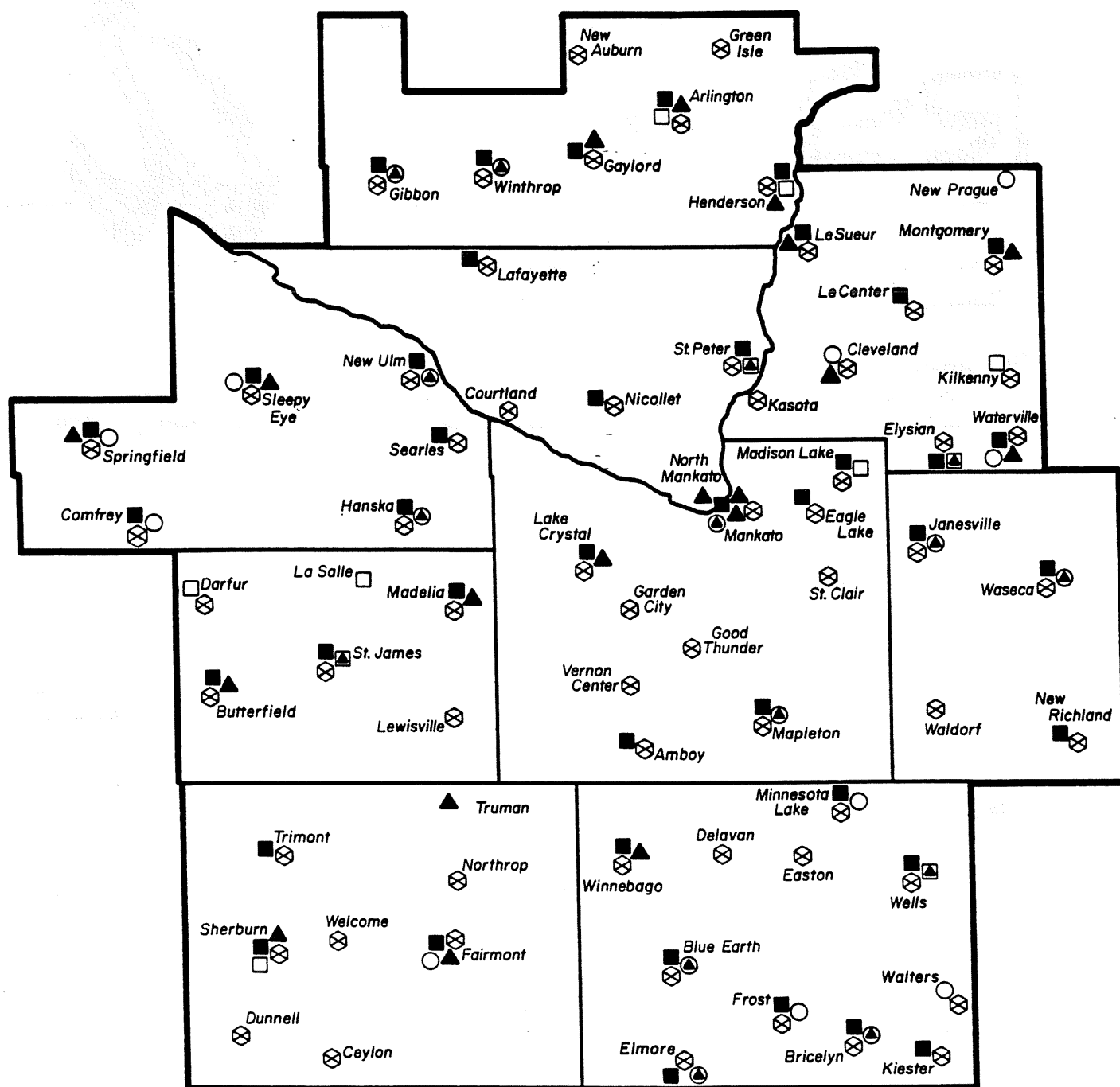

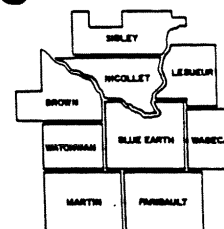

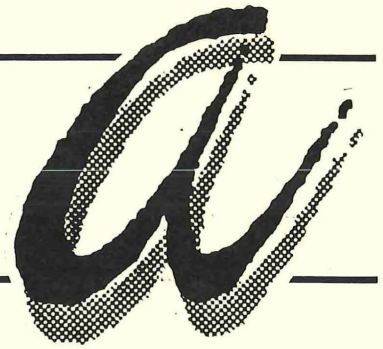

- The Region Nine-arts program is designed to promote the arts in the nine-county area through funding for artistic growth opportunities, organizational development, public exposure, and quality arts experiences.
