

AFFIDAVIT OF JULIE HANSON

Julie Hanson, hereby affirms and certifies, under the penalty of perjury, the following:

1. I am the Elections Administrator for Scott County ("County"). I am making this Affidavit based on my personal knowledge. If called to do so, I could and would testify to the matters herein.
2. In my capacity as Elections Administrator, I am the local election official responsible for duties relating to Scott County's elections, including state and federal elections.
3. While carrying out my election duties, I identified a discrepancy in the count of ballots, in which there were 20 more absentee ballot records than ballots counted in the Shakopee P-10 precinct from the City of Shakopee.
4. From the initial receipt of Shakopee P-10 precinct's ballots through the time in which the absentee ballots in dispute were identified as missing, the County was in possession of the 20 absentee ballot envelopes.
5. I organized and conducted multiple search attempts with County and City staff to locate the 20 absentee ballots.
6. After exhausting all attempts to locate the missing 20 absentee ballots, the County determined the 20 absentee ballots have been lost and cannot be found.
7. Upon investigating the ballot count discrepancy, the County determined the missing 20 absentee ballots were validly cast by Minnesota residents entitled to vote in the general



election for House District 54A.

8. The missing 20 absentee ballots were not counted, in the original count nor the recount, and were not included in any reported vote totals for the House District 54A election.


During the post-election audit of election returns, Scott County staff discovered that the City of Shakopee did not return the number of ballots that would match the Statewide Voter Registration System (SVRS) count for voters checked in. After reviewing the situation further, Scott County has come to the conclusion that the ballots were likely disposed of while they were in their secrecy envelopes, after being removed from their signature envelopes but before being tabulated.

The City of Shakopee held early voting at its City Hall from September 20, 2024 through November 4, 2024. Early voting from September 20 through October 17 was by "envelope voting," in which an individual could complete their absentee ballot, place it in a security envelope, put that inside a signature envelope, and leave the completed packet with the City as if it had been mailed in. On the night of October 17, 2024, Absentee Ballot Boards were allowed to start opening absentee envelope ballots and scanning them through tabulators. On October 18, individuals who were voting early switched from envelope voting to "direct ballot voting," in which their absentee ballots were immediately scanned through the tabulators.

On election day, after the polls closed, Scott County noted that the City of Shakopee was slow to report their final results. At 10:50 PM, Shakopee reported that it had 6,300 absentee ballots still in process; at 11:25 PM, the City reported they had only gotten through 2,400 of those ballots with two tabulators running. Scott County advised Shakopee to stop tabulating and the remaining ballots could be run through the County's high speed tabulator. At around 12:20 AM on Wednesday, November 6, the County and City put the remaining ballots through the County's tabulator. Upon completing that work, City staff confirmed that the total of the scanned ballots matched the amount of ballots that they should have reported. This was later found to be incorrect.

While conducting normal auditing activities on Thursday, November 7, County staff found that there was a problem with Shakopee returns in that there was a 21-ballot discrepancy between two precincts (with more absentee voters recorded than ballots received). The issues were noted to be 20 ballot records for Precinct 10 ("P10") and one for Precinct 12A. Based on experience, staff noted that it is not uncommon for one voter to check in and not vote, so the discrepancy in Precinct 12A was not pursued; the focus was on P10.

For P10, Shakopee reported processing 329 voters but reported results for 309 ballots; in addition, their transfer case held 309 ballots. The ballots for Shakopee Precinct 10 were counted at least four times with the total number equaling 309 – while 329 people were checked in.



County staff worked to eliminate various possibilities for the discrepancy. It was felt that this was unlikely to be voters changing their mind and not voting due to the number of voters in one precinct. Staff counted signature envelopes and verified the number matched the number of voters on the SVRS reports (87 in all for P10). Applications for absentee ballots were also counted and matched to the signature envelopes, and again, all were accounted for. County staff then checked a spreadsheet report that was provided by City staff tracking absentee ballots submitted in Shakopee. The report was found to reflect a 21-ballot discrepancy between October 17 to October 18 when the sheets were reflecting ballots received and machine counts of ballots tabulated. Specifically, the running balance of absentee ballots accepted, when added to the first day number of direct voters, did not total the number of ballots reflected on the tabulator counter; the machine was 21 ballots short.

Staff considered if Health Care Facility (HCF) voting -- a common area for mismatches due to residents deciding not to vote -- could have been an issue, but after learning the dates that the City performed HCF voting and checking the envelopes, this theory was eliminated (as voting took place after the dates that were determined to be an issue). County staff next ran reports for just P10, matching them against when the City's Absentee Ballot Board was held. It was found that 20 P10 ballots were accepted by the Ballot Board on October 17 covering the voting period of October 15-17 (the last three days of envelope voting). The County was unable to recheck the City's secrecy envelopes for the missing ballots as they had not been returned with the City's election materials.

A request was made to the City for their secrecy envelopes, and the County was advised they had been thrown into the garbage. The County tracked the trash and recycling to a landfill in Burnsville and DemCon respectively, but learned that the recycle bale had already been sent for shredding.

Absentee ballot boards are established by each governing body. The members are charged with following the process to accept or reject ballots that have been voted via the envelope method. Following the procedures, two or more members of the board examine each signature envelope, mark "accepted" or "rejected," and record into the Statewide Voter Registration System. Based upon the acceptance records and the matching of the envelopes and applications, this part of the process was completed.

At the close of business on the 19th day before the election (in this case, October 17), the envelopes can start being opened. Prior to opening, voting envelopes must be divided by precinct, and each precinct has to be balanced by counting of the physical envelopes vs. the accepted number in SVRS. Once the envelopes are balanced, they are opened by precinct, opening all signature envelopes, and setting them to the side while secrecy envelopes are placed in another pile, thereby ensuring voter privacy. Once all of the signature envelopes and secrecy envelopes are opened, the ballots can be removed from the secrecy envelopes. The ballots are then reviewed, duplicated as needed, initialed, and prepared for tabulation. Although investigation is continuing, the County has been unable to verify that the missing ballots were ever removed from their secrecy envelopes.


Although the investigation is not complete and remains ongoing, County staff has made the following preliminary conclusions based upon the facts that there were 20 accepted ballots for P10 on October 17 (exactly matching the discrepancy for that precinct), and the tabulator numbers showed a discrepancy as of October 18 (the first day ballots would have been scanned and that the secrecy envelopes were disposed of):

- That 20 absentee ballots in P10 were properly accepted for counting on October 17

and should have been counted;


- That these ballots are the ballots that were not counted;
- That the ballots were most likely were never removed from their secrecy envelopes;
- That the ballots were likely in their secrecy envelopes when the secrecy envelopes were thrown away;
- That the ballots most likely will not be recovered; and
- That even if 20 ballots were found, it is unlikely that their chain of custody can be proven to assure they have not been tampered with.



Steps leading up to when Absentee starts through Election Day

Check for Application Completeness

Mandatory Fields for Application:

1. Name

1. Search for the Voter Record. Make multiple attempts to find the voter. Best way to search is by MN Driver's License or State Issued ID but make multiple attempts to find the voter before processing a non-registered application. ALWAYS search a Voter 3 times before adding NEW AB.
2. If a voter record shows up under "Voter Record Search results," click on the blue box in front of the name (will highlight the line yellow) and click "Direct Balloting-Registered." If the voter does not show up (and you have searched 3 ways,) click "Direct Balloting- New." **REPORTS WILL BE WRONG IF YOU DO NOT SELECT DIRECT BALLOT AND YOU WILL NEED TO SPOIL ALL RECORDS AND REENTER ALL APPLICATIONS**
3. Enter Application into SVRS. (fill in all fields)
 - a. Application date
 - b. Received by-
 - i. if you are in the Absentee room- use counter
 - ii. Use mail if you are entering app at your desk to be mailed out
 - c. Election cycle will always be at current election-never change this
 - d. Requested- which election are they requesting- please make sure you are selecting both if they have both checked. If no box is checked, select the most current election
 - e. Name, DOB, address, Phone/Email, DL and/or last 4 of SSN
 - f. Enter the mailing address if one is listed on application and is different from the residential address
 - g. Click submit print now if are in the Absentee room or only entering a few applications. Click submit print later if you are doing desk work and have a lot of applications to enter (you will print on Avery labels later)
4. In person attach labels and then scan application to record- desk applications- no label to attach, just scan in application to record.



Absentee Ballot Board Best Practices

This document is a set of generalized best practices to be used by all jurisdictions administering absentee voting. Specific procedures regarding these best practices will be created by each jurisdiction. For more information see *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 203B, *Secretary of State Rules*, Chapter 8210,

How to Set Up an Absentee Ballot Board

Prior to setting up an absentee ballot board it must be determined which jurisdiction will administer absentee voting. The county may keep this responsibility or delegate it to the municipalities within the county. Once this has been established, the governing body of all counties, municipalities, and school districts must by ordinance or resolution, authorize an absentee ballot board to accept and reject absentee ballots. In authorizing the absentee ballot board, the jurisdiction will appoint election judges to the absentee ballot board. The board must consist of a sufficient number of judges from different political parties.

Who Can Serve on an Absentee Ballot Board

Election Judges

Qualifications for Election Judges:

- Individuals eligible to vote in this state
- Individuals able to read, write and speak English
- Individuals must be trained as an absentee ballot board judge

Individuals Who **Cannot** Serve on the Absentee Ballot Board:

- The spouse, parent, child, including a stepchild, or sibling, including a stepsibling, of any election judge serving in the same precinct
- Any candidate in the election
- The spouse, parent, child, including a stepchild, or sibling, including a stepsibling, of any candidate in that election

Staff

Qualifications needed for Election Officials:

- Must be trained as an election judge

The absentee ballot board must be monitored by an election official who has been trained on the Statewide Voter Registration System (SVRS) in a manner approved by the Office of the Secretary of State.

For more information regarding eligibility, refer to MN Statutes 204B.19

Duties of an Absentee Ballot Board

Duties of the Election Official in Charge of the Board:

- Train absentee ballot board judges and officially swear them in as absentee ballot board members.
- Convene first meeting of the absentee ballot board no later than 41 days prior to Election Day or as envelopes are received
 - After initial meeting, the board will meet a minimum of every five days, or as envelopes received
 - During the 14 days immediately preceding the election, the board will meet a minimum of every three days
- Review all rejections made by the absentee ballot board
 - Inspect the entire return envelope for any information that may be missing
 - Example: voter or witness may have signed in the wrong location
- Provide replacement ballots to voters with rejected absentees as ballots are rejected up until the 5th day before the election
 - Enclose form letter explaining the reason for rejection
 - May provide photocopy of rejected absentee to illustrate form letter
- Attempt to contact the voter by phone or email if an envelope is rejected within five days of the election
 - The envelope must remain sealed
 - Must keep record of attempted contact
 - If unable to contact the voter by phone or email, the election official may send a form letter or a replacement ballot to the voter
- May create a system that will allow ease of tracking rejected absentees
- Must mail the voter a written notice of absentee ballot rejection between six and ten weeks following the election
 - If it is determined that the voter has otherwise cast a ballot, no notice is required
- Run SVRS accepted absentee ballot audit reports to be delivered to the precincts on Election Day
 - The timeline for running this report will be dependent upon when the rosters leave each jurisdiction.
- ❖ Do **not** allow voters to 'correct' their mailed or in person ballots after notification of mistake
 - Replacement ballot must be issued to correct mistakes even if voter comes into the elections office
 - Witness is required to witness step of the voting process

Duties of the Absentee Ballot Board:

- Compare the return envelope to the SVRS record/absentee ballot application in order to verify that the name and address appearing on the return envelope matches the record/application
- Check all necessary information on the voter's certificate to determine whether the ballot should be accepted or rejected.
- Open non-registered absentee envelopes to ensure that the voter has enclosed a properly completed voter registration application
 - Once it has been determined that the non-registered voter has completed the voter certificate on the envelope and has enclosed a properly completed voter registration application, the voter registration application can be removed from the envelope and stored in a secure place. The ballot envelope must be re-sealed before it is stored in a secure place.
 - If the ballot secrecy envelope must be opened to check for voter registration application, do not remove or inspect the ballot. The ballot must remain secret.
 - Seals should be signed by both election judges to maintain ballot integrity.

- Mark all accepted absentees in the roster (poll book)
 - Prior to printing the rosters, this will be done automatically by SVRS
 - See 'Accepting and Rejecting in SVRS' instructions
 - After "printing" the rosters (creating the election for the poll pads,) a file will be created for download into the poll pads

DO NOT reject a ballot for failure to place the ballot into ballot secrecy envelope.

Minnesota Statutes 203B.12

If performing absentee ballot board in a public space:

Please keep in mind that the information on the envelope and on the record is private – work together to read/match/approve the information without doing so out loud. Reading the AB number out loud to look up is fine – please then tilt/hold the envelope so your partner can read the info and you can both compare to SVRS. If no one is present/background noise will cover the information may be read verbally but please use your best judgment.

Receiving, Accepting and Rejecting in SVRS

Receiving & Sorting Mail

1. Date stamp all envelopes
 - a) Preferably on certification side of the ballot return envelope
2. Sort envelopes into two piles
 - a) Registered
 - b) Non-Registered
3. Match your ballot envelopes to their applications (only if you are not using SVRS to verify the information on the absentee envelope/SVRS is down)

Receiving Ballots in SVRS

1. Put your 2 piles into precinct order and alphabetize
2. Log in to SVRS
3. Go to the **Absentee Ballot** menu
4. Click on **Returned AB Envelopes**
5. Select **Receive** from the drop down menu
6. Scan ballot barcodes into the system in batches of 10 or less
7. Click on **CONTINUE**
8. Double check the number scanned in to that in your pile
9. Click on **Next**
10. Click on **SUBMIT**
11. Continue steps 4-10 until all ballots are received

Accepting and Rejecting Absentees Envelopes

1. Pair up your absentee ballot board members into teams of two different major political parties.
2. Split up your ballots among the teams.
3. Have your board accept and reject the absentee ballot envelopes by comparing the return envelopes to the absentee applications. See the Absentee Voting Administration Guide for accepting and rejecting guidelines.
4. If the ballot is accepted, check the accepted box and both judges will initial.
5. If the ballot is rejected, check the rejected box, both judges initial, **PROVIDE THE REJECT REASON** in the space provided on the ballot return envelope and set aside in a separate pile from your accepted absentees.

Accepting Ballots in SVRS

1. Log back in to SVRS
2. Go to the **Absentee Ballot** menu
3. Click on **Returned AB Envelopes**
4. Select **Accept** from the drop down menu
5. Scan in ballot barcodes in batches of 10 or less
6. Click on **CONTINUE**, check to make sure the number in the system is the number amount you scanned in
 - a) System may indicate if one of the ballot IDs is not going to be accepted. Watch the screen and research the ballot ID if needed.
7. Click on **SUBMIT**
8. Continue these steps until accepting is complete

Rejecting Ballots in SVRS

1. Sort your rejected absentees by reject reason
2. Return to the **Absentee Ballot** menu
3. Click on **Returned AB Envelopes**
4. Select **Reject** from the drop down menu
5. Select the **Reject Reason** from the second drop down menu
6. Make sure the **Resend Ballot** radio box is checked (County only – Cities uncheck box and contact voter)
 - a) Cities, if you cannot reach the voter and need us to mail a ballot, contact the County
7. Scan in ballot barcodes in batches based upon reject reason
8. Click on **CONTINUE**, check to make sure the number in the system is the number amount you scanned in
9. Click on **SUBMIT**
10. Continue these steps until rejecting is complete
11. Record all rejected ballots into a spreadsheet

Resending Rejected Absentees

1. Print Avery labels for rejected ABs
 - a) Clicking the radio button will automatically re-initialize a ballot for the voter
2. Follow same procedures for mail out absentees
 - a) Exception: include a letter explaining to the voter the reason for rejection and the options the voter has to remedy the situation and a highlighted copy of the envelope showing the error and stamp the envelope with the “replacement ballot” stamp

Filing and Storage

1. All accepted absentees should be stored in precinct order in a secure location. We recommend storing and labeling with the SVRS reports so they are balanced each day (report cannot be printed with a window of dates, it is all ballots up to the time the report is generated)
2. All rejected absentees must remain sealed and should be filed with their applications in precinct order in a secure location

Minnesota Statutes 203B.12; Minnesota Statutes 203B.23**Centralized Opening and Counting of Absentee Ballots****Opening the Absentee Return Envelopes**

1. At the close of business on the 18th day before the election (close of business on the 19th this can actually start), retrieve the accepted absentee ballots from storage.
2. Check recorded counts of absentee ballot return envelopes and verify number with SVRS accepted absentee ballot audit report.
3. Separate absentee ballot return envelope from ballot secrecy envelope.
4. Place empty absentee ballot return envelopes in a box.
5. Separate ballot from ballot secrecy envelope.
 - Blank ballots are still valid ballots and should be secured along with all other voted ballots.
 - Board members must initial ballots.
 - Make sure correct ballot was issued, if not duplicate on correct ballot and spoil incorrect ballot
 - Count ballots and envelopes you have (should match)
 - If necessary, duplicates must be made.
 - Record any envelopes missing ballots.
 - Record any envelopes with more than one ballot.
 - Store ballot secrecy envelope.
6. Secure ballots by precinct until start of counting (ideally scanning would begin immediately after opening

Balancing

*****Do not wait until Election Day to balance*****

- Pre-Direct balloting: you need to be balancing each time when you have completed a ballot board – there are a few options for reports. *we strongly recommend holding ballot board right before you begin direct balloting for ease of balancing and viewing reports
 - Under Local AB (Cities) or Absentee Ballot (County) run Absentee Ballot Count: Accepted by Ballot/Material Types
 - This gives you a current count of how many ballots have been accepted by registered/non registered voters and by ballot type (more valuable for County as it lists UOCAVA and Presidential ballot styles)
 - Under Local AB (Cities) or Absentee Ballot (County), run Absentee Ballots: Current Ballot status
 - This report gives us a current total by status. The number on your report should be the number of envelopes you have. Use this immediately after each ballot board to balance. Keep each day's report to continue tally (keeping a spreadsheet may be easier and will help you stay balanced)
 - If you administer absentee for townships, you will need to run the above reports once for your city and once for each municipality (note the drop down under municipality)



- Should you NOT balance, we recommend one of the following:
 - Look at that day's absentee records individually to look for a ballot with a "sent" or "received" instead of "accepted" status. Could have been a hiccup.
 - Run the Accepted Ballot Records with Ballot History report under Local AB (Cities) or Absentee Ballot (County). Beware this gives you ALL ballots in the election. You can also run in an Excel version should you wish to generate and sort records
- During direct balloting: once direct balloting starts, you should be balanced if you have followed the above directions - if not, you should sit down and figure out where you don't balance and solve the issue right away.

- On an hourly basis, run: Absentee Ballots By Current Status and Location. If you have used direct balloting for all of your voters, you will have 0 initialized, 0 sent and 0 received. Everyone should start showing under the "Accepted" category because DB auto accepts the ballots.
 - Make sure you are selecting "Ballot Status" when you are generating your report as they do not default.
- After the first day of DB you need to keep a sheet that has the number of voters you have each day.
- At the end of each day, run the Absentee Ballot Count: Current Ballot Status report and run an interrupt tape on the tabulator to match. In order to get an interrupt tape, you unfortunately have to power it down and then start it up again to get the option to print. Follow the "How to shutdown the tabulator when polls are open" below and the "How to start up after shutdown" steps below – once you have the interrupt tape you can leave it powered on until the next day
- Once balanced, 2 staff should open the tabulator box and seal that day's ballots into a labeled transfer case. If you do not balance, count the number of ballots in the box to the amount of envelopes or applications and make any corrections in SVRS or, if you determine you have given an incorrect ballot, follow the process for duplicating, rezero the tabulator and rerun your ballots. Repeat until balanced. This needs to be done each night after close. If you have any discrepancies, they need to be resolved ASAP.

How to Shutdown the tabulator when polls are open

1. It is important to "log out" before you shutdown/power off the unit. Carefully follow the steps outlined below.
2. You will need to access the main menu by placing the Security Key (Black I-Button) onto the Security Keypad and entering the appropriate credentials to access the Main Menu.
3. Press the Utilities tab, and then select the Log Out tab in the Utilities submenu. The screen will return to the Insert Security Token screen.



4. At the Security Token screen, press the power button at the top right corner of the screen. Then select the Power Down option. Do not lower the screen until it goes dark and you hear the audio beep.

How to Start Up After Shutdown:

1. Lift the screen to power on the ICE tabulator.
2. Place the Security Key (Black I-Button) onto the Security Keypad and enter the appropriate credentials to login.
3. On the Main Menu, select Open Poll option - The Open Poll screen will state "Poll was Open". Select the Open button next to Poll Status. Enter valid username and password or password only on the Authorization screen.
4. The Reopen Poll Confirmation screen will appear. Press OK to proceed.

5. The warning screen will appear indicating that the results are not zero. Press Yes to continue.
6. The system will print an interrupt status tape showing the total number of ballots by ballot style that were previously processed. A screen will appear asking if you would like another copy of the tape. Press "Yes" if more copies of tape are required or press "No" to continue to the Poll Worker Menu.
7. Select Standard Voting and start voting again.

To close polls election night follow the standard closing procedures

One last note, balancing always includes balancing to the ballot style – during a general election this of course includes balancing to the School District level (if your precincts have a split.) SVRS is not great at giving us a report that tells us which ballot someone received. Use the following report only during a general election AND only if you have a precinct that is split by SD:

- Under Local AB (Cities) or Absentee Ballots (County) run: Absentee Ballot Records with Ballot History for Excel.
- Select your municipality (again, if you issue for a township, you need to run this for that township as well), AB Location and Precinct.
- Select the election and check the box for "Accepted" under Absentee Ballot Status. You should be able to filter this report by date as well.


Bill,

I have been looking at the numbers since this morning. The state reports are not the intuitive, but I am making my way. I also spoke with my election judge Kay who made the list. She spoke about the transition between absentee voting (envelopes) and direct balloting was when she believes the numbers may have gotten off track. Usually, the daily ballot count was written down for her by the judges who ended the day. Because of the transition between the two different procedures of voting and the preparing of ballots from the ballot board this was not done. When she came in the next day ballots were already being processed and she made an estimate of what the number was for the previous day.

I also had Andy look at the cameras for the Faribault room to make sure there was no access during the time when the ballots were being processed between the 17th and 18th. Everything looked as it should.

I spoke with Julie Hanson from the county, and she said that they still have not made a public comment of the missing ballots though they have not kept it hidden. They think that the possibility of 20 people were checked in but did not vote. I am planning on going to her office tomorrow to compare the envelopes and applications for the Precinct 10. We have an assisted living facility in this precinct, and we receive applications prior to going to the facility to help them vote. We check the voter in and prepare their documents and ballots. If on the day that we arrive they are sick, have died or choose not to vote, we spoil the ballot that was prepared for them. It is a small possibility that this was not done for this facility. I will not know unless I check. They are looking now but I will be going over in the morning to look myself.

Tomorrow the county will be holding their canvassing board and if we have not found the ballots, they will have to explain what has occurred. My hope is that it will be resolved by then. Then I believe they plan to make a public statement. That is all I have for now.

We have been informed from the county that one of our precincts has 20 absentee votes that are missing. It is not uncommon to have one or two "missing" as sometimes a person gets tired of waiting in line after checking in, or doesn't fill out their ballot for some reason after checking in. We are in the process of searching everywhere, and the county is looking at the envelopes the ballots were in to see if some were missed. This obviously has an impact on the Tabke/Paul race. Both of their campaigns have been notified by the county. It is very important to note that every night after closure of absentee balloting, our staff conducted a count of ballots vs. registrations and those checked out every night. The county has those tallies as well showing the nightly balances. A press release will be happening soon from the Secretary of State and the County.

Thanks for passing this along. Below are our suggested edits and the addition of a call to action for folks to read more about the post-election processes.

One question before we finalize – we are wondering if it would be beneficial to include a sentence about both organizations working in consultation with the Secretary of State's Office. There are pros and cons to a sentence like that, so wanted to get your take before suggesting it outright.

Here's our version, which has been approved by the City Administrator:

During a routine audit of election results, officials identified 21 absentee records that do not have corresponding physical ballots. Of these, 20 records were issued in Shakopee Precinct 10 and one was issued in Shakopee Precinct 12A. A rescan of ballots that was conducted on Friday, Nov. 8, did not uncover these 21 ballots. We have been working closely with the City of Shakopee to audit the records and will continue our efforts to ensure completeness and accuracy of the election results.

Bill,

I have been looking at the numbers since this morning. The state reports are not the intuitive, but I am making my way. I also spoke with my election judge Kay who made the list. She spoke about the transition between absentee voting (envelopes) and direct balloting was when she believes the numbers may have gotten off track. Usually, the daily ballot count was written down for her by the judges who ended the day. Because of the transition between the two different procedures of voting and the preparing of ballots from the ballot board this was not done. When she came in the next day ballots were already being processed and she made an estimate of what the number was for the previous day.

I also had Andy look at the cameras for the Faribault room to make sure there was no access during the time when the ballots were being processed between the 17th and 18th. Everything looked as it should.

I spoke with Julie Hanson from the county, and she said that they still have not made a public comment of the missing ballots though they have not kept it hidden. They think that the possibility of 20 people were checked in but did not vote. I am planning on going to her office tomorrow to compare the envelopes and applications for the Precinct 10. We have an assisted living facility in this precinct, and we receive applications prior to going to the facility to help them vote. We check the voter in and prepare their documents and ballots. If on the day that we arrive they are sick, have died or choose not to vote, we spoil the ballot that was prepared for them. It is a small possibility that this was not done for this facility. I will not know unless I check. They are looking now but I will be going over in the morning to look myself.

Tomorrow the county will be holding their canvassing board and if we have not found the ballots, they will have to explain what has occurred. My hope is that it will be resolved by then. Then I believe they plan to make a public statement. That is all I have for now.



Good Afternoon Council,

We have been informed from the county that one of our precincts has 20 absentee votes that are missing. It is not uncommon to have one or two "missing" as sometimes a person gets tired of waiting in line after checking in, or doesn't fill out their ballot for some reason after checking in. We are in the process of searching everywhere, and the county is looking at the envelopes the ballots were in to see if some were missed. This obviously has an impact on the Tabke/Paul race. Both of their campaigns have been notified by the county. It is very important to note that every night after closure of absentee balloting, our staff conducted a count of ballots vs. registrations and those checked out every night. The county has those tallies as well showing the nightly balances. A press release will be happening soon from the Secretary of State and the County.

I will keep you posted.







INTRODUCTION

1. I received a PhD in Statistics from the University of Minnesota in 2008 and am currently an Associate Professor of Statistics and Informatics in the College of Veterinary Medicine. I have been retained by Lockridge Grindal Nauen PLLP to provide expert testimony in connection with the above-captioned election contest.

2. A copy of my current resume is attached hereto as Exhibit 1. This lists all publications I have authored in the previous 10 years. I testified as a witness, at a deposition, in *Poeschel Hidden Valley, LLC et al. v. Northern States Power Company, d/b/a Xcel Energy*, Pepin County Circuit Court (Wisconsin), Case No. 2018CV000027. I have not testified as a witness at trial or deposition in any other matter in the previous four years.

3. I am being paid at the rate of \$250 per hour for my services.

BACKGROUND

4. In the reported results from this election, candidate Aaron Paul ("Paul") received 14 fewer votes than candidate Brad Tabke ("Tabke"). However, according to a preliminary report from Scott County, 20 votes from Shakopee Precinct-10 were lost and not counted.

5. I was therefore asked to consider the following question: If 20 ballots were to be randomly drawn from a population with ballots for each candidate in the proportion equal to the reported results in Shakopee Precinct-10, what is the probability that Paul would receive 14 or more votes than Tabke?

6. The reported results in the precinct are summarized in the following table, along

with the calculated proportion for each candidate.

7. To compute the desired probability, we first compute the probability of each possible combination where Paul receives 14 or more votes than Tabke using the multinomial formula. Because the combinations are mutually exclusive (only one can happen at a time), we can then add them together to get the total probability. There are sixteen combinations; their individual probabilities and the sum are shown in the following table.
