Exempt Rules

Exempt rules are excluded from the normal rulemaking procedures (Minnesota Statutes §§ 14.386 and 14.388). They are most often of two kinds. One kind is specifically exempted by the Legislature from rulemaking procedures, but approved for form by the Revisor of Statutes, reviewed for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings, and then published in the State Register. These exempt rules are effective for two years only.

The second kind of exempt rule is one adopted where an agency for good cause finds that the rulemaking provisions of *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 14 are unnecessary, impracticable, or contrary to the public interest. This exemption can be used only where the rules:

- (1) address a serious and immediate threat to the public health, safety, or welfare, or
- (2) comply with a court order or a requirement in federal law in a manner that does not allow for compliance with *Minnesota Statutes* Sections 14.14-14.28, or
 - (3) incorporate specific changes set forth in applicable statutes when no interpretation of law is required, or
 - (4) make changes that do not alter the sense, meaning, or effect of the rules.

These exempt rules are also reviewed for form by the Revisor of Statutes, for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings and then published in the *State Register*. In addition, the Office of Administrative Hearings must determine whether the agency has provided adequate justification for the use of this exemption. Rules adopted under clauses (1) or (2) above are effective for two years only. The Legislature may also exempt an agency from the normal rulemaking procedures and establish other procedural and substantive requirements unique to that exemption.

Introduction. The Emergency Medical Services Regulatory Board intends to repeal obsolete rules under the rulemaking process in the Administrative Procedure Act, *Minnesota Statutes*, section 14.3895. You may submit written comments on the proposed repeal of obsolete rules until December 1, 2022

Subject of the Repeal of Obsolete Rules and Statutory Authority. The proposed obsolete rules are about geographic radio frequency assignments required for ambulances. These frequencies involved the Very-High Frequency (VHF) and Ultra-High Frequency (UHF) radio communication bands. The agency identified the proposed obsolete rules to be repealed in its annual obsolete rules report under Minnesota Statutes section 14.05, subdivision 5. The rule was determined to be obsolete as a result of new communication technologies including 800 MHz radio systems that replaced these VHF and UHF radios in many ambulances. Nothing in this proposed repeal affects ambulance services still using this technology. There are also minor changes to 4690.7900 that were needed to permit the repeal. The statutory authority to repeal the obsolete rules is found in Minnesota Statutes, section 14.3895. A copy of the proposed obsolete rules to be repealed is published in the State Register and attached to this notice as mailed. The proposed obsolete rules to be repealed may be viewed at: www.mn.gov/emsrb

Comments. You have until 4:30 p.m. on Thursday, December 1, 2022, to submit written comment in support of or in

opposition to the proposed repeal of obsolete rules and any part or subpart of the repeal. Your comment must be in writing and received by the agency contact person by the due date. The Board encourages comment. Your comment should identify the portion of the proposed obsolete rules to be repealed addressed and the reason for the comment. In addition, you are encouraged to object to the repeal of any part or subpart. You must also make any comments on the legality of the proposed rules during this comment period.

Request for Hearing. In addition to submitting comments, you may also request that a hearing be held on the rules. You must make your request in writing and the agency contact person must receive it by 4:30 p.m. on December 1, 2022. Your written request must include your name and address. You must identify the portion of the proposed repealed rules to which you object or state that you oppose the entire set of rules. Any request that does not comply with these requirements is not valid and the agency cannot count it for determining whether it must hold a public hearing. You are also encouraged to state the reason for the request and any changes you want made to the proposed rules.

Effect of Requests. If 25 or more people submit a written request, the agency will have to meet the requirements of Minnesota Statutes, sections 14.131 to 14.20 for rules adopted after a hearing or the requirements of Minnesota Statutes, sections 14.22 to 14.28 for rules adopted without a hearing, including the preparation of a statement of need and reasonableness and the opportunity for a hearing.

Modifications. The agency might modify its choice of these designated rules or parts proposed for repeal (e.g. fixing a typo or deciding not to repeal a rule because the rule is discovered not to be obsolete), based on comments and information submitted to the agency. If the final rules are identical to the rules originally published in the State Register, the agency will publish a notice of adopting the repealers in the State Register. If the final rules are different from the rules originally published in the State Register, the agency must publish a copy of the changes in the State Register. If the proposed repeal of obsolete rules affects you in any way, the Board encourages you to participate in the rulemaking process.

Alternative Format. Upon request, this information can be made available in an alternative format, such as large print, braille, or audio. To make such a request, please contact the agency contact person at the address or telephone number listed above.

Following a comprehensive review of the Administrative Rules contained in Chapter 4690 *Ambulance Services*, the Emergency Medical Services Regulatory Board has identified the following rules as unnecessary and obsolete:

Chapter 4690.1900 Standards and Radio Frequency Assignments (in its entirety)

Chapter 4690.2600 Standards and Radio Frequency Assignments (in its entirety)

The above listed rules were determined to be obsolete because many emergency medical services agencies no longer utilize VHF radio equipment and instead have transitioned to digital 800 MHz radio systems. As a result of this technological change the impetus for the initial rule implementation no longer exists and the EMSRB now considers these rules obsolete.

The EMSRB intends to move forward with the repeal of Chapter(s) 4690.1900 and 4690.2600 in accordance with the obsolete repeal provisions as outlined in Section 14.3895. Efforts to repeal this rule will begin on or before September 1, 2022, and the EMSRB hopes to complete the work as expeditiously as the administrative rule making process allows.

The EMSRB will report on the status of this effort and any additional obsolete rules on or before December 1, 2023.

In previous reports the EMSRB had not identified any obsolete rules and therefore has no follow up reports at this time.

Good Morning,

You are receiving this message as a Chair or Ranking Member of an oversight committee with responsibility for the Emergency Medical Services Regulatory Board. As a part of the administrative rulemaking procedure, we are required by Minnesota law to inform you whenever the agency undertakes certain administrative rulemaking activities.

As recommended by the Office of the Legislative Auditor the EMSRB is making updates to its administrative rules. The EMSRB intends to repeal Minnesota Rules Chapter 4690. 1900 and Chapter 4690.2600. Both of these rules involve radio frequency assignments for VFH and UHF equipment. Many EMS services in the state no longer utilize this type of equipment and have transitioned to digital 800 MHz equipment.

However, services which are still using VHF or UHF equipment MAY continue to do so, this simply removes a regulatory requirement for those that are using different types of communication technology. As a part of this repeal, we are making editorial changes to Chapter 4690.7900, which relates to EMS agency license expiration dates as that rule referenced one of the rules that are being repealed. However, EMS agencies will not notice any change to their EMS license or expiration date.

Attached to this email is a copy of the Notice of Intent to Repeal Obsolete Rules, in addition a copy of all of the proposed rule changes that were published in today's State Register.

These frequencies involved the Very-High Frequency (VHF) and Ultra-High Frequency (UHF) radio communication bands. The agency identified the proposed obsolete rules to be repealed in its annual obsolete rules report under Minnesota Statutes section 14.05, subdivision 5. The rule was determined to be obsolete as a result of new communication technologies including 800 MHz radio systems that replaced these VHF and UHF radios in many ambulances. Nothing in this proposed repeal affects ambulance services still using this technology. There are also minor changes to 4690.7900 that were needed to permit the repeal. The statutory authority to repeal the obsolete rules is found in Minnesota Statutes, section 14.3895. A copy of the proposed obsolete rules to be repealed is published in the State Register and attached to this notice as mailed. The proposed obsolete rules to be repealed may be viewed at: www.mn.gov/emsrb

Comments. Exempt Rules

Exempt rules are excluded from the normal rulemaking procedures (*Minnesota Statutes* §§ 14.386 and 14.388). They are most often of two kinds. One kind is specifically exempted by the Legislature from rulemaking procedures, but approved for form by the Revisor of Statutes, reviewed for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings, and then published in the State Register. These exempt rules are effective for two years only.

The second kind of exempt rule is one adopted where an agency for good cause finds that the rulemaking provisions of *Minnesota Statutes*, Chapter 14 are unnecessary, impracticable, or contrary to the public interest. This exemption can be used only where the rules:

- (1) address a serious and immediate threat to the public health, safety, or welfare, or
- (2) comply with a court order or a requirement in federal law in a manner that does not allow for compliance with *Minnesota Statutes* Sections 14.14-14.28, or
 - (3) incorporate specific changes set forth in applicable statutes when no interpretation of law is required, or
 - (4) make changes that do not alter the sense, meaning, or effect of the rules.

These exempt rules are also reviewed for form by the Revisor of Statutes, for legality by the Office of Administrative Hearings and then published in the *State Register*. In addition, the Office of Administrative Hearings must determine whether the agency has provided adequate justification for the use of this exemption. Rules adopted under clauses (1) or (2) above are effective for two years only. The Legislature may also exempt an agency from the normal rulemaking procedures and establish other procedural and substantive requirements unique to that exemption.
