

COORDINATION

REGION 5 LEGISLATIVE MEETINGS: The Counties of Cass, Crow Wing, Morrison, Todd and Wadena have enlisted the services of Region 5 to coordinate meetings between the five county boards and the area legislators on a regular basis. The purpose of the meetings is to share information and provide input on Region-wide concerns. These services include meeting notices, minutes and forwarding of resolutions and other concerns to state agencies and the legislature.

INFORMATIONAL SERVICES

The Region 5 Development Commission is a Regional Information Center for many types of information including, but not limited to, management and administration, community development, economic development, transportation, health issues, programs for seniors, cultural activities, and census data.

The information is available through various methods including a library, a computer modem linking Region 5 with state data banks, referrals, and Bi-monthly newsletters published and distributed by Region 5.

Program Directors provide latest available planning technical information and expertise, to any requesting local government, in the area of transportation, economic development, community development and aging issues.

PROGRAMS FOR OLDER PERSONS

The Minnesota Board on Aging has designated the Region 5 Development Commission as the official Area Agency on Aging for Cass, Crow Wing, Morrison, Todd, and Wadena Counties.

The Region 5 Area Agency on Aging (AAA) serves as an advocate, service developer and facilitator, educator, and information and funding source.

The Region 5 AAA provides information and assistance to older persons and their families through the Senior LinkAge Line®: 1-800-333-2433, technical assistance to agencies and units of government in the development of services for older persons, coordination of aging services, and demographics and needs data.

To guide its activities, the Region 5 Area Agency on Aging has prepared an Area Plan for 2000-2002. Based on the priorities established in this Plan, *Table 1* shows the services, which are projected for 2000.

The activities of the Region 5 Area Agency on Aging are guided by a fifteen member Council on Aging. The Council on Aging is comprised of representatives for older persons and service providers. They develop policies and priorities, recommend action on contract/grant applications, and conduct the Annual Conference on Aging.

The Region 5 Development Commission takes final action on major policy decisions, budget approvals, and contract/grant awards. The <u>total project costs</u> for the contract/grants awarded by the Region 5 Development Commission annually amount to approximately \$1.9 million. *Table 2* identifies the type of funds used to finance a wide array of services:

An annual Conference on Aging is sponsored by the Region 5 AAA to provide up-to-date information on aging issues as well as networking opportunities. Other trainings are provided by the AAA to update seniors and service providers on current issues and development.

Throughout CY 1999 the Senior Program Specialist assisted approximately 700 individuals who were looking for services or assistance to help a senior remain independent. The highest topic areas were prescription drugs, health insurance, transportation, nutrition, legal issues, housing, chore, respite, adult day care, caregiver support, home care, etc.

Quarterly, the Region 5 AAA draws together senior advocates, RSVP directors, Senior Center Directors, Presidents of County Councils, service providers, MN Senior Federation, Green Thumb, Foster Grandparents, Senior Companions, etc. The purpose of these meetings is to share information, coordinate our activities, and form another necessary link between the AAA and the individual counties.

CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

Region 5's Five Wings Arts Program awarded \$129,650 in grant monies in FY 99. This amount includes \$13,727 of McKnight Foundation funds for semi-professional arts organizations and \$2,343 for individual artist grants. Five Wings awarded \$110,080 of Minnesota State Arts Board grant funds for sponsorship activities and/or art development in Region 5 and a total of \$3,500 for the Rolling Plains Art Gallery project (7 sites). The organizations, which received funds, are listed in *Tables 1* through *4*.

OTHER CULTURAL PROGRAMMING

<u>Artist/Mentor Program</u> The Five Wings Arts Program continues to offer scholarships worth over \$900 each to rural high school students in grades 9, 10, and 11 who demonstrate high motivation to work in the arts. The program serves to supplement the arts education in our region's schools by providing a number of students with the opportunity to study their chosen art discipline with a regional practicing artist. The following students were awarded scholarships in FY 99 and will finish their study in November, 1999:

Rolling Plains Art Gallery The Five Wings Arts Program collaborating with Regions 1, 2, 4 and the Plains Art Museum in FY 99 to facilitate a traveling art gallery housed within a semi-trailer. The Rolling Plains Art Gallery visited 7 communities in Region 5 and was considered a great success. Five Wings will continue to work with everyone involved to keep this valuable program alive.

<u>Technical Assistance</u> The Five Wings Arts Program staff also provides technical assistance to individuals and groups on such matters as grant writing, availability of funds, arts resources, and other arts project assistance. In addition, Five Wings produces a newsletter, which addresses arts concerns, opportunities, and activities throughout the region.

<u>Website</u> The Five Wings Arts Program staff also developed a website in FY 99 to better serve its constituents by providing information via the internet. This form of accessibility and visibility has proven to be very valuable.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Region 5 provides technical assistance in the areas of land use planning and grant writing.

There has been an ongoing interest in comprehensive planning at the local level. Comprehensive plans for Sibley and Wadena County have been completed. Community surveys were completed on behalf of Sibley Township and the City of Jenkins.

Region 5 completed a housing study for the city of Pequot Lakes. This housing study includes a household survey and employer survey.

Region 5 is in the process of finalizing an ISTS (Individual Server Treatment System) loan program for Wadena County.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

The North Central Economic Development Administration, Inc., administrator of the Region 5 Business Loan Fund, approved eleven (11) loans totaling \$380,050 for local business development during fiscal year 2000.

Businesses, individuals, development corporations, and local units of government in Region 5 received assistance in financial packaging to foster business start-up and expansion. Region 5 provided links to other regional organizations when necessary.

The Annual Update on the Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) has been completed for the September 30, 2001, deadline. This update contains information from an Economic Development Needs Survey administered to Region 5 entities on February 2001. It will be presented to the county boards after submission to the EDA.

Information on the Revolving Loan Fund and the Region 5 Economic Development Program was presented to all county boards in 2001. Presentations were made to several economic development organizations and civic organizations during the year.

Network 5 meetings were held bi-monthly at the Region 5 offices in Staples. This group includes about 45 development professionals that provide services to Region 5 residents.

Region 5 Economic Development Director is currently receiving pledges form local governments to recapitalize the Revolving Loan Fund in 2001, if necessary.

Assistance from Region 5 was provided for a \$500,000 community project to be funded by the Economic Development Administration (EDA).

Region 5 is finalizing the ISTS Contract with the Department of Agriculture to become the administrator for Wadena County. This program may be expanded to other counties in the future.

Region 5 is assisting Todd and Morrison counties on establishing a Technology Loan Guarantee Fund. Local funds will be pledged and matched by a granting organization to be administered through NCEDA.

REGIONAL TRANSPORATION PROGRAM

Numerous activities took place during FY 2001 related to the Transportation Planning Work Program.

The 15 member Region 5 Transportation Council continued to monitor regional transportation issues and provide recommendations to the Commission. The Region 5 Transportation Council developed a Region 5 Area Transportation Improvement Program (FY 2004) as part of the 12 county Area Transportation Partnership process.

Region 5 provides technical assistance in the area of transit planning. As a result of the monitoring program, Cass and Crow Wing Counties continue to explore coordination of Section 5310 vehicles for public transportation and implementation of county wide transit systems. Region 5 continues to facilitate transportation provider meetings.

Staff participates as a board member of the Morr-Trans Transit Authority in Morrison Co.

Monitoring and information was provided on wetland regulations, as they apply to local Road Authorities. Staff continues facilitation efforts on 3 RR Corridor Safety Improvement Projects.

TECHNICAL PLANNING

Planning in the areas of transportation linked to land use with an emphasis on township transportation issues and with Land Use planning technical assistance and Community Survey development. Interest in planning and zoning at the township level has created calls for information and advice regarding technical processes used for decision-making on zoning needs.

The Township Road Recording Program assists townships in the proper recording of town road easements. A spin-off benefit to townships is the development of improved methods of governing based on Township Association guidelines. Special projects are completed on a contract basis.

Region 5 Development Commission program efforts toward townships are enhanced by the ongoing working relationship with the Minnesota Association of Townships. Staff offers consultation for other Regional Development Commissions regarding township issues and state wide township programs.

Staff anticipates holding Transportation Management workshops. In view of the State-sponsored "Sustainable Development" basis for partnership for comprehensive planning, the relationship and potential for county-township-city partnership based on "community" are being monitored to determine assistance applicability to Region 5 local government.

Independent Auditor's Report

Commission Members Region 5 Development Commission Staples, Minnesota 56479

We have audited the accompanying general purpose financial statements of Region 5 Development Commission, Staples, MN 56479, as of and for the year ended June 30, 1999, as listed in the table of contents. These general purpose financial statements are the responsibility of the Commission's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these general purpose financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the general purpose financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit is ludes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts at disclosures in the general purpose financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall general purpose financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

In our opinion, the general purpose financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Region 5 Development Commission as of June 30, 1999, and the results of its operations for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

In accordance with <u>Government Auditing Standards</u>, we have also issued our report dated <u>September 15</u>, 2000 on our consideration of the Commission's internal control over financial reporting and our tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts and grants.

Our audit was performed for the purpose of forming an opinion on the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole. The accompanying schedule of expenditures of federal awards is presented for purposes of additional analysis as required by U.S. Office of Management and Budget Circular A-133, <u>Audits of States</u>, <u>Local Governments</u>, and <u>Non-Profit Organizations</u>, and is not a required part of the general purpose financial statements of Region 5 Development Cd ission. The individual fund financial statements and schedules liked in the table of contents are presented for purposes of

additional analysis and are not a required part of the general purpose financial statements of Region 5 Development Commission. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the general purpose financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole.
