The Metropolitan Council is the regional planning organization for the seven-county Twin Cities area. The Council operates the regional bus and rail system, collects and treats wastewater, coordinates regional water resources, plans and helps fund regional parks, and administers federal funds that provide housing opportunities for low- and moderate-income individuals and families. The 17-member Council board is appointed by and serves at the pleasure of the governor.

About Metropolitan Council Environmental Services

Environmental Services is one of four operating divisions of the Metropolitan Council. Met Council operates and maintains the Metropolitan Disposal System (MDS), a vast system of underground sewer pipes and treatment facilities that collect, convey, treat, and dispose of wastewater from residential units, businesses, and industries in the Twin Cities metropolitan area.

Met Council serves 2.9 million people across 111 customer communities and partners with approximately 900 industrial permit holders and over 90 liquid waste haulers. In total, the MDS collects and treats an average of 250 million gallons of wastewater daily. The regional wastewater collection and treatment system includes:

- 660 miles of large interceptor sewer pipes, ranging from 7 inches to 14 feet in diameter which collect wastewater from about 5.000 miles of local sewer.
- 61 lift stations that pump wastewater from a lower to a higher elevation so gravity can move flow to treatment sites.
- 226 metering stations that help determine the volume of wastewater treated for each community.
- 9 water resource recovery facilities where wastewater is treated before returning clean water to the environment.

The cost of operating and maintaining wastewater treatment systems is covered entirely by user fees. The Environmental Services division consistently achieves near-perfect compliance with federal and state wastewater treatment standards while holding rates about 35% below the national average. Met Council is committed to sustainable operations through energy efficiency, use of renewable energy resources, use of technology, and reducing air pollutant emissions and resource recovery. Septic systems typically cost between \$15,500 and \$32,000 to install, with an average price of about \$24,000 according to data gathered from Carver, Dakota, and Scott County Environmental Services.

Septic systems last about 20-30 years and require cleaning and inspection every 2-3 years, which costs about \$400-\$500.
