

## St. Louis Park Police Department Portable Recording System Biennial Audit Executive Summary March 4, 2025

At the request of the St. Louis Park Police Department, LOGIS has conducted the biennial audit of the St. Louis Park Police Department Portable Recording System pursuant to Minnesota Statute §13.825 Subd 9.

Minnesota Statute §13.825 data elements include:

- Data Classification
- Data Retention
- Access by Data Subjects
- Inventory of Portable Recording System Technology
- Use of Agency-Issued Portable Recording Systems
- Authorization to Access Data
- · Sharing Among Agencies
- Biennial Audit
- Notification to the BCA
- Portable Recording System Vendor

After analysis of the statutory requirements and evaluation of St. Louis Park Police Department's management and use of Portable Recording System (PRS) technology LOGIS has found the St. Louis Park Police Department (SLPPD) is in full compliance with Minnesota Statute §13.825 based on the following findings:
