in compliance with M.S. 121A.041, the rebranding initiative in Menahga began with a small committee meeting in November 2023 to devise a comprehensive plan. This plan was subsequently published in local newspapers and on the official website to ensure community awareness.

Following this, a larger committee was formed in partnership with Jostens to facilitate the creation of a community survey. Concurrently, the committee began to gather data regarding the costs associated with the rebranding process.

The community survey was distributed to the public in the spring of 2024, and on May 28, 2024, the larger group of stakeholders convened to review the feedback and data collected. As a result of their discussions, the committee has narrowed down the selection of a new nickname to four potential options.

The group is scheduled to reconvene this spring, after the budget meetings, to assess the availability of funds for the rebranding initiative. Currently, there are indications of a future deficit, which suggests that the transition to the new nickname will need to be implemented gradually as financial resources allow.

In the interim, when purchasing new uniforms and signage, the current nickname has been omitted [pic of generic uniform](#) to reflect the ongoing changes. It is essential to note that securing adequate funding is a critical aspect of compliance throughout this rebranding process.
